FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q. Does Global Rescue place any restrictions on elevation?

A. If you're adventuring to higher altitudes, our High-Altitude Evacuation Package provides services to members age 16 years and older who travel above 15,000 feet (4,600 m) during any part of their trip (excluding air travel) and who require emergency transport due to injury or illness. Keep in mind higher elevations may hinder the ability of aircraft to reach a member in need.

Q. Am I eligible to receive Global Rescue services wherever I am in the world?

A. There are two restrictions: state department-defined war zones and a polar restriction. If you are above the 80th Parallel North or below the 60th Parallel South, Global Rescue offers field rescue and evacuation on a fee-for-service basis.

Q: Why is the High-Altitude Evacuation Package limited to those 16 years of age and older?

A: Global Rescue's medical experts, renowned in high-altitude medicine, have thoroughly researched the issue. Based on the available literature, it's deemed medically inappropriate for individuals under 16 to travel to such high elevations. To discourage unhealthy practices for those under this age, our High-Altitude Evacuation Package is restricted to those 16 years and older.

Q. What happens if I have altitude sickness?

A. Any member suffering symptoms of Acute Mountain Sickness should not ascend any higher, should descend, and contact Global Rescue as soon as possible. Global Rescue's medical teams are trained to assess members with symptoms of Acute Mountain Sickness and are supported by Global Rescue's staff physicians, including a leading authority on altitude-related issues. Many times, cases requiring in-patient hospitalization may need evacuation or transport services. Global Rescue has performed thousands of rescue and evacuation missions in the Himalayas, including dozens on Everest.

Q. If I need to be rescued, should I arrange my own evacuation?

A. No. Please call Global Rescue at the time of an incident and we will provide the necessary services from start to finish. (If you are incapacitated, you can have a member of your team contact us.) When Global Rescue organizes and/or performs the rescue and the MSA criteria are met, there is no cost to the member up to \$500,000. If you arrange for your own rescue, we are unable to reimburse members.
