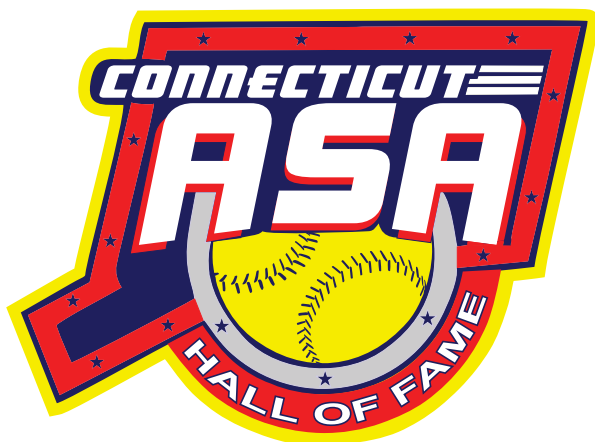

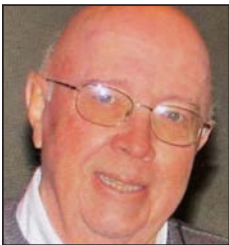
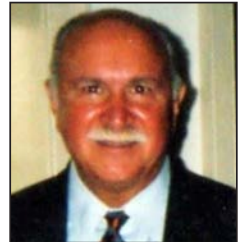

In August 2006, the sport of softball in Connecticut became unified in honoring its past with the merging of its fast pitch and slow pitch Halls of Fame. Prior to this merger, the two entities had each separately elected and inducted members to their respective Halls of Fame. That changed with the formation of one combined Hall of Fame to be known as the Connecticut ASA Hall of Fame.

USA Softball of Connecticut commissioner Hank Koritkoski oversees the umbrella organization with the fast pitch and slow pitch committees continuing to function as separate groups in selecting candidates for the USA Softball of Connecticut Hall of Fame.

USA Softball of Connecticut stages an annual Hall of Fame dinner to formally induct its new members.

The Fast Pitch Hall of Fame was established in 1971, with the Slow Pitch Hall starting in 1985. Committees to select Hall of Famers meet frequently and accept nominations for new candidates. To be eligible for consideration, a player must be retired for 5 years or, if the player is over 50 years of age, the 5 year waiting period is waived.

For nominees, applications should be submitted to the Hall of Fame committee chairs by April 1 each year. Any individual who had an outstanding softball career in Connecticut is eligible, with emphasis on state, regional and national tournament play as one of the important criteria for Hall of Fame consideration. Applications are available on our state website.

In 2017 Connecticut ASA re-branded to USA Softball of Connecticut and officially opened its physical Hall of Fame display which is located at Erin's Gym in Stratford.

John "Hawk" Bike

In a career that spanned 17 years John patrolled left field for three of the most dominant slow pitch teams in Connecticut softball annals.

Beginning in 1986, "Hawk" batted leadoff for the Stonybrook JAWS. He was with the JAWS, in that leadoff spot, for fourteen seasons before concluding his career with a three year stint with Ray's Together (2000-2002). He was also a contributor to two of Sikorsky Aircraft's 19 Major Industrial National Championships in 1992 and 1993.

John's teams made Connecticut State Tournaments in each of his 17 years. Twelve of those appearances were in Class A and included runners up finishes in 1995 with JAWS and 2002 with Ray's. The other five were in Class B which resulted in four state titles, two with JAWS in 1996 and 1997 and two with Ray's in 2000 and 2001.

In addition to his Sikorsky National Championship squads, he was part of four Class B National Tournament teams (JAWS in 1996 and 1997 and Ray's in 2000 and 2001) as well as an equal number of Connecticut Sectional Championships. Locally he and the JAWS captured the Stratford Penders ASA League crown ten times and he was also part of four North Branford Thursday Night Elite League title winning teams.

While compiling outstanding career offensive numbers (around .625 batting average, 120 home runs, 300 triples and 400 doubles), John's glove work in left field was at the elite level, earning him six tournament defensive MVP's. He also had a pair of overall tournament MVP's and earned a second team All American berth in the 2001 Class B Nationals.

After his playing career concluded, John has continued to stay active in the game, helping sponsor the Stratford JAWS Redux which is all the kids of the JAWS old timers. They won the Stratford league three years in a row.

John and his wife Tracy live in Stratford and have four children along with four grandchildren.



Dave Carpenter

Dave Carpenter had a life long love of sports. When he was young he played baseball and throughout his life he appreciated the commitment and determination of athletes. He sponsored the Stratford Brakettes from 1996 until his passing in 2007. His sponsorship came at a critical moment and saved the team, a team that has been an institution in the world of softball. The Stratford Brakettes have won 28 National Championships.

Dr. David Olin Carpenter was born and raised in Woodhull, NY. He attended Alfred University, earning a PhD in Ceramic Engineering. His career began at The New Jersey Zinc in 1963, where he was recognized for his expertise in zinc oxide applications with improved semi-conductor properties. He developed coatings essential to the first NASA Mars landers. In 1976 he was named head of NJZ's Metals and Minerals Research Division. In 1981 Dr Carpenter was one of the founders of Horsehead Industries. Dr. Carpenter became the CEO of Horsehead Resource Development, a subsidiary. At HRD he led the development and commercialization of the recycling of EAF Dust, a hazardous by-product of the steel industry. This discovery kept, and continues to keep, millions of tons of hazardous waste out of land fills.

