

In August 2006, the sport of softball in Connecticut became unified in honoring its past with the merging of its fast pitch and slow pitch Halls of Fame. Prior to this merger, the two entities had each separately elected and inducted members to their respective Halls of Fame. That changed with the formation of one combined Hall of Fame to be known as the Connecticut ASA Hall of Fame.

USA Softball of Connecticut commissioner Hank Koritkoski oversees the umbrella organization with the fast pitch and slow pitch committees continuing to function as separate groups in selecting candidates for the USA Softball of Connecticut Hall of Fame.

USA Softball of Connecticut stages an annual Hall of Fame dinner to formally induct its new members.

The Fast Pitch Hall of Fame was established in 1971, with the Slow Pitch Hall starting in 1985. Committees to select Hall of Famers meet frequently and accept nominations for new candidates. To be eligible for consideration, a player must be retired for 5 years or, if the player is over 50 years of age, the 5 year waiting period is waived.

For nominees, applications should be submitted to the Hall of Fame committee chairs by April 1 each year. Any individual who had an outstanding softball career in Connecticut is eligible, with emphasis on state, regional and national tournament play as one of the important criteria for Hall of Fame consideration. Applications are available on our state website.

In 2017 Connecticut ASA re-branded to USA Softball of Connecticut and officially opened its physical Hall of Fame display which is located at Erin's Gym in Stratford.

Chuck Bradley

A 25 year career that included over 20 league championships, five Connecticut state champion titles, two New England Regional champion titles and six National Tournament appearances. That pretty much tells you all you need to know about Chuck Bradley's outstanding modified softball pitching career.

Chuck began his quarter century journey on the mound in 1973 with AC Transmission out of Watertown.

After spending two years with the AC combine, Bradley moved on to Town & Country/ Allyns Cleaners from Waterbury/ Watertown where his

team was dominant at the local level, winning 18+ league titles. He hurled for them for ten years and made the first of his four National Modified Tournament appearances with them in 1980 in Tennessee and 1981 in Maine, finishing third. Following that, he pitched for them in the Nationals in New York and in the National Invitation Tournament in Miami.

In 1981 Bradley was drafted by Mario's Barbershop to pitch in the Nationals in Georgia.

From 1986-1989 Chuck pitched for the American Sports World squad from Waterbury. That team was state runner-up in 1987 and state champions in 1988. He then went to the National Tournament in Decatur, Alabama.

1989 saw Bradley move on to Caruso's Remodeling in Prospect for one year in which his team won the league title. He was also drafted to pitch for various teams in state and local tournaments.

Bradley hung up his spikes in 1998. He recorded a lifetime 82% winning percentage and totalled 84 victories in Connecticut State Tournament play.

On a personal level, Chuck earned the Waterbury Modified League MVP Award in 1977 and 1981. He was also awarded the Waterbury Brass City League MVP in 1982.

One of the most dominant modified pitchers in the Waterbury area for almost three decades, Chuck now makes his home in Oakville with his wife Angie of 54 years..



Don Catterson

Don is being honored with the Joseph T. Barber Distinguished Service Award for an umpiring career that has spanned the better part of 60 years.

He is a member of the National Indicator Fraternity. He has served in many roles in the Bridgeport/ Stratford Umpires association: President/ Vice President/ Assigner.

Don has held offices with ASA/ USA softball including Deputy UIC for the state and clinician. He has also served as Tournament UIC for State, Regional and Sectional championships, both Slow Pitch and Fast Pitch.

Don assigned the Brakettes for over 40 years and he umpired at the college level for over 25 years.



Mike Corrado

Mike started his twenty year fast pitch softball journey in 1960 when he began play in the Hartford Insurance and the East Hartford Leagues.

1961 saw Mike get together with a group of high school friends, playing under the banner of Auggie and Ray's in the East Hartford League. He not only played but also coached that team for three years, tasting early success at the managerial level as that squad finished first in 1962 and 1963.

Mike joined the East Hartford Dovelettes for the 1964 and 1965 seasons, playing against some of the best teams in Connecticut and Massachusetts, including the Raybestos Cardinals and the King

and His Court, and winning the Coast Guard Tournament.

After playing with Travelers Insurance in 1966 in the Insurance League, another first place finish, Mike did not play in 1967 as he was serving active training with the Army Reserves.

Returning to the field in 1968, Mike spent the next seven years in the West Hartford League, coaching in four of those years.

