In August 2006, the sport of softball in Connecticut became unified in honoring its past with the merging of its fast pitch and slow pitch Halls of Fame. Prior to this merger, the two entities had each separately elected and inducted members to their respective Halls of Fame. That changed with the formation of one combined Hall of Fame to be known as the Connecticut ASA Hall of Fame.

USA Softball of Connecticut commissioner Hank Koritkoski oversees the umbrella organization with the fast pitch and slow pitch committees continuing to function as separate groups in selecting candidates for the USA Softball of Connecticut Hall of Fame.

USA Softball of Connecticut stages an annual Hall of Fame dinner to formally induct its new members.

The Fast Pitch Hall of Fame was established in 1971, with the Slow Pitch Hall starting in 1985. Committees to select Hall of Famers meet frequently and accept nominations for new candidates. To be eligible for consideration, a player must be retired for 5 years or, if the player is over 50 years of age, the 5 year waiting period is waived.

For nominees, applications should be submitted to the Hall of Fame committee chairs by April 1 each year. Any individual who had an outstanding softball career in Connecticut is eligible, with emphasis on state, regional and national tournament play as one of the important criteria for Hall of Fame consideration. Applications are available on our state website.

In 2017 Connecticut ASA re-branded to USA Softball of Connecticut and officially opened its physical Hall of Fame display which is located at Erin's Gym in Stratford.

Paul Amento

Fifty two years and counting. That was and still is the timeline of Paul Amento's Hall of Fame worthy softball career.

Paul launched his softball journey with Hamden Pub in 1970. In 1972 he hooked up with Nunies before joining Cip's Home Plate in 1978.

After being with Cip's for nine years, he went on to play for VFW (1987-1991), Lockery's (1992-1996) and Hard Hat Cafe (1997-2008).

Paul began play in the Milford Senior League in 2004 with Miller Fuel where he spent seven seasons before joining the Hard Hat Cafe from

2011 to 2016.

He is still playing in the Wallingford and Madison 60 and over Senior leagues. Paul has been a part of forty total championships highlighted by two Class A State crowns and eight Sectional winners in addition to seven senior league titles and five New Haven City championships.

He has also been to a pair of Class A Regionals and Class A National Tournaments. Playing both at third base and in the outfield, Paul has a lifetime batting average of around .625. He has also belted over 250 home runs while racking up in excess of 2000 RBI's.

He has made all tournament teams an impressive 18 times. Included are one selection at the National level, two Class A Regionals, five Class A States and two Class B States plus six Class A Sectionals and two Class B Sectionals.

Paul is proud to have helped Tony Catapano for twenty years in the Special Olympics program. He served as a scorekeeper at East Shore Park during the Special Olympics World Games in early July 1995.

He was a volunteer worker for the Jim Valvano "Never Give Up Classic" and has also managed his two sons' team in softball.

Paul currently resides in East Haven.



Mario Calabrese

Mario played modified ball as a young man in Waterbury for ten years before Al Blancato, the Waterbury/Naugatuck Umpire-In-Chief invited Mario to join the umpire ranks

Mario took training and began working his way up the ladder. He spent several years serving the Parochial school league before being moved up to middle school games, then Junior Varsity. After ten years of umpiring, he got his first high school Varsity assignments.

In 1992 he attended a weekend umpire training clinic and was recognized by evaluator-and Hall of Fame member Zach Garr-as a promising candidate for the collegiate fast pitch game.

Mario was invited to join East Coast Umpire

Associates, a Connecticut based consortium of skilled and dedicated fastpitch umpires.

Since then Mario has attained the highest level of recognition by the NCAA Softball Umpire Program. He has worked seven regional tournaments, seven super regional tournaments, and three Division II College Softball World Series tournaments.

Along the way he umpired in some 20 Connecticut High School Softball Championships. He is one the most accomplished and respected umpires in the nation. He represented Connecticut in some 120 college fast pitch games this season alone.

Mario was president of the Waterbury Naugatuck Softball Umpire Association for 8 years. He has umpired in the Big Ten, ACC, Big East, Atlantic Ten, Colonial Athletic Association, Patriot League, as well as various DII and DIII conferences. He was honored with being selected to his first DII National Championship in 2013 and again in 2014. He was once again selected this year 2022 to umpire his third National Championship in Denver.