After Horsehead Industries sold off a number of companies in the late 1990's, Dr. Carpenter, who had retired in 1996 subsequently founded Riverside Management Group with his son James Carpenter.

Dr. Carpenter was also active in his community and with charities. Amongst many activities, he served as a trustee and treasurer of The Palmerton Hospital for more than 10 years.

During his time with The Brakettes, Dave Carpenter was not only a sponsor but a fan. He was a down to earth, every day guy who would eat breakfast at the diner, pay to get into the ballpark, grab a hot dog at the stand, and then watch his favorite team go out and play a doubleheader. Dave made every effort to be at DeLuca Field to watch his Brakettes play. Often at his side was his wife of five decades, Dorothy Carpenter, as well as his two children, James and Carla, and their families. Dave's grandchildren have wonderful memories of taking in games at the ballpark and collecting player's autographs.

Dave Carpenter and Brakette's coach John Stratton were friends, and they both received The Sterling Spirit Award in May of 2006. The award recognizes sportsmanship in the state of Connecticut. Dave Carpenter took as much pride in his softball team as the management and the Brakettes players took in perpetuating this great tradition.



Ken Dibble

It all began in 1987 and is still continuing to this day. A 38 year career (and counting) that has seen Ken Dibble achieve Hall of Fame status by helping multiple teams capture ASA and USA Softball Tournament Championships while also earning himself numerous MVP and All Tournament awards.

Jordans/Pippas was the first stop in Ken's softball journey. For three years he was their shortstop, earning the team's defensive player MVP twice, never batting under .700, and helping them win a State Championship. 1990 saw Ken begin a sixteen year career with one of Connecticut's all time best slow pitch teams, Ray's Together. During those sixteen years, Ray's won multiple State and Regional titles while making trips to the Nationals a regular thing.

One of Ken's fondest moments was hitting a walk off home run in the finals leading Ray's to one of those state championships.

Ken's coach and team sponsor at that time, Hall of Famer Ray Montambo, dubbed him "Calendar Man" as he had never seen a player turn his game up so many levels when it was time for a big game whether it be a State, Regional or, especially, a National Tournament contest.

When Ray retired after the 2005 season, Ken went on to join Heritage/ Cornerstone for the 2006 and 2007 seasons. That team captured back to back Over 35 National Championships with Ken, making the All American teams both years while also capturing the 2006 MVP, batting .780 with six home runs.

In 2008 Ken played with Four Corners. They finished third in the Over 35 Nationals with Ken earning another berth on the tournament All American team.

From 2009 to 2015 Ken contributed to numerous successful tournament runs with KL & R Construction while adding three more tourney MVP awards and a half dozen All Tournament team selections to his resume.

After a five year stint (2016-2020) with Covello Sanitation that included an Over 50 National Championship in 2018, Ken hooked up with his present team, Hard Hat/ Latellas, who captured the 2023 Over 50 National Crown. He made the All American teams in both those championship years while also being named the 2018 Most Outstanding Defensive Player.

Ken still maintains a batting average north of .650 and takes great pride in his defense. As noted he is still playing and is now participating in Over 60 tournaments.

He makes his home in Bridgeport.



Lisa Bull DiLullo

Beginning in 2003, when she became a member of the Milford Umpires Association, Lisa has built quite an impressive umpiring resume.

Lisa started out locally in 2003 umpiring both adult slow pitch and recreational youth fast pitch and, subsequently, Little League softball. She began umpiring high school fast pitch softball in 2008. Through the Fairfield County Softball Umpires Association, she has umpired numerous post-season high school championship games.

Then, after attending her first of three USA Softball National Umpire Training Schools, she earned her first of many assignments at the national level: the 2010 12U USA Softball National Championship, Virginia.

She is a member of the First Baptist Church of Milford serving on Missionary Ministry.

Born in Milford, Lisa had a government career, allowing her to live in New York, Kentucky and several other places. She is now back in Milford. She has a son, David Smith, his wife Christine Glandorf and their sons, Nolan and Call, who live in Massachusetts.

Ed Dolan



Ed Dolan is a poor boy from Dorchester Massachusetts. In 1969, after graduating from law school he became a proud resident of Goatville, CT where he has resided for more than 50 years.

He started his softball career in 1970 in East Haven, CT. For more than 20 years his playing career was best described as below average. Thereafter he found the secret to softball success. He signed Bobby Garcia, Perry Flowers, and numerous other members of Benders who's best years were behind them. By providing a place for countless former legends to practice their craft the team that he sponsored had remarkable success over the past 30 years. It was cheaper than Therapy and far more fun.

He has made more friends on softball fields than he has made in the legal fields of CT, either as a lawyer or a Judge. He is the father of Michael Dolan, Matthew Dolan, and his three grandchildren Cora, Will, and Isla, none of whom play softball.



Chris Dostaler

Six decades of playing softball. That alone is impressive enough. But the achievements that Chris has accomplished cemented his induction into the Hall of Fame.