Mike spent the 1975 season with Conn's Kings before playing with Brother Bones in 1976 and 1977.

That 1977 season lay the foundation for the defining moments of Mike's career. He took over as coach, recruited several new players including veteran Bobby Westbrook, and future CT Fastpitch HOFers Dean Lang and Billy Campbell and orchestrated a sponsorship with Cypress Arms Restaurant.


Under the Cypress Arms banner, in addition to winning the West Hartford League twice, the team captured the Connecticut Class A Fast Pitch Championship three straight years (1978, 1979 and 1980). They also played in the New England Regionals each of those years.

During that three year championship run, Cypress Arms lost only one State Tournament game.

Hall of Famer Scott Phelps said of Mike that "He was one of the most talented hitters on the Brother Bones and Cypress Arms ball clubs. As the team manager, Mike sacrificed many at bats to help create the team unity to win over the long haul. His unselfishness was the key to creating strong team unity."

Mike was a pretty good hitter, carrying a career batting average of .345 while playing the outfield and first base.

He now makes Old Saybrook his home.



Tom DeBernardo

Tom DeBernardo's long and successful career included competition at the highest level of Industrial softball: Major. In addition, he competed in State A and B classifications and the countless state tournaments those classifications offered.

A quiet player that carried a big stick. Known by all as a tremendous clutch hitter, Tom also was a feared home run hitter who had the added ability of hitting to all fields. Defensively, he was the premier multi-task player who could pitch, play first base and all four outfield positions with ease – oftentimes during the same game.

Tom played with the legendary Stonybrook Jaws from Stratford, and was an integral part of the numerous Major Industrial Championships won by Sikorsky Aircraft in the 1990's and early 2000's. His intensity matched or exceeded his immense talent, and it was that type of silent leadership that spoke so loudly whether you played with him or against him.

Tom collected a long list of individual awards he earned from the long, successful run of Sikorsky Aircraft, which include Industrial National Championship MVP awards in 1992, 1993 and a Co-MVP IN 2000, batting .889. Tom also made first team All American as an outfielder in 1997 thru 1999, as well as in 2001, 2003, 2004 and 2005.

Tom now resides in Stratford with his wife, Denise, and his children, Daniela, Adriana and Tommy.



Lisa Dennis

Versatility describes Lisa Dennis' softball biography.

Not too many Hall of Famers excelled at both the Fast and Slow Pitch versions of the game. Lisa did.

She began to make a name for herself in the sports world by being selected as the 1972 Sterling House Girl athlete of the year, playing softball and basketball.

She played for Bunnell High School in 1974 and 1975, making all league both years. She also was a member of the Blazers, helping them win a State Championship in 1975.

Rather than play high school ball her 1976 senior year, Lisa opted to join the Brakettes who won the Women's Major National title with Lisa

making 2nd team All-American in right field.

She received a softball scholarship to Southern Illinois University where she started all four years.

Lisa rejoined the Brakettes in 1977, contributing to another National Championship, before playing with the Carbondale (Illinois) Flyers in 1978. She finished off the fast pitch portion of her career with two more seasons with the Blazers.

From 1980 to 1985 Lisa played with the Paradise Casuals and the Windmill (Stratford) and Ray's Grill and R Place (Bridgeport). She joined Healey's (Derby) in 1986, getting her first taste of slow pitch State Tournament play for the next four years.

In the early 90's, Lisa joined Hall of Famer Liz Alling's squad. She played with P Casa, Town & Country and Palmieri's, winning a league championship in 1990 and State and Regional titles with Palmieri's in 1991.

For the remainder of the 90's and through the 2000's, Lisa played with Danny O's, Thirsty Turtle, Top Side and King's Court. While a member of the Danny O's team they won the 1998 Class C State title, finished second in the Regionals and advanced to the Nationals in Panama City, FL. She was also part of four Milford Recreation championship squads.

Lisa concluded her 40 year slow pitch softball career with the Kings Court Jesters and Sandicane/Wines and More.


Batting near the top of the order year in and year out, Lisa was a .500 hitter while patrolling either left or left centerfield or pitching.

In addition to playing the game, Lisa also coached the Bunnell JV softball team in 1982 and later lent her talents in the development of young softball players in the PAL Stratford Girls Fast Pitch League from 2001 until 2008.

Lisa was inducted into the Bunnell High School Hall of Fame in 1994.