His career is not over, and he will no doubt continue to achieve accolades and serve the game at the highest level.

Mario wanted to add that early in his career he was given the opportunity to umpire a Men's Major Fast Pitch National Tournament in Worcester, MA. There he learned " the difference between umpiring grown men who would express their displeasure in many colorful ways if they did not agree with" his calls and the subtle way to play the game of softball on the diamond! He perused the latter path of umpiring!

Mario resides in Prospect with his wife Lisa and would like to thank her for all her support that allowed him to follow his passion for umpiring the game of softball.



Tony Cappuccia

Tony Cappuccia had an amazing 30 year softball career as one of the most respected and successful softball managers/coaches in the state of Connecticut.

Attested to by former players and opponents, Tony's ability to manage a team, tournament and games was comparable to many other managers/coaches who have been inducted into the ASA-USA Softball Hall of Fame over the years.

His loyalty to his players and the team was unmatched. This is what kept the core of his teams together through the years and allowed them to be competitive at the highest level.

There was one coach's name that was always mentioned as representing the City of Norwalk in a positive way: Tony Cappuccia.

He began building his legend in the early 90's when he was able to recruit some of the best players from the area for his St. Ann's team.

From 1995 thru 2017, Tony's squads won the Norwalk city tournament 14 times. He led his teams to 30 ASA titles at the local, state, regional and national levels, including qualifying for 24 ASA national championship tournaments and participating in 30 CT ASA State Championship Tournaments. His Over 35 team won back to back National Tournaments.

One of his former players, Jim Pellegrino, maybe best summed up what Tony meant to his players. Jim said "I also knew Tony off the field. And to me that is where he is also a Hall of Famer. There is no one more giving or caring. He comes from a very close family. He was able to transfer that "family" feeling to his teams."

Tony passed away this past March.



Jim Consiglio

A talented athlete and sports lover, Jimmy played softball for Bender Highlanders.

In 1991 he became player, manager, coach and sponsor of what would prove to be one of the most dominating teams in the state for close to two decades, ChecKing.

They were a powerhouse team that played at the highest levels, either Class A or Class B, wherever the best competition was.

Jim earned his first managerial State title in Class A in 1996 under the ChecKing/ Dudley banner. As ChecKing they won Class B in 1999. Then, for four straight years (2002-2005) ChecKing/

Worth took home the first place hardware in the States: 2002 combined Class A and B, 2003 2004 Class B and 2005 Class A.

Multiple trips to the Nationals were highlighted by a second place finish in the 2004 Class B East Nationals, a third place finish in the 2005 Class A East Nationals and then capped off by the 2009 Class B Eastern Nationals championship.

Jim passed away in December 2021.

He left a legacy that will be hard to surpass.



Cathy Crowe

After graduating in 1978 as a three-sport athlete from Amity High School, Cathy earned a scholarship to University of New Haven for both basketball and softball.

While focusing on basketball she still wanted to play softball during the summer. Cathy was recruited to play slow-pitch by Suzanne DiBiase who was playing for Bull and Bear.

This began a career that would last over four decades and is still going.

In 1978 Cathy began playing with Coppola Realtors in the Milford Women's League. That year began a string of twelve consecutive league championships and an equal number of trips to the State Tournament for the team.

In 1990 Cathy took over as player/ coach with a

new sponsor, Redwood Restaurant.

The city championships kept coming, culminating in the team going undefeated in capturing the 1993 Connecticut State Women's ASA Class C Slow-Pitch crown.

From 1994 to 2002 the team became Milford Seafood and The Beachcomber and continued the winning.

Resurrecting the Coppola Realtors moniker in 2008, the team went on to capture ten more straight city titles. Even back surgery didn't stop Cathy from returning to the field late in the season to guide her team to another title in 2013.

After giving up coaching duties in 2018, she was recruited by 7-Sea's where she rejoined one of her first teammates of 40 years ago, Suzanne DiBiase. End result-another city championship.

Cathy's teams earned over 22 state tournament berths, 11 New England Regionals, coming in second in 1994 in Maine and also went on to play in three National Tournaments.