With the well-deserved nickname of Ace, he was on the mound, primarily fast pitch, for the entirety of his career. He began playing with Daveluy's Demons in 1976 with many of his high school classmates and became one of the top teams in the area.

His first experience in the state tournament came with Joe's Tires finishing third after a string of upsets in 1978. The Demons then finished in the top 4 for a dozen consecutive years.

In 1979 Chris donned a second hat, the cap of the Demons team's manager. He was at the helm of the Demons until 1991. During that time span the Demons played twice a week in Watertown, the Town Plot League (1984-1991) and the Thomaston League (1985-1988) winning over 30 titles along the way.

After leaving the Demons, Chris played with Tavern on the Green and continued his player/ manager role for several years before joining forces with Jay Santoli led teams to finish out his first part of his softball career and winning the title 1998.

His teams qualified for at least ten New England Regionals. The highlight was in 1986 in Waterville ME. when Chris hurled a perfect game on the way to winning the championship. He also pitched in three National Modified Tournaments: Spokane, Washington with Skidders Gym, Marietta, Georgia with Mario Barber Shop and Miami, Florida with a Jay Santoli led team with varied success.

After a five year hiatus, Chris returned to playing for the VIC House in the Cheshire League and played ten more seasons before calling it quits to the modify world after the 2014 season.

In 2018 he turned to Slow Pitch, playing in the Farmington Slow Pitch League with his two sons and many of the young men he coached in Little League and continued to win championships

Chris's six-decade win total exceeds 700 and winning nearly 75% of the games pitched. With his team's tournament success, Chris racked up over 80 wins in tournament action, most with the Demons.

He gave the following assessment of his lengthy career, "It has been a blast while competing at a high level and allowed me to meet many good people."

Chris grew up in Watertown and now lives in Plainville.



Linda Finelli

Linda was born and raised in Waterbury, CT. She was the first child of Raymond & Doris Finelli. She has three siblings: Diane Rosa, Carol Roach and Raymond Finelli, Jr.

In 2013, Linda retired from The State of CT Juvenile Court System of Willimantic after 25 years. Linda is a proud member of the First Baptist Church of Lebanon and holds her church family near and dear to her heart.

Linda started in the Waterbury Parks Department League after her dad told her that she couldn't play for the New York Yankees. She attended her freshman year at Crosby High. She finished her high school education at Wolcott High School where she lettered in three sports: softball, basketball and field hockey. Coached by her dad, Linda played on The Waterbury Starlets, sponsored by Campus Corner and Jim Janetto. Her first encounter with Joan Joyce was when she was 12 years old, playing in a summer league coached by Joan and Waterbury Catholic High students. She pitched for that team.

In the spring of 1971, Linda tried out for the Raybestos Brakettes. She was one of two women who made the team. While her childhood dream was to play with them, she never knew what her rookie season had in store for her. The Brakettes actually went 57-0. From 1971-1974, Linda was part of the Brakettes that won four National Titles, one Intercontinental Title in Calabria, Italy and a World Title in Stratford. Linda left the Brakettes in 1975, moving to Lebanon in 1976. She was employed by UConn and served as assistant coach of the Women's Softball team.

This is Linda's 4th Hall of Fame induction in both fast and slow pitch softball. Previous Hall of Fame awards include The Willimantic Women's Softball League, Waterbury Sportsmen's, and The Wolcott's Circle of Sports. Linda continues to follow high school and college softball today. Linda visited the National Hall of Fame in Oklahoma several years ago and was impressed with the facilities women have today. She continues to work for equality for women in sports. The opportunities for women today in softball and all other sports are enormous. If a child has this kind of talent, she should be given every opportunity to fulfill her dream. Linda's dream was fulfilled by the persistence of her father and mother, the constant practice with cousins Anthony Finelli and Richard Tiso, and the total support of her siblings.



Rich Lucewicz

In an eleven year (1984-1994) career, Rich had the distinction of playing in a National Modified Championship Tournament every year.

In 1984, he and his Highgate Liquors and Rathskellers Lounge out of Watertown teammates played in the Thomaston Tournament. Rich batted .535 and was MVP of the tourney. They traveled to Long Island in 1985 and 1986 and Worcester, MA in 1987 with Rich hitting over .400 each time including a .521 performance in Worcester.

Rich joined American Sports World out of Waterbury the following season and played with them until the end of his career in 1994. From 1988 until 1992 they made the Nationals in Worcester, MA, Decatur, AL, Nashua, NH, Hialeah, FL, Meadville, PA, Elmira, NY, and Lowell, MA.

He continued to be more than a reliable tournament hitter, batting no less than .333 with a high of .535 in Lowell in 1993.

Rich participated in ten Connecticut Modified Pitch State Championships. American Sports World captured the 1989 State crown with Rich belting the game winning home run in the title game.

He also played two seasons with Jo Ro's out of Oakville (1991-1992) and was a tournament addition for Allyn's Cleaners out of Watertown in 1990.

Rich was acknowledged by many coaches and players as being one of the best clutch hitters and defensive outfielders in the game at that time in Connecticut.

He now resides in Seminole, FL.