She now lives in Milford.

Mike Homkovics



Mike began his softball career in 1979 with the long time Valley power Kasden Fuel. He helped them capture the Valley Major League, Valley Independent League A Division and Valley ASA Qualifier titles each of his five years (1979-1983) with them.

In 1982 they also won the Connecticut ASA Class A Central Sectional and the Green Mountain Open (Burlington, VT) championships.

Mike also played one season (1981) with Four Seasons Catering out of Naugatuck and was part of their Naugatuck Valley League title winning squad.

1986 saw Mike join Sikorsky Aircraft. For the next twelve years he was an integral part of seven Major Industrial Division National Championships. Sikorsky won the title in 1987, 1990 and 1996 as well as four straight (1992-1995). They had a pair of runners-up finishes in 1985 and 1988 and captured a National Industrial Qualifier in 1996.

Mike also was a part of the Keystone Construction squad that played in the Elite B League in the mid 90's before hanging up his spikes in 1996 after an 18 year career. Batting in the third spot throughout his career, he boasted a .625 lifetime batting average while either patrolling a middle outfield position or manning either shortstop or second base.

In the Major Industrial National Tournaments Mike hammered 25 home runs while driving in 175 and scoring 125.

While being a big part of Sikorsky success, Mike also racked up several individual accolades.

He was MVP of the 1981 State Classic League All Star Game and he earned the Unsung Hero Award for the 1991 MAC Bolla Invitational Tournament in Peabody, MA.

Mike has four All American team selections to his credit. He made 1st Team in the 1992 and 1993 Major Industrial Tournaments and 2nd Team in 1994 and 1996. He also donned the blue and served as an ASA umpire.

Mike currently makes Shelton his home.

Joy Kisling



Softball junkie. That phrase is an unusual way to lead off a newly selected Hall of Famer's bio but the testimonials that led to Joy's selection say nothing else but.

Her high school didn't have girls' sports but Joy soon found out on her own that she was a pretty good softball player, never missing a chance to play. She never had a glove of her own (borrowed one from her brothers) until her husband Rick gave her one for Christmas 1964 which she still uses to this day.

In 1978, Joy signed daughter Kris up for girl's tee ball in the boy's baseball league in town. The coach recruited Joy as an assistant and that was the beginning of the rest of her "softball career".

A group, including Joy, got together in 1979 and

formed the Bethel Softball Association (BSA) for the girls in town. Joy has held every position in BSA, finally becoming the president for the second time in 2000, a position she still holds.

Joy also coached in the BSA until 2002 and, from 1988 to 2008, in the Danbury ASA Women's League.

She played pick up softball before joining a team in the Bethel Over 30 Women's League in 1999 at the age of 57. Being nervous, she asked her daughter what she thought, Kris said "Go for it Mom". Joy did and she and her daughter played together for 16 years.

She played first base and had the most fun when girls she had coached as 10 or 11 year olds got to first base and asked "Mrs. K., do you mind if I ask you how old you are?"

She also played in the Senior Softball League, winning several tournament medals including a Gold won on Long Island in 2005.

Joy and her teams competed in ASA State and Regional tournaments in 1983, 1984, 1985, 1992, 1993 and 1994. BSA teams went to the AASA Nationals in 1984 in Salt Lake City, UT and 1993 in Rockford, IL. Joy was an assistant coach with the 1993 squad.

She was a player/ coach for 22 years in the Danbury Women's ASA League before hanging up her spikes in 2008.

Joy has a field named after her and also received the Danbury Sports Award in 2011.

She enjoyed the game her entire life and passed along that enjoyment to the girls and women that played for her and with her.

Joy still resides in Bethel, her lifelong "wonderful" home town.



Phil Lampron

Phil had an outstanding pitching career that spanned over twenty years.

He debuted in the Prospect Men's League in 1971, playing in that league his entire career and being part of six championship squads.

Phil hooked up with Domar's Freaks (Waterbury) and played with them until 1978.

He then joined Domar's Warriors (Waterbury) in 1979 which is where he had his first taste of success beyond the local level when the 1983 team qualified for the Modified Nationals in Austin, MN.

1984 proved to be a banner year for Phil when he played for Skider's Gym out of Thomaston. Skider's captured the Connecticut State Modified Championship which earned them a trip to Morristown, TN for the Modified Nationals where they finished fifth in the country. He was also the team's Co-MVP with a 41-6 pitching record for the season.