Cathy was recently recruited to play on the Women's Over 60 Masters team The Ct Thunder. As their pitcher she led her team to Bronze at the Nationals in Florida, Silver in the New Jersey games and two Gold medals in the Connecticut games. After just two seasons she has now been selected by her teammates as Captain and Coach and is looking forward to the Nationals in May 2023 in Ohio.

Cathy coaches and officiates boys and girl's youth softball, baseball, basketball and flag football in area towns. She coaches the girls combined Hamden Travel team. She's been involved in Special Olympics and works as a Crisis Interventionist and security guard with at risk children at the alternative high school in Hamden and is a foster mom. She was the Hamden High JV Softball coach for two years and became the Assistant Varsity Coach for four years with two of those teams earning berths in the state title game.

Cathy now resides in Milford.



Dave D'Agostino

Beginning in 1971, Dave had a career that spanned 22 years in which he played for several elite clubs.

A-1 Toyota was the first stop for Dave. He was with that squad from 1971 until 1973. He then joined Merles Record Rack from 1974 until 1976 before moving on to Powers Screen Printing (1977-1979).

Dave then turned pro in 1980 when he hooked up with the New England Pilgrims in the American Professional Slow Pitch League. He stayed with them for two years before resuming his ASA career with Head to Toe in 1982. After the 1984 season he played with Town & Country from 1985 until 1987 before concluding his career with Eagle Printing (1988-1991).

Dave was always proud of keeping the “core” players together. He played over 120 games per season in his prime years. He excelled at third base and left center field. He combined speed with a strong arm and a great glove. He was known as the “table setter”.

In over 1000 games played Dave racked up over 2500 hits, 2500 runs scored, 2000 RBI's and a .685 lifetime batting average. He was a part of 19 total championships in New Haven, Milford, East Haven, Meriden, North Haven, Orange and the “Classic League”.

Dave competed in 15 ASA State Tournaments and 5 ASA Regionals. He won 6 MVP awards and was selected to All Tournament First Team ten times.

One of the highlights of Dave's career was when the Pilgrims played in front of 25,000 people at Shea Stadium against the Philadelphia Athletics before the Mets vs Expos in a Sunday doubleheader.

Dave was an ASA umpire for twelve years and was the inaugural award winner for Rookie Umpire named for “Cutsy” Celentano.

Dave managed four years of ASA girls softball and led those teams to three state championships and two undefeated seasons.

Although his softball teammates were always very close, there was no one more special than his dear friend Pat Paulson. They bonded over 43 years and became Godparents to their mutual sons.

Dave resides in Goodyear, Arizona with his wife Anne. He has two children who live in Connecticut, Erica and her daughter Gia and his son Dave Jr., his wife Christina and their daughter Mila.



Tom Dorso

For eleven years Tom Dorso earned the distinction of being a power hitting catcher who could also hit for average as the two Waterbury area teams he played for made ten straight trips to the Connecticut State Modified Tournament. From 1971 to 1973 Tom played with Dukes Club before switching allegiance to the Golden Villa Freaks. During his time with Golden Villa Tom became their all time home run leader before hanging up his spikes in 1981.

He compiled a lifetime batting average of .378, including an impressive .410 in state tournament play, while slugging 208 four baggers.

In addition to his frequent trips to the State Tournament, Tom also made the 1981 Modified Nationals in Waterville, ME and was part of several Waterbury, Middlebury and Brass City Modified Championship squads.

Tom passed away in 2014.



Charlie Duffy

Charlie Duffy earned his Hall of Fame honors with a career that spanned parts of four decades (1962-1993). During that time he played for only four teams but was a main contributor to the success of those squads beyond the local level. Right out of the gate he was part of Westport's Club Grill 1962 Open State Championship team. He was with them for one more season before hooking up with Schafers Sporting Goods of Westport in 1964.

After four years with Schafers, Charlie became a member of Surf Side Restaurant of Fairfield. He spent nine years with Surf Side and capped off his time there by helping them capture both Class A State and New England Regional titles

and a Louisville Invitational Championship, all in 1976.

Then, in 1977 and for the next 17 years, he became a part of the legendary Sonny's of Westport combine.

