

RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF KELVINGTON NO. 366

BYLAW NO. 100 – 2023

A BYLAW TO REGULATE THE SPEED OF VEHICLES ON CERTAIN PORTIONS OF MUNICIPAL ROADS

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Kelvington No. 366, in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

1. Definitions:
 - a) “Municipality” means the Rural Municipality of Kelvington No. 366;
 - b) “Roadway” means any public roadway within the Rural Municipality under the direction, control and management of the Municipality and “public highway” means a public highway as defined by The Highways and Transportation Act, 1997; and
 - c) “Motor vehicle” means a motor vehicle as defined by or pursuant to The Traffic Safety Act.
2. No person shall operator a motor vehicle at a speed greater than 50 km per hour on the following Roadways within the Municipality:
 - a) Roadway located along the W. 27 & 34-40-11-W2, commonly referred to as “The Mystery Lake Road”.
 - b) On the interior roadways within the Woody’s Acres subdivision located on the NE PT 34-40-11-W2 (Woody’s Drive, Service Road and South View Road).
3. Signs indicating the maximum speed allowed shall be erected at the commencement of the speed zone areas and signs shall be erected showing the end of the speed zone areas.
4. No person shall deface, injure, destroy or remove any speed limit signs erected in accordance with the provisions of this Bylaw.
5. Penalty: A person who contravenes any provision of this bylaw is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a penalty as identified in the *Highway and Transportation Act, 1997*.

This Bylaw shall come into force and take effect on the date of the final passing thereof.