Callahan's Warriors (Waterbury) enjoyed Phil's pitching proficiency for the next four years (1985-1988). There he was part of two more State Championship teams (1986 and 1988). Both of those years the Warriors made it to the Nationals (1986 in Spokane, WA and 1988 in Marietta, GA). The 1986 team finished ninth.

Phil appeared in ten consecutive ASA State Tournaments in which he posted an overall 18-4 pitching record. His record on the National stage was 4-2.

In addition to playing in the Prospect League he also hurled in the Wolcott, Thomaston, Southbury, Uniroyal and Puerto Rican (Waterbury) Men's Leagues.

Phil's overall record on the mound was a great 652-145 including a 122-50 ledger for all tournament play including one no hitter.

Other high profile tournaments his team won were the Danielson Tournament, both 1982 and 1983 (Warriors) and the Worcester Tournament in 1984 (Skider's). Individual awards won by Phil were the 1982 Danielson Tournament MVP, the 1984 Puerto Rico Friendship Tournament MVP and a Warrior Gold Glove. He also coached in the Prospect Women's Softball League from 1982 to 1988.

Phil now resides in Kodiak, Alaska.



Luis Lopez

Luis Lopez came to the United States from his native Puerto Rico in 1931.

After he and his family settled in Bridgeport, Luis started playing pickup softball on a makeshift diamond in Father Panik Village in 1932. This started an over eight decade run of playing, coaching, managing and sponsoring softball.

Luis named a team after his home town in Puerto Rico, Polluello's, and they played in the Borinquen Modified League in Bridgeport for many years. He also had teams that played in the state wide Housatonic League and also played in the Twilight Modified League.

His teams won three Connecticut State Modified championships (2004, 2006 and 2008) as well as nine Borinquen League, two Twilight League and several Housatonic League titles.

In 2015 the City of Bridgeport gave Luis the key to the city and declared one day Luis Lopez day. After his retirement from softball in 2015, Diamond 11 at Seaside Park was named Luis Lopez Field.

He was also inducted into the Borinquen Softball League Hall of Fame.

Luis passed away in August 2015.



Brian McGillicuddy

After graduating from Fairfield Prep in 1981, where he was a three sport star (football, basketball and baseball), Brian moved on to play football at the University of Connecticut where he became the second all time career leader in receptions.

During the spring of his senior year he got a taste of competitive softball and soon launched a 16 year softball career with 14 of those years being with one of the state's elite combines, Midas Touch Jewelers.

After joining the Jewelers in 1985, Brian enjoyed his first taste of success beyond the local level when Midas captured the ASA Class A State Tournament championship in 1987 and then finished second in the New England Regionals.

1991 saw Midas capture a Class A Regional Qualifier which sent them on to the National Tournament where they placed third with Brian's personal highlight being a 4 for 4 game with all four being home runs good for eleven rbi's.

That third place finish required them to move up to the Major Division but that didn't stop the team's success at the National level as they placed in the top fifteen in both 1992 and 1993 before they earned a fourth place finish in 1994.

All told, Brian played in seven State Tournaments and seven Nationals (three Class A and four Major Division) before winding up his time with Midas Touch.

Brian finished up his star studded career playing for Barristers from 1996 until 2000.

He was part of 14 league championship teams, won over 1750 games and over forty tournaments. Primarily a center fielder in a three man outfield, Brian also filled in at shortstop and second base. He carried a career batting average better than .600 and belted over 400 home runs.

Brian won several tournament MVP's while earning numerous all tournament team mentions. He made an All American team in the Major Division while batting .750 in the National Tournament.

In his initial season with Barristers (1996), Brian went 61 for 67 for an amazing .910 batting average.

Brian resides in Trumbull with his wife Celeste and four children: Madison, Danielle, Max and Callie.



Steve McGillicuddy

Steve began his 28 year softball career in 1975 at the local league level. Bozym Buick was his first stop (1975-1978) followed by Black Rock Church (1977-79), Connecticut Merchants (1978-79) and Renzulli (1978-88).

Then, in 1980, Steve made quite a career move when he joined Midas Touch Jewelers and masterminded their conversion from a good local team to a combine that was competitive on the national stage.

Steve's brother Brian, a fellow 2020 Hall of Fame inductee, penned a testimonial to what Steve meant to the success of Midas Touch. The following is that testimonial.