Sonny's captured the 1980 Major State Championship before adding Class A State titles in 1986 and 1988 thru 1991 and a Class A National Qualifier crown in 1987 in Rhode Island.

They also were Westport Town League and Rowayton Sunday Morning League champions 14 times each while winning 11 Connecticut Classic League titles.

Overall Charlie played in 31 Connecticut State Championship Tournaments, 7 Class A New England Regional Tournaments and 14 National Tournaments.

As an outstanding third baseman and outfielder, Charlie amassed a .625+ lifetime batting average and earned numerous tournament batting titles and MVP awards.

Charlie now makes his home in Westport.



Bob Gabianelli

A standout player throughout his youth, Bob launched his 14 year softball career at the age of 19 in 1979 with local teams in Derby before joining the Air Force in 1981.

It was here where Bob honed his skills to become the elite softball player that earned his induction into the Hall of Fame.

In 1983 he won a spot on the All Military Airlift Command team which earned a second place finish in the Military Airlift Command Tournament in North Carolina. Bob was named to the All Air Force team as shortstop.

Also in 1983 Bob was selected as the starting second baseman for the Military Elite team which consisted of the Top 15 best players from every branch of the United States Military. That

team played in the Class A National Slow Pitch Tournament in Iowa.

And finally, to cap off the year 1983, Bob was nominated "Athlete of the Year" at Bolling Air Force Base.

After winning the "Home Run Derby of Championships" for Bolling Air Force Base in 1984, Bob completed his military service in 1986 and immediately became a member of two of Connecticut's elite teams of the 80's.

He earned the starting second baseman's job and became the cleanup hitter for Avco Lycoming of Stratford who won the National Industrial championship in Montgomery, AL. Bob was nominated to the All American team. In the National title game he was 3 for 3, with five RBI's and a home run.

In the Open Division Bob became the starting second baseman and batted fourth for Sonny's of Westport. In his tenure there from 1986 to 1991 he compiled an estimated batting average of .610.

Sonny's played in four Class A State Championship Tournaments, winning all four including three consecutive crowns.

Sonny's also competed in four Class A Regional New England Tournaments and the 1987 Class A National Tournament in Texas.

Bob finished off his career in 1992, helping Midas Touch earn a second place finish in the State Tournament.

Steve Reilly, Naugatuck Valley baseball coach, paid tribute to Bob's prowess in his baseball book "Lord of the Infield Flies."

Bob has been coaching Cal Ripken youth baseball for the past ten years and is now coaching his sons' AAU team.

Bob resides in New Milford with his wife Catherine and their two sons Evan and Ryan. He also has a step-daughter Sydney Altieri and a granddaughter Brooklyn.



S. David (Dave) Hill

Dave began his baseball career at Central Catholic High School in Norwalk, CT playing varsity baseball for the Cavaliers at a high level for four years at shortstop, as well as varsity basketball. Dave was recruited by several universities and colleges and accepted a sports scholarship to attend Mount St. Mary's University located in Maryland, a Division II program in the old Mason-Dixon Athletic Conference, now D-I in the MAC.

While at 'The Mount', Dave was a four year varsity baseball star, the first three years at shortstop and after off-season shoulder surgery, he adeptly handled the third base hot-corner duties during his senior year campaign. Dave garnered all-league shortstop first and second team honors three times while at Mt. St. Mary's. After graduation, Dave was an invitee of the Pittsburgh Pirates to a try-out camp at the Pirates Three-Rivers, Que. rookie facility. Dave's repaired shoulder limited him from performing at the highest level so he returned to Connecticut to begin his business career.

Back in Connecticut, Dave became connected with the Dorber Graphics fastpitch softball club and quickly joined and fit in immediately.

Dave possessed a quick glove, soft hands, he had exceptional range and a strong, accurate arm. He "turned-two" smoothly and was a huge "up the middle" defensive asset who played nearly all his games for Dorber at shortstop.

Dave was an excellent lead-off hitter who earned a career .344 batting average, stroking 29 home runs and 112 extra base hits. He scored 249 runs while driving in 202 and chipped-in with 65 stolen bases in his eleven year fastpitch playing career. Dave was selected as 1st-Team All-star at the shortstop position in the Housatonic Fastpitch League on eight occasions as well as being chosen as the 1st Team shortstop member of several all-tournament teams.