Melissa Magdon

Following in the footsteps of her father, Joe Magdon, a proud 1994 inductee, Melissa discovered her passion for softball while traveling to his tournaments across the country every summer. Her early years as a dedicated competitive gymnast and a stint in little league laid the foundation for her athletic prowess. It wasn't until high school at Foran High in Milford that she truly embraced competitive softball. She played collegiately at the University of Bridgeport, where she was honored on the All-ECAC, All-Region and All New England teams. In her senior season, she led Division II in triples with an impressive 13.

Launching her slow-pitch softball career in 1993, Melissa achieved immediate success when her first team, Redwood Restaurant from Milford, won the Women's Class C State championship. It was the first of seven Connecticut State Title winning teams (five Women and two Co-Ed). The second championship came at the Co-Ed level with Milford Seafood in 1995, followed by a Women's Class D title with Corner Pocket in 1999 and then the second Co-Ed crown with Orange Ale House in 2001. Three Women's Championships (2007, 2008, and 2012) as both player and coach for Advanced Home Audio capped off Melissa's seven pack. Altogether, Melissa played in 17 Women's and 20 Co-Ed State Tournaments as well as a New England Regional with Redwood in 1993. State and regional success produced twelve trips to National Tournaments, eight of those tourney berths were Co-Ed, highlighted by a third-place finish by Melissa's 2007 Merrill Lynch team in Dallas, TX. A fifth-place finish in the 2009 tournament in Dothan, AL, and a third-place finish in the 2018 tournament in Lakewood, NJ highlighted her four Women's National appearances. In addition to her achievements beyond the local level, she has been a part of numerous league championship teams while also capturing an ASA Co-Ed Invitational crown in 2015. Other teams to whose success she contributed were Milford Seafood, Amberjacks, and Subway (Milford Women's League 1993-2013), Redwood, R&M Security, Swiss Army, Merrill Lynch, Land Sharks, and CT Ball Breakers (Milford Co-Ed League 1993-2014). Also, CT Ball Breakers, and Swingers. (Bridgeport Co-Ed league 2010-2023), CT Ball Breakers (New Haven Co-Ed League 2012-2016), All About that Base (West Haven/Milford Women's League 2020-present), and DLU/Plummer (Middletown Women's League 2010-present).

Melissa has participated in numerous charity tournaments, including Milford's Swing for a Cure. She has won the home run derby contest at the Swing for a Cure tournament three times. Additionally, she received the Sportsmanship Award for the city of Milford in 2012.

Denny McMahon

Denny was an outstanding shortstop who shared his Hall of Fame worthy talent with three Thomaston based teams over a fifteen year career.

He launched his softball journey with the Thomaston Police in 1980. He then joined Skider's Gym from 1981 to 1986 before concluding his career with Red's Hardware (1987-1994).

Those years with Skider's Gym highlighted Denny's softball resume. With Denny as their leadoff hitter and who was always a threat to steal, Skider's won 18 straight State Tournament games from 1982 to 1985 resulting in three Modified State Championships.

They also qualified for three consecutive trips to the National Modified Tournament. In 1982 Skider's travelled to Spokane, WA, 1983 to Austin, MN and 1984 to Knoxville, TN. The 1984 team came home with a fourth place finish.

Overall the teams Denny played on captured over thirty tournament titles plus numerous Waterbury and Thomaston League championships.

Denny carried a lifetime batting average of .385 and an on base percentage of .464. His Connecticut State Tournament average was an even more impressive .402.

He earned his league MVP in 1982.

Denny makes his home in Torrington.



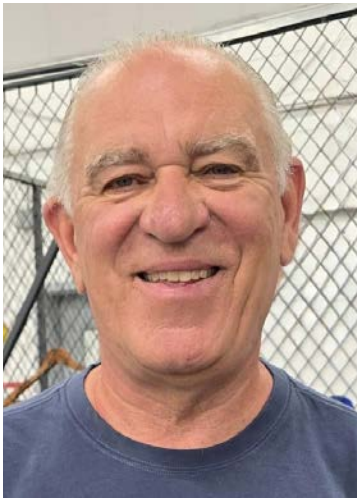
Gary “Kookie” Mendillo

Gary “Kookie” Mendillo launched his Hall of Fame worthy softball career in the early 1990’s with East Coast Security/ Taconic Wire. He achieved success early as that East Coast/ Taconic squad captured both the 1992 Class B Connecticut State and New England Regional Championships. That would be the first of multiple team titles he would contribute to. After his stint with East Coast/ Taconic, Gary played 17 years for CheckKing during which time they earned a total of ten State crowns at both the Class A and Class B levels. They also captured the 2009 Class B Eastern National championship.

Gary then went on to play with Steve’s Sports/ Kings Court for ten years. He aided in their winning the 2014 Class D Eastern National crown and also a Connecticut Sectional championship and a State Tournament runners-up finish.

Also high on the list of Gary’s accomplishments was the tournament MVP Award he earned when his Production Paint team won the 2008 Over 35 National title. Approaching thirty years as a player, Gary is continuing being active on the field at the Senior level. Primarily a second baseman, he has maintained a lifetime batting average of approximately .675 and has amassed twenty All Tournament team selections.

He has played in numerous fundraisers and charity events over the years. Gary now makes his home in Hamden with his wife Kathryn.



Mark Mihalick

Mark's Hall of Fame career began rather modestly in 1980. For ten years he honed his softball skills at the local level with Rohrig's and Flying 'A' Service Center in the Milford, New Haven and Stratford leagues.