When Steve began playing for Midas Touch they were a local team trying to win a league title

to get into the State Tournament. He took on the responsibility of scheduling and running the team, coordinating leagues, tournaments and lineups while playing the infield and batting leadoff. Over the next few years, as Midas Touch was elevated to playing ASA Major, the responsibilities became greater and the talent level needed to be upgraded.

Steve accepted the challenge and became the full time manager, playing sparingly thereafter. It was a huge sacrifice that he was willing to make to allow Midas to continue towards being a national contender. He spent countless hours building the personnel, coordinating the tournaments, weekly travel, flights, hotels, etc.

Over the next few years Midas became a state and regional power. His hard work, dedication took Midas to the national stage. He coordinated a bat sponsorship from TPS, brought in players, merged teams and sponsors. In the early to mid 90's Midas was traveling around the country every weekend playing at the top level of the sport. He had brought Midas to the pinnacle of softball over a very short period of time while creating a big family with many team members still being best friends today.

Listing the fruits of his labor: 18 league championships, 10 ASA State Tournaments with a win in the 1987 A States; a second place in the 1987 Regionals and a championship in the 1991 Regionals; 7 trips to the Nationals (3 A and 4 Major) including a third place finish in the 1992 A's and a fourth place finish in the 1994 Majors.

After Midas Touch Steve concluded his career with Barristers (1996-2000) before finishing up with Trutt's Landscaping (2000-2002).

He now lives in Fairfield.



Gerry Mucci

While Gerry not only had an outstanding ten year fast pitch softball career as a player, he also served as a mentor to many young people, not only for softball but also for real life.

As a player Gerry compiled a sparkling .405 lifetime batting average while playing second and third base and the outfield. He spent six years with Iwaniki Construction, two years with JD Sports and two years with Tower Olshan, playing in the Housatonic and New Britain Fast Pitch Leagues.

He also had a two year stint with Los Puelos in the Spanish Modified League.

Gerry took part in eight State Tournaments, a Regional Tournament in Boston, MA and was part of several Housatonic League championship squads before retiring in 1984.

As a mentor he was selected in 1983 by the Southeastern Fairfield County Chapter of the Red Cross for outstanding volunteer service for water safety and small craft. Gerry was an adaptive physical education teacher for the town of Stratford for 32 years and earned the 1992 Stratford Teacher of the Year Award.

He was the Stratford High School head softball coach for ten years, served as an assistant coach for fifteen years and was inducted into the Stratford High School Athletic Hall of Fame as a coach in 2008.

He presented numerous softball clinics for the Stratford PAL girls softball. Gerry was inducted into the Connecticut High School Coaches Association Hall of Fame for (Special Olympics) Unified Sports in 2001. He also was a National Unified Sports Coach of the Year runner up and received the Connecticut Special Olympics Hero award for outstanding contributions to Special Olympics.

Gerry said he loved playing fast pitch softball and was fortunate to play against and with some outstanding athletes including several Hall of Famers. And his non playing activities showed he enjoyed sharing his passion for the game.

He still lives in his long time home town of Stratford with his wife Marilyn to whom he's been married for 50 years. They have three children and six grandchildren.



Ed Rado

Ed's umpiring career began in 1990 working the Waterbury Modified League. From there it quickly expanded to the many area men's modified leagues and then on to the CT ASA woman's JO program, the CIAC, the NCAA and the National Professional Fast Pitch League.

During his 21 year career he worked numerous Men's Modified CT State Tournaments and New England Regional Tournaments.


In the women's game, Ed umpired for 11 Division I NCAA Conferences including the SEC, ACC, Big Ten and Big East; as well as various DII and DIII conferences.

Ed's postseason resume includes 15 CT CIAC Finals and numerous NCAA championship events including 14 consecutive Division I conference championships (1998-2011), 9 consecutive NCAA Division I regionals (2003-2011) and 6 consecutive NCAA Super regionals (2006-2011).

He has officiated at two ASA/USA National Championships, the 2001 Women's 23 and under and the 2002 Women's Major Fast Pitch. Ed also worked the Olympic Team tour twice; in 2000 when they played the Women's Professional League All Stars and in 2004 when they matched up with the Stratford Brakettes.

In 2013 Ed was inducted into the CT Scholastic and Collegiate Softball Hall of Fame.