Environmentally conscious, Dave would lead the Dorber squad in sign-ups for annual beach clean-up events in the city of Milford where he resided.

Dave passed away in 2005.



Kelly Hubbard

Kelly began his softball playing career while serving in the United States Air Force at the Pease Air Force Base in New Hampshire from 1983 to 1985.

Upon returning home he continued playing for another ten years with the Ansonia based St. Sebastian's, Marcucio Farms and Slovak Club teams and also in the Sikorsky Aircraft intramural league.

Then, in 1995, Kelly decided to don the "blue" when he joined the Valley Umpires Association. Initially he worked games locally, eventually adding on sectional and state tournament assignments before improving his officiating credentials by attending the 2015 National Umpire School in Stratford.

He arrived on the national scene in that same year when he officiated at the USA Softball Men's Class D and E Slow Pitch Eastern Nationals in Salem, VA.

That was the first of three consecutive trips to the D and E Eastern Nationals, all in Salem.

In 2018, Kelly traveled to Prairie Island, MN to umpire in the Class C Slow Pitch Nationals. He followed that up with an assignment in the 2019 Class B Slow Pitch Nationals, also in Prairie Island.

Then, in 2020, Kelly went out to the home of USA Softball, Oklahoma City, to umpire in the Class A and B Slow Pitch Nationals.

In 2017 Kelly earned the honor of being accepted into the National Indicator Fraternity. He also was the recipient of the 2021 Jim Carey Award for Umpire Excellence from the Valley Umpires Association.

Kelly has been a member of the Valley Umpires Board of Directors for several years. Although Kelly has umpired primarily Slow Pitch, he has also done youth Fast Pitch assignments. He has displayed his officiating versatility as he and his brother Marty served as high school basketball referees.

Unfortunately Kelly passed away this past August. His skill, patience and dedication to the game of softball will be sorely missed.



Wayne Hurlbert

Wayne began his Hall of Fame worthy career with the Thomaston Police in 1977 before catching on with Skider's Gym of Thomaston in 1982.

That 1982 season began a string of three consecutive Connecticut State Modified Pitch titles for Skider's that included eighteen straight tournament wins. They compiled a 213-54 record over those three years.

Wayne was with Skider's for five seasons and, in each of those years, the team qualified for the Modified Nationals. 1982 Spokane, WA; 1983 Austin MN; 1984 Knoxville, TN. 1985 Drifton, PA and 1986 Concord, NH. The 1984 Knoxville trip produced a fourth place finish.

The last two years of Wayne's career were with Allyn's Cleaners of Watertown. And those last two years included two more appearances in a National Tournament. Decatur, AL was the destination in 1987 while 1988 was a 10 man Modified National in Meadville, PA.

In addition to success on the national level, Wayne's teams won numerous Waterbury, Watertown and Thomaston League and Tournament Championships.

Roaming the outfield in left and left center, Wayne compiled a lifetime batting average of .375. In State Tournament play he was even better with a .385 composite average. He also belted around 150 home runs.

Wayne played in the Modified Pitch States every year of his career and won the 1984 State Tournament MVP.

Wayne now resides in Thomaston



Peter Latella

Peter launched his softball career as a player in 1982 but his legacy for his 40 years in the game is sponsoring and managing some of the top Connecticut teams of the 90's and 2000's and still going.

Latella's, Checking/ Latella's, East Coast Security, Team ECS and Hard Hat Cafe/ Latella's/ Viosports. These were the Peter Latella managed teams that perennially challenged for tournament championships.

Under the Latella's banner Peter claimed his first State title as manager when he guided his team to the Class B crown in 1991. 1993 saw the team, now known as Checking/ Latella's, win their

second Class B championship.

East Coast Security earned Class C state titles in 1999 and 2001. His teams also annexed two 50 and Over State Championships.

Peter piloted his team to a pair of Over 50 Major National Championships: 2014 as Latella's/ JJM and 2017 as Hard Hat/ Latella's/ Viosports.

One of the biggest highlights of his career came in 2021 when his Latella's/ Hard Hat squad went undefeated in winning the USA World Championships in Las Vegas against teams from all over the world.