The 1990's began a tremendous stream of successes beyond the local level for Mark. Beginning in 1990, he played in 24 consecutive National Major Industrial Tournaments with Sikorsky Aircraft. Those appearances resulted in fourteen championships for Sikorsky, including seven consecutive, and three runners up finishes. Mark earned seven All American tournament

team honors, four first team and three second team. In the 2011 tournament he batted .833 to win the batting title.

He also helped Stratford Ale House capture the 1997 Over 35 State title and was part of a pair State Major Industrial championships for Sikorsky. Other top tier teams Mark played with were Redwood Restaurant from Milford, with whom he earned a Class B Connecticut State runners up finish, Milford Seafood, Montano's, Stratford Ale House, 3 Brothers and Davco.

He began playing Senior 50 AAA softball with M & H Advisors in the Milford League in 2012 before hanging up his spikes in 2015.

Playing all four outfield positions and catcher, Mark typified the consummate leadoff batter as he carried a lifetime average in the neighborhood of .650 by being able to hit to all fields and drawing walks. In addition to his on the field accomplishments, he has also contributed to the game by umpiring for over ten years in the Sikorsky Interdepartmental League and coaching various Milford teams.

Mark is happy to have made many lifetime friends from softball and, also, to have had the opportunity to travel to many states throughout the years playing softball. He has been to various tournaments in Sherbrooke and Montreal Canada, competing against the best players in North America.

He feels his biggest contribution to the game has always been being a team player and trying his hardest to become the best player that he can be.

Mark makes Milford his home.



Mitch Overbye

Mitch has achieved immense success at Westminster School in Simsbury where he's been the head varsity softball coach for 23 years and led teams to 275 wins. During that span, his teams have won eleven Founders League titles and nine Western New England Championships. Since the first Founders League title in 2007, the team record has been 241 wins and 36 losses.

Westminster softball players have gone on to compete at Division 1 and Division 3 schools including Bates College, Bowdoin College, Brandeis University, Bryant University, Cornell University, Georgetown University, Hamilton College, Manhattan University, RPI, St. Lawrence, and Wesleyan University.

In 2016 Mitch was honored with the Swayze Award, presented annually to a member of the Westminster faculty for outstanding contributions to the life of the school.

In 2021, he was honored with the Nadal Award. Voted upon by Founders League Coaches and Athletic Directors, it's the highest sportsmanship recognition among Founders League schools. The citation reads: "plays by the rules, accepts victory or defeat graciously, and respects all who assemble and participate."

Mitch began a very successful coaching career in the mid 1990's with Windsor town teams. There he had the pleasure of coaching his daughter, who has been a highly successful head softball coach at Noble and Greenough School in Massachusetts.

He coached Simsbury town teams for many years including being an assistant coach for the 2004 Simsbury Big League State Championship team (Bob Rumbold and Craig Raymond were co-head coaches). He also assisted in managing Mirage teams for many years and Polar Crush for two years.

Mitch was head coach of the Simsbury Connecticut Women's Softball League (CTWSL) team for five years, highlighted by his leadership of the 2010 championship team.

Mitch makes Simsbury his home.



Rick “Rico” Portal

Rico played Fast Pitch softball for ten years for Peter Pan Café, winning a number of West Hartford League titles and a 1981 Class A Connecticut ASA State Championship.

He also played on a number of men's championship teams in the Windsor Mens' Fast Pitch League after the demise of the West Hartford League. Besides being a superb catcher with a cannon for an arm, Rico was a long ball hitter and sported a .350 lifetime batting average.

He was voted MVP of the 1977 Canton Fast Pitch Tournament which featured all of the top Fast Pitch teams in the state.

He drove in the winning run in the final game of the 1981 state tourney to secure the State Championship for Peter Pan Café.

When teams had the opportunity to add two additional players to their roster to go to the New England Regional Tournament, Rico was a frequent choice as he played in regional tournaments with Reed Construction and Fordham Distributors.

Rico should have been nicknamed “Yogi” as he was the ultimate bad ball hitter of Connecticut fast pitch softball. He never met a pitch he didn't like and wouldn't hesitate to attack voraciously and usually successfully.

He was also well-known for his eclectic wardrobe choices. He often arrived at games in a “Joe Jackson style” – “shoeless!” Most of the time he wore his uniforms in a 1950's Ted Kluszewski style – sleeveless.

Rico was a dangerous hitter; a solid fielder; a serious ball player dedicated to the game; a fun-loving easy-going friend to teammates and opponents alike; and above all, always a gentleman.

He makes his home in West Hartford.



Richard Rotante

For two decades Richard Rotante contributed to the success of several of the top tier teams playing out of Fairfield and West Chester counties.

He launched his career in 1981 with a two year stint with the Rebels of Norwalk. He then moved on to Zircon from Stamford in 1983 before crossing the state line to play with the Mount Vernon Hawks from 1985 to 1989.

Richard then came back to Connecticut to spend two years with T's Construction from Norwalk before joining Sonny's out of Westport for three seasons (1990-1992).

1993 saw him hook up with Midas Touch/ ACR/Worth from Fairfield. He played with them for four seasons before joining Latella's out of New Haven in 1997.