Ed is the father of two boys (Steven and Nick) and currently resides in Wolcott, CT with his wife Karen. Ed would like to recognize and thank Karen for the amazing support that allowed him to follow his passion and maintain two careers while they were raising their family together.



Rory (Roy) Richardson

For thirty plus years (1981-2012) Roy Richardson flashed both speed and power in contributing to multiple championships and honors for some of Connecticut's elite teams.

After he launched his career in 1981 with Zircon (Class A) out of Stamford, Roy hooked up with the legendary Sonny's squad out of Westport in 1984.

While with Sonny's, Roy contributed to four Class A State Championships (1986, 1988, 1989, 1990), a National Qualifier title in Rhode Island in 1987 as well as seven consecutive Westport League and Rowayton Sunday Morning League crowns (1984-1990).

1992 saw Roy begin a five year tenure with New Haven's CheckKing where he added two more State Championships (Class B 1992, 1993) to his resume.

4 Corners was Roy's next and final destination. He spent a lengthy time there (1997-2012) during which time the team captured four consecutive Over 35 State Championships (2001-2004).

Roy also played with the Mount Vernon Hawks (1985-1988), the Class A Rockets from Stamford (1994-1996) and spent one season (1994) with Super Major Ritch's-Superior.


State Tournament appearances were an annual happening for 31 straight years (1980-2010) for Roy. He also played in six Class A Regional Tournaments and nineteen National Tourneys (3 Major, 6 Class A, 4 Class B and 6 Over 35).

Finishing with a career batting average in excess of .750 while hammering over 3000 extra base hits including 1000 doubles and 2000 home runs and collecting 5000 plus rbi's, Roy patrolled the outfield and also played the middle infield positions of shortstop and second base defensively.

He was part of over twenty Class A City Championships with Rose Cleaners, Club 14 and Zircon and nine Connecticut Classic League titlists. He racked up numerous personal honors including All Black World for the Men's World Series champions CJ's Gray's in 1999 .

Born to Robert and Reverend Mandie Richardson, Roy was raised in Stamford and now resides in Stratford.

Jack Sirotnik



Jack set the stage for his Hall of Fame worthy Fast Pitch softball career by playing baseball for four years at Milford High School.

After high school he joined the Sterling House Colts All Stars who won the prestigious Bridgeport Senior City League championship and the New England Sectional crown in 1970. He played collegiate ball at Eastern Connecticut State University.

In 1973 Jack joined Dorber Graphics and spent his entire career with them until his retirement in 1985.

During that time span, Dorber made ten trips to the Fast Pitch Mens Major State Tournament. They ended up winning the tournament championship five times (1977, 1979, 1980, 1982 and 1985).

In each of those title winning years they participated in the New England Regionals. Fellow Hall of Famer Bob Domkowski described Jack as the Dorber Graphics team spark-plug.

In addition to carrying a lifetime .317 batting average he annually held the number one or two team leadership position in runs-scored, on-base percentage (lifetime .475), walks and stolen bases, He had superior base running speed and his exceptional sliding skills bewildered many a defensive infield player.

Jack possessed a steady glove, had exceptional range, an accurate arm, turned two well and was a defensive asset mainly playing second base but was equally adept when playing shortstop and patrolling centerfield.

He made first team All Housatonic Fast Pitch League twice and second team four times.

There were several charitable events in which Dorber Graphics played with Jack managing the team's participation in the annual Jim French Memorial Tournament at Washington Park in Groton, CT. which funded the annual Jim French Scholarship Fund. Jack now resides in Milford.



Rich Skau

Rich began his softball career in 1981, playing for Carvel of Westport where he quickly became recognized as a very talented outfielder and consistent hitter.

In 1982 he joined the Club 300 team out of Westport before spending the next two seasons (1983-1984) with Shiney's of Westport. By this time his talents were becoming more and more evident and they caught the eye of Sonny Demattio who recruited Rich to play with his Sonny's team in 1985.

His speed and athleticism combined with his ability to hit the ball from line to line at any time and to drive the ball to the outfield gaps made

him a perfect candidate to bat leadoff and play a middle outfield position.

While with Sonny's, Rich was part of five Class A Connecticut State Championship teams. They captured the title in 1986 and then won three consecutive first place trophies (1988-1990). Sonny's also won a Class A National Qualifier in 1987 in Rhode Island.

Rich played in ten State Tournaments with Sonny's, five Regionals (including a runner up finish in 1991) and made seven trips to the Class A Nationals (1985-1991).