Pete has totaled well over a 1000 wins in his career, most of them against the toughest competition both in and out of state.

He was very active in the Connecticut Special Olympics program in the 90's. He was a coach in the Orange Little League and has served as a volunteer umpire for various charitable events.

Peter now makes his home in East Haven with his wife Carole.



Patrick Miconi

After a stellar baseball career at Housatonic Community College and the University of New Haven where Pat earned honors such as Junior College Player of the Year-Northeast 2nd Team All American and 1st Team All Tournament when his UNH team was National Runner-Up in the Division II College World Series, Pat switched gears and began playing softball in 1992.

Pat's 19 year softball career was exclusively at third base. He began his journey playing for East Coast Security before spending several years with Latella Carting. Pat was a part of many other prominent teams including Taconic Wire, Cable System, Ct SportsPlex/ Midas Touch and Steve's Sports.

He helped lead his teams to numerous local and state titles while qualifying to play in eight National Tournaments. In 1999 his East Coast Security squad won the Class C State Championships. They finished second the following year before regaining the crown in 2001.

Pat concluded his softball career on a particularly high note as he helped Steve's Sports earn the 2010 Over 40 National Championship. At that point it seemed like a good time to hang up his glove.

Pat totaled over 600 home runs and maintained a lifetime batting average of over .700. In 1999 he won The Connecticut SportsPlex Home Run Derby, hitting five home runs on five pitches in the finals.

Over the years, Pat made multiple All Tournament teams and earned MVP three times.

After his softball career ended Pat coached his son in Little League and eventually transitioned to the stands to watch his daughter, also a third baseman, play Little League, travel ball and now college softball.

Pat wanted to say that he is thankful for the many teammates he had over the years. Those teammates allowed him to be part of a group of people who won countless tournaments and traveled the country.

He currently resides in North Branford with his wife Jackie, son Patrick and daughter Jada.

Glen Noll



Glen enjoyed a 20 year career contributing to the success of some of the top Waterbury area modified pitch softball teams.

He began play in 1984 with Daveluy's Demons out of Watertown, CT. With the Demons he got his first taste of success beyond the local level as the team qualified for the New England Regionals, finishing high in the final standings.

After three seasons with the Demons he became a member of Domar's Warriors from Waterbury in 1987.

Then, in 1989, Glen began to pile up state, regional and national achievements when he joined

American Sportsworld from Waterbury. They won the Connecticut State Modified crown that year and qualified for the Nationals in Decatur, AL.

Sportsworld also made the 1994 National Tournament in Tewksbury, MA where Glen compiled a .400+ batting average.

After the 1995 season, Glen became a member of the Lithuanian Club out of Waterbury. He played for them for two years (1996-1997) and, in both those seasons, they were State Champions and qualified for the Nationals.

1998 saw Glen join the Hill Street Social Club squad from Waterbury before concluding his softball tenure by moving south to play with the M & M Boys out of Bridgeport (2002-2003).

Playing both in the outfield and first base, Glen sported a .390+ lifetime batting average while belting over a hundred home runs and stealing a like number of bases. He also batted over .400 in a New England Regional Tournament Championship in Augusta, ME.

Glen now resides in The Villages FL.



Beth Quesnel

Although she showed a love for baseball at an early age, Beth grew up in a small town in Maine where there weren't many opportunities for girls to play sports.

But, at the age of 12, she was invited to play with the boys on the Bethel Red Sox Little League team. Unfortunately her playing time was limited because some teams would not allow a girl to play. That was in 1955.

The only time Beth got a chance to play softball in her younger years was at recess in middle school and in gym class in high school.

After graduating from college in 1966, she got a teaching job in North Stonington and coached the girls' softball team there. She also coached and played on a women's team sponsored by

the Mystic, CT Community Center In 1972, and that team won a fast pitch tournament in Stratford.

From 1974 till 1987, Beth coached the Stonington High School girls softball team. With a coaching philosophy of getting her players to do their best, be team players and accepting both winning and losing gracefully, her teams qualified for the state tournament each year she was there. Her win-loss record was 157-80.