Returning to Midas Touch/ CT Sportsplex/Worth in 1998 Richard completed his Hall of Fame career with Over 35 Flyjuice from Westport in 2001.

With these teams he played in over fifteen Connecticut State Tournaments (1983-1998), three Class A New England Regional tourneys (1990-1992) and four Major National Tournaments.

Richard also helped Zircon, Sonny's, T's, Club 14 & Pasiak Trucking annex over twenty Class A City Championships.

Versatile defensively playing in the outfield, first base, second base, middle infield and catcher, he maintained a lifetime batting average north of .625 while displaying power with over 1200 home runs and 2000 plus rbi's. He won multiple home run hitting contests.

Richard served as the girls' varsity softball coach at Westhill High School in Stamford from 1996 to 2001, leading them to several Stamford and FCIAC titles.

He also was a coach with Check King/Worth (Class A) 2001-2004, Hard Hat / Latella's (50 Major) 2021 and Beloli / KL & R / RDD (Class A/B) 2022 to present.

Richard makes his home in Stamford.



William “Willy” Schmoegner

Willy launched his Hall of Fame worthy umpiring career in 1988, working slow pitch recreational leagues throughout eastern Connecticut.

His quality of work allowed him to quickly move up to officiating in the Class D New England Regionals with Hank Koritkoski as Umpire in Chief.

1991 saw Willy join the fast pitch ranks with the Eastern Board of Approved ASA Umpires, Carl Pignone assignor.

He umpired CIAC middle school, JV and varsity games, eventually earning numerous QVCC,

ECC and Shoreline Conference Championships assignments, including being behind the plate in conference tournament finals.

His strong work ethic saw him advance to doing CIAC State Tournament games. He did games in all classes, all rounds from first round to finals, again with many behind the plate assignments.

Willy also umpired summer and travel leagues in Connecticut as well as Rhode Island and Massachusetts.

In 1997 he began umpiring NCAA games in all Divisions (I, II and III). He worked the following conferences (Big East, Ivy, NEC, MAAC, America East, Patriot, A10, NE10, CACC, ECC, Little East, NEWMAC, NESCAC, CCC, GNAC).

He did numerous DIII Conference Championships, again with several plate assignments in all rounds.

In 2014 Willy began doing Division III post season tournaments including many regional and one super regional. He served as crew chief for a regional at Babson College in Massachusetts.

Willy makes his home in East Lyme.



Fran Schuelke

Fran launched her 34 year softball career in the late 70's. Through those three plus decades she achieved success at both the women's and Co-ed levels with some of the top teams in Fairfield County and Milford.

She was an integral part of numerous City Championship squads. On the Co-ed level: Westport Grey & Graham 1996-1998; K-Star-Danbury 2010 and Slaterock-Westport 1998-2014. On the women's level: Ball Busters Wilton 2001-2003, Rosati Landscaping Norwalk 2002-2008 and Oracle Milford 2010-2014.

However there was success beyond local play. Her time with Slaterock produced five Class D Co-ed State Championships (2004, 2005, 2008, 2011, 2012) plus a runner up finish in 2010. She also played in three New England Regional Tournaments with Slaterock and was an integral part of the 2009 team that finished third in the Class D Co-ed National Tournament in Georgia.

Playing third base and pitching for her women's teams, first base for her Co-ed teams and also dabbling in pitching in the Fast Pitch game, Fran maintained a +.600 lifetime batting average.

She earned multiple MVP awards in Co-ed and Women's Tournaments in both Class C and Class D and a few local and State Tournament MVP's and All Tournament Teams. And she was the first woman to hit a ball over the fence at the Calf Pasture fields in Norwalk in 2006.

Fran lent her talents to more than playing softball. From 2014 to 2017 she served as a base coach with her son's Milford Little League baseball team. And that son currently plays for the same team that she once played for and she is very proud of his accomplishments.

In addition to her on the field accomplishments, testimonials from various teammates and friends spoke of the type of person she is. Paraphrasing from one of those testimonials, "Her dedication to her team and respect for her opponents made her not only a remarkable player but also a treasured teammate. Fran consistently brought out the best in those around her. Fran's impact on the game and those who have played alongside her is undeniable."

Fran is also somewhat of a Renaissance woman as, in addition to her softball skills, she is an accomplished chef, baker and bowler.

She expressed gratitude to her husband Dwayne, whom she met on a softball field, for choosing to stay home with the kids while she continued to play the game that she loved. She has taken excellent care of her family, with whom she lives in Milford, and has sacrificed much of herself to ensure that their needs are being met.

Jeffrey Slater



For 45 years (and still going) Jeffrey Slater earned his Hall of Fame induction for managing and coaching Women's and Co-ed softball teams to numerous championships, both on the local and state level.

He launched his career in 1980 at the helm of the Estate Liquidators Women's combine out of Westport. 1981-1982 saw Jeffrey guide the Anne Marie Figure Forum Women's team before taking over the leadership of D.J. Hair Salon where he began racking up managerial championships with a pair of Westport Women's League crowns in 1983 and 1985.

In 1988 he moved over to the Co-ed game when he took over the guidance of O'Manel's Restaurant from Westport. He stayed there until 1994 before he struck gold when he became the head coach for Slaterock in 1995.