The team also won six Westport Town championships and six consecutive Rowayton Sunday Morning League and Connecticut Classic League titles (1985-1990).

On the individual level, Rich was the 1986 Rowayton Sunday Morning League batting champion with a .687 average, the MVP of the 1987 Poughkeepsie Invitational Tournament Class A Division and the MVP of the 1988 Naugatuck ASA Open Tournament.

Rich finished his 13 year career in 1993 with a lifetime batting average of over .650. Teammate and fellow Hall of Famer Jeb Backus (Class of 2019) said this about Rich; "Softball is not all about winning, it's about winning with character and class. It wasn't Richy's .650+ batting average or his masterful outfield play that stood out the most, it was his character and class in which he conducted himself on and off the field."

Rich now resides in Fairfield.



Ed Yeziarski

For 40 years, spanning five decades, Ed roamed the outfield for some of the best Modified Pitch teams in Waterbury.

He started playing softball with Nelson's Texaco with a bunch of young kids, not knowing what it would lead to. He joined Cal's Sunoco in 1967, enjoying a six year stint with them before hooking up with Domar's Bombers in 1973.

The 80's saw Ed play with Callahan's Warriors, Skider's Gym and Allan's Cleaners. His final two stops were with Callahan's Saloon and Seven Eleven.

Highlighting Ed's softball journey were fifteen consecutive appearances in the Connecticut ASA Modified State Tournament in which three State Championships were won (1986, 1988 and 1990).

He also made four trips to the Modified Nationals beginning with Waterville, ME in 1980 where his team finished third and Ed hit four home runs. Austin, MN in 1983, Marietta, GA in 1988 and Decatur, AL in 1990 were the three other destinations.

Ed not only hit for average (.375 career BA) but for power, hammering over 400 home runs including three over a 300 foot fence in a State League game. He also racked up an impressive .400 lifetime batting average in State Tournament play.

While with Callahan's, Ed hit four homers and earned MVP honors as he led the team to the 1983 Fairhaven Tournament championship. Callahan's also captured the first place trophy for the Danielson Tournament in 1982 and 1983 and the Worcester Tournament in 1984.

As a final note, Ed said that he was "Most proud of the times when our teams upset the reigning national championship teams on three different occasions".

Ed now resides in Middlebury.



Kevin Ziperstein

Kevin began his softball career as a player but truly earned his Hall of Fame induction for being the founding father and the only manager of the Traitors softball franchise.

The Traitors men's team began play in 1994 in the Stamford based JCC Modified League before joining the Stamford Slow Pitch Recreation League in 1995.

While he was overseeing the locally successful men's team, Kevin decided to start a Coed team in 1998. They began play in the Darien Recreation League for three successful seasons before moving to the Stamford Recreation League in 2001.

Y2K saw the beginning of the Traitor success beyond the local level. The men's team captured the 2002 Unclassified State Championship and won

the 2007 Class D title. They also placed fifth three times in the D's along with a runner-up and a fifth Place finish in the ASA Wood Bat States.

Traitors earned four Southwest Regional Class D titles (1998, 1999, 2002, 2003) as well as winning a 2007 National Qualifier.

The men's team ceased play in the Open Division in 2009 and regrouped in 2011 to play in the Shelton Over 35 League in which they are still active.

Meanwhile the Coed combine was compiling its own list of achievements. After five straight years of top four finishes or better in the States (2001-2005), including a title in 2003, they earned a fifth place finish in the 2004 Nationals before reaching the summit in 2005 when they captured the Coed Class B National Championship in Bismarck, ND.

The Traitors were the first Connecticut ASA Coed team to win a National Championship.

Bumped up to Class A because of the 2005 title, the Traitors Coed team continued to excel at that higher level with three straight top ten finishes including a runner up in 2008.

They racked up another State title in 2011 and had four more top five finishes including a runner up in 2016. On the National scene they had a fourth place finish in the 2009 C's and a second place in the 2013 D's.

The Coed team has compiled an outstanding 452-82 record, an .847 winning percentage. Finally, in addition to masterminding their on the field success, Kevin also was responsible for the various fund raising activities that allowed the Traitors to enjoy the fruits of their labor. He struck up a sponsorship agreement with Easton, ran an annual party and hosted their annual "Prelude to The Northeast Nationals" which attracted many of the top teams in the Northeast.

Kevin now makes Shelton his home.