Then, at the age of 28-29, Beth joined the Bridgeport Coeds which was her first opportunity to play fast pitch softball at the highest level. With the Coeds she played in two national tournaments..

The next year, encouraged by her husband, Beth tried out for the Raybestos Brakettes. She made the team and, under the tutelage of Hall of Famer coach Ralph Raymond, she earned second team All American twice. The first time was in 1976 as a third baseman and the second time was in 1978 as an outfielder.

In her four years with the Brakettes (1975-1978) the team was National Champion each year. Highlighting that span was winning the World Tournament in El Salvador in 1975, Beth was the left fielder in all the games.

After taking several years off from softball, Beth returned to the game, the slow pitch variety. Playing in the Senior Divisions, she has continued to earn MVP and Best Of honors while helping her teams achieve success at the national level.

Now residing in The Villages, FL she is displaying her overall athleticism with participation in pickleball, tennis, golf and basketball. But she says "I love playing all these sports but my favorite is softball. I hope to continue playing until I'm 80 and can win the National Senior Tournament in softball."



Ed Skowronski

Ed launched a softball career that spanned five decades in 1969 with the A.R.A./ Colonial Club which played in the highly competitive Valley Major League versus powerhouse teams like Preston Machine and Kasden Fuel.

He was with them for nine seasons and twice they qualified for the State Tournament.

Ed also had a long tenure (1971 thru 1990) with Over the Hill Tavern/ The Galley/ Martino Shoe in the Derby Recreational League.

However Ed's talent was such that he became an integral part of the perennially dominant Sikorsky Aircraft club from 1971 through 2006, first as a player, then as a coach and finally manager.

As a full time player until 1980 and then player/ coach through 1998, Ed was both an outfielder and a catcher. He maintained a lifetime batting average of approximately .500 and was a clutch hitter with men on base. He had the power that always stationed him in the 5,6 or 7 spot in the lineup.

Ed retired as a player after the 1998 season and took over as manager from 1999 through 2006.

Either as a player, player/ coach or manager, Ed participated in 36 ASA tournaments including a string of 26 straight years. While with Sikorsky, Ed was part of 17 National Championships, 14 as player/ coach and three as manager, plus four second place finishes. Sikorsky also won nine Regional titles and nine State Dusty League crowns.

Ed expressed his gratitude for being able to play with and against some of Connecticut's best softball players who are Hall Of Famers. Out of playing this fun game he has felt fortunate to travel to other cities throughout the country. Softball gave him the opportunity to forge new friendships with many people that continue today. He wants to be remembered as a player who played the game hard, was respected by the players that he played against, as coach / manager and that he was a fair person to everyone. That he was a good leader that would fight for them, but most of all that he was a good person to all.

Ed now makes his home in Stratford.



Tom Verrengia

Tom has a nearly 40 year career in fast pitch softball both as a player and a coach.

He began his love of the game as a pre-teen bat boy for the three time State Champion Cypress Arms in the West Hartford League.

He later joined New England Video under Hall of Fame coach Billy Baer. They played in several State Tournaments as well as others along the East Coast and traveled to South Dakota for the Nationals.

Tom also was a member of two of the West Hartford League's power house teams, Beacon Cafe and Shannon's Cafe.

He was an all-star infielder, mostly at shortstop, as well as a reliable hitter, with a career average of over 300. It was his knowledge of the game that made him exceptional. He instinctively sensed when to bunt or steal a base, knowing all the strategies needed to be successful.

This knowledge served Tom well as he moved from being a player to a 25 year career as a high school coach of fast pitch softball.

He coached Conard High School in West Hartford from 1996 to 2016. During that span he led them to five league titles (2000, 2001, 2003, 2007, 2009) and the LL State Championship in 2011. That 2011 team earned the #1 ranking from the Hartford Courant/CPTV Sports poll.


In 2001 Tom began coaching the Connecticut Tigers Travel team of 12-18 year olds. He has taken them to many National Tournaments and is still at it.

Highlighting the 1970's portion of his career was being part of three consecutive State Championships by Cypress Arms (1978, 1979, 1980).


In the 80's Bob played with Prospect Cafe and New England Video who went to the 1988 Class A Fast Pitch Tourney in Fargo, ND.