That Slaterock team captured an amazing eighteen consecutive Westport Co-ed League championships from 1995 thru 2012. They won the Norwalk Co-ed League crown in 2013 before adding eleven more Westport Co-ed titles (2014-2024).

In 2003 Slaterock made their first Connecticut Co-ed State Tournament appearance before proceeding to annex three State Championship (2004, 2005, 2012) plus a runner-up finish in 2010.

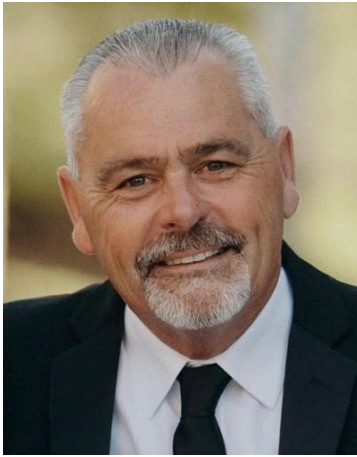
2009 saw them traveling to Cummings, GA for the Co-ed National Championship Tournament where they achieved an impressive third place finish.

All told, Jeffrey has led teams he has managed and coached to a total of 35 championships....and counting.

Also, from 2008 until 2012 he served as a main assistant to Tournament Director Rich McDonald in the State Co-ed tourneys held in Norwalk from.

David Smith

David Smith began his Slow Pitch softball career with Cip's Home Plate in 1986. He experienced immediate success as he was a part of the team's runners-up finish in the Connecticut State Tournament.

1987 saw him begin a nine year stint with Bender Plumbing. In 1988, Bender's won a New England Qualifier and finished seventh in the Class A National Championship Tournament in Savannah, GA.

1991 was another successful year as Bender's annexed the Class A State title, the New England Regional, held in Rhode Island, Class A crown and finished fifth in the National Tournament held in Jacksonville, FL.

In 1996 David moved on to Family Financial. His five years with them was highlighted by a second place finish in the 1998 Class B Nationals held in Las Cruces, NM.

David moved up to Senior play in 2004 with the Bender Senior team. That first year with them saw a trip to Auburn, AL where they placed third in the Over 40 Nationals.

2007 saw David change allegiance to Graybar Electric. His decade long tenure with them was highlighted by their capturing their league's A Division title four consecutive years before he hung up his spikes after the 2016 season.

A first baseman for most of his career, plus some outfield, David maintained a lifetime batting average of around .525 while hitting over 600 home runs.

He earned a total of eight National Tournament All American team honors: three 1st team, two 2nd team, one 3rd team and a pair of honorable mentions.

In addition to his on the field exploits, David was heavily involved with Special Olympics in Connecticut during his playing career, capped off with the 1995 World Games in New Haven.

David makes his home in Wallingford.



Val Suto

As a three-sport varsity athlete at Nottingham High School, Val excelled in athletics and leadership. During her high school softball career, Val was chosen as the team's MVP 3 out of her 4 years and now ranks 4th in Nottingham history for batting average (.416) and 3rd in at bats (305), runs scored (103), hits (127), and stolen bases (72).

In her final year as a Northstar, Val played a crucial role in leading the softball team to the NJ Group III State Tournament final, the program's furthest run in 20 years, and capped off her career

by being nominated to play in the Super 36 All-Star game, held at the Seton Hall University softball field, where she would continue her collegiate career.

Val played club softball for The Jersey Nightmare, where she secured her scholarship to play for Seton Hall. In 2015 the Pirates advanced to the Big East Softball Championship. Val finished her career in the record books as top 20 for career games played, runs scored, and batting average, and 4th in career for stolen bases with 60. She ranks 3rd in Seton Hall Softball history for hits in a single season with 64, and 2nd in stolen bases in a single season with 30. That same season, Val was named the 2016 Big East Female Scholar Athlete of the Year.

In her rookie season as a Stratford Brakette, Val led the team in stolen bases and batting average, earning her the title of Batting Queen with a .465 average, and again in 2016 with a .530 average, only the 4th time in team history a player topped the .500 mark. During her seven seasons for the Brakettes, she continued to put up batting average numbers typical of an outstanding leadoff hitter and established herself as one of the top outfielders in Brakette history. Val now ranks 8th in program history in career runs with 323 and is among the leaders in stolen bases with 112.

Val now lives in Monroe, CT where she works as a Graphic Designer and Fine Artist.



Neil Tordanato

Neil began his 31 year softball journey in 1977 with Kenwood Auto out of Berlin.

He then moved south to Bridgeport for a six year stint with Keystone/ Panama Inn (1978-1983) during which time they captured the Bridgeport Sunday League championship five times.

In 1984 Neil contributed his talents to the Stonybrook Jaws out of Stratford for two seasons before playing for Bridgeport's Arno Construction in 1986.

The next 21 years turned out to be the most successful for Neil beyond the local level. From 1987 until 1993 he was part of the Waterbury Transmission/Champs combine. They were Waterbury League champions twice, Naugatuck League titlists three times while winning numerous ASA charity tournaments throughout New England.

Neil finished his career with Bender Plumbing/ CT Sportsplex from North Branford (1994-2007). That team went to thirteen ASA Men's Masters 40/45/50 Division Nationals, finishing second once in the Over 40 and third once in the Over 45 Division. Between Waterbury Transmission and Bender's, Neil played in three State Tournaments and three Class B Nationals as well as a New England Regional with Bender's.

Primarily a shortstop and sometimes third baseman, he finished his career with a batting average of +.575 while hitting over 850 home runs.

He earned All American First Team and Second Team Honors in the Over 40 Nationals and First Team Honors in the Over 45 Division Nationals.

Fellow Hall of Famer Joe Czarnecki said of Neil, "Neil was an exceptional player and teammate. His excellent knowledge of the game and competitiveness made him one of the top players in Connecticut and New England. His offense and defensive prowess was outstanding. He made the tough defensive plays and on offense, he hit for a high average and power when needed. Neil was a very tough out and a game changer while playing against the top competition from throughout New England and other areas. Whether his team won or lost, he displayed genuine sportsmanship to his opponents and officials."

Off the playing field, Neil graciously donated many hours working the Connecticut Special Olympics, umpiring and helping out as needed.

Neil and his wife of 47 years, Janice, make their home in Hamden. They have a daughter, Andrea, who resides in Boston with their son-in-law Kyle and their two grandsons, PJ and Jordan.



Michael “Vio” Violano

Mike had a 40 year career, pitching for some of the top teams in New Haven County.

Vio’s Sports Plus, Vio’s Dawgpound, Checkking, Palmieri’s, Sobe Sports, Century 21/ Make-A-Wish, North Haven Funeral Home, Sweitzer’s Waste Removal/ JRoos/ Vio’s, Spacecraft, Hard Hat Cafe, Steve’s Sports, Silver Bullets Softball, JJM Properties and East Coast Security all benefitted from Mike’s pitching skills.

With Mike on the mound, East Coast Security won the Connecticut Class C State Tournament in both 1999 and 2001 and finished runners up in 2000. He also contributed to a 2017 State Championship for JJM Properties.

In 2014 Mike and his JJM Properties teammates captured the 50 and Older National Championship. 2017 saw Mike pitch Hard Hat Cafe/ Latellas/ Vio Sports to the 55 and Older National title.

He was also part of numerous Monday Night Wood Bat league championships as well as several Wednesday Night Single Wall League titles with Vio’s Sports and Spacecraft.

Mike was a career .650 hitter. He was not known for the long ball but was able to utilize the entire field to his advantage. Pitchingwise his forte was a knuckleball and a curve. He had the distinction of striking out the side in a State Tournament game. In a game where a strikeout was a rarity, Mike racked up over 200 of them.

Off the field Mike was a beloved hockey coach who shared his wisdom and teaching acumen with the players at West Haven, North Haven and Notre Dame (WH) High Schools.

Known for his generosity, Mike always showed his love for the game of softball by helping when needed, whether it was supplying uniforms, paying for team sponsorship and league fee or trophies.

Although his life was cut short in October 2024, his love for the game will continue with a memorial tournament in his name.

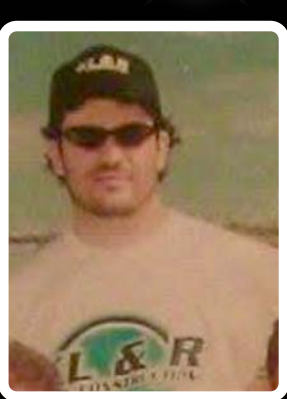

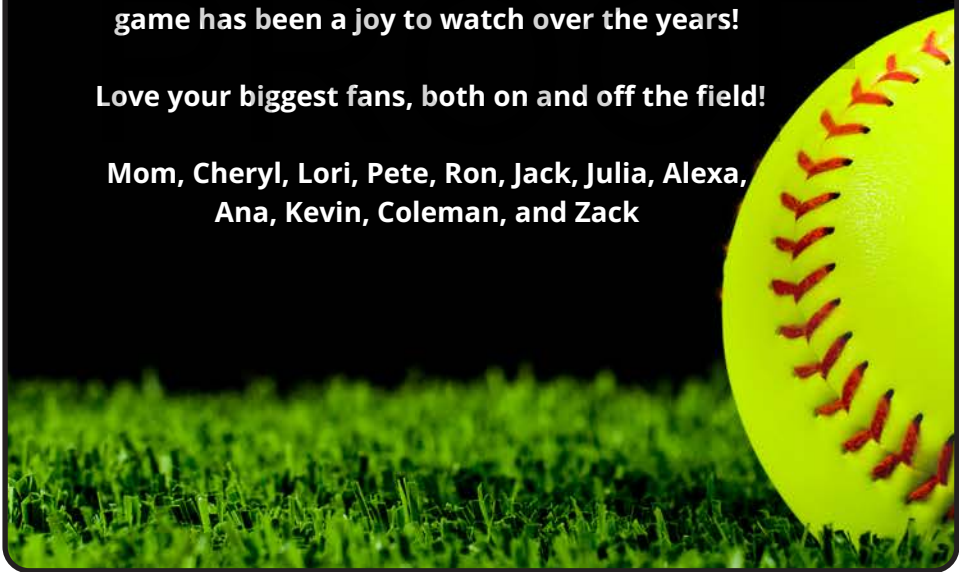
