Hall of Fame Banquet Program Coordinator - Hank Koritkoski Hall of Fame Banquet Coordinator - Jessica Caro Hall of Fame Publicity Director - Bill Uluski In August 2006, the sport of softball in Connecticut became unified in honoring its past with the merging of its fast pitch and slow pitch Halls of Fame. Prior to this merger, the two entities had each separately elected and inducted members to their respective Halls of Fame. That changed with the formation of one combined Hall of Fame to be known as the Connecticut ASA Hall of Fame.

USA Softball of Connecticut commissioner Hank Koritkoski oversees the umbrella organization with the fast pitch and slow pitch committees continuing to function as separate groups in selecting candidates for the USA Softball of Connecticut Hall of Fame.

USA Softball of Connecticut stages an annual Hall of Fame dinner to formally induct its new members.

The Fast Pitch Hall of Fame was established in 1971, with the Slow Pitch Hall starting in 1985. Committees to select Hall of Famers meet frequently and accept nominations for new candidates. To be eligible for consideration, a player must be retired for 5 years or, if the player is over 50 years of age, the 5 year waiting period is waived.

For nominees, applications should be submitted to the Hall of Fame committee chairs by April 1 each year. Any individual who had an outstanding softball career in Connecticut is eligible, with emphasis on state, regional and national tournament play as one of the important criteria for Hall of Fame consideration. Applications are available on our state website.

In 2017 Connecticut ASA re-branded to USA Softball of Connecticut and officially opened its physical Hall of Fame display which is located at Erin's Gym in Stratford.

Rick Bernaiche

Rick played in Cheshire and Waterbury from 1978 to 1991.

He began his career in the Waterbury Leagues in 1979 with the Golden Villa A's until 1983, having moderate success with them.

The A's then combined with Town and Country in 1984 to become Allyn's Cleaners. It was at that time when Rick developed a devastating knuckle ball and curve to go along with his pinpoint control. He quickly became the ace of a major State contender, as Allyn's won three consecutive State titles from 1985 to 1987.

Rick also led the Scoreboard to the State Championship in 1991.

He participated in eight straight State Tournaments and compiled a record of 23 and 6 during that time with an ERA of 2.58.

Rick pitched in four National Tournaments highlighted by a 9th place finish in Spokane WA in 1986.

He also pitched in several tournaments on the East Coast highlighted by Allyn's winning a major tournament in Massachusetts In 1984. Rick was 3 and 0 with a 1.98 ERA.

He also led Allyn's to several Waterbury League titles and ended up with over 200 life time wins in his career.

Rick passed away in 2014.



Doug Bieling

Combining his offensive capabilities with his outstanding defense as a pitcher, Doug put together a 23 year career with some of Connecticut's legendary teams.

He launched his Hall of Fame journey with Sonny's in 1985. During his tenure there he was part of four Class A State Championship squads (1986, 1988, 1989 and 1990) in addition to three New England runner-up finishes. They also won a Class A National Qualifier in Rhode Island in 1987 plus seven straight Westport town and Rowayton Sunday Morning League championships.

Midas Touch/ACR/Worth was his next stop in 1992 where he helped that team rack up three consecutive Major State Championships (1992 thru 1994).

And, between Sonny's and Midas Touch, Doug was a part of seven Connecticut Classic League crowns.

He then spent twelve seasons (1996-2007) with St. Ann's (Class B).

Doug began Over 35 play in 1996 with Fly Juice followed by a stint with Heritage Carpentry (2003-2007). He added five more titles to his resume as Fly Juice captured the Over 35 State crown in 1998, 1999, 2001 and 2002 and Heritage in 2003.

Heritage also won the ASA Class C State Championship in 2007 and Doug was part of DW Landscaping's 2000 ASA Class B New England Regional Championship squad.

All told, Doug played in 23 CT ASA State Championship Tournaments, five ASA Class A New England Regional Tournaments and one ASA Class B New England Regional.

He also made 22 trips to National Championship events: (5) ASA Class A - 1985-1990; (3) ASA Major-1992-1994; (5) ASA Class B -1996-2000; (9) ASA Over 35-1999-2007.

2020 Hall of Fame inductee Rich Skau said that, although Doug did play second base and in the outfield, his primary role was as a pitcher because of his superb defense. Rich went on to say that Doug became one of the most respected and liked players, not only amongst his teammates and coaches, but also his opponents. Doug recorded more than 750 pitching wins combined at the local, state, and national levels. He accrued a lifetime .575+ batting average, doing even better (.700+) in pool, Over 35 Tournament play.

He now makes Norwalk his home.



Chris Burke

After a brief college baseball career, Chris launched his two decade softball journey in the early 80's with Friends News in the Stratford ASA A Division. As a power hitting third baseman, he began to attract the attention of some upper echelon teams, including the Stoneybrook Jaws who coaxed Chris to join them after he played two seasons with Friends.

From 1981 until 1984 Chris' credentials placed him in the power portion of the Jaws' lineup and he was a key contributor to their winning several league titles and making annual appearances in the State Tournament.

In 1985 Chris transferred his allegiance to the Midas Touch Jewelers. He became an integral

part of the perennial power Jewelers for over 15 years and the camaraderie he experienced made him feel that all his teammates were like family.

1987 saw Midas make the first of three ASA Class A National Tournament appearances. That trip took them to Midland, TX followed by a 1990 journey to Parma, OH.

They then went to Jacksonville, FL in 1991 where they placed third with a 5-2 record with Chris belting six consecutive home runs in the tournament and earning 1st team All American honors.

That third place finish "bumped" them up to the Major Classification and they didn't skip a beat. They made five consecutive ASA Major National Tournaments capped off by a fourth place finish (out of 26 teams) in Waterloo, IA in 1996.

At the local level, Midas Touch won two championships in the highly competitive Connecticut Classic League.

After he retired from Midas, he played in a few leagues in the Connecticut River Valley area. He also was a member of the Bender Plumbing Over 40 squad in 2000 and 2001 and traveled with them to a tournament in Florida.

Primarily a corner infielder with occasional outfield assignments, Chris was known for his long ball prowess while maintaining a batting average in excess of .650. In addition to his 1st Team All American honor, he also earned several other MVP and All League, All Tournament nominations.

He played in ten State ASA tournaments and three New England Regionals.

On a personal level Chris said he really loved coaching his daughter's softball team. Chris lives in Niantic with his wife, Jennifer. They have two children, Stephen and Amanda, and a grandson, Theodore.



Rick Caffrey

Rick "Ricky "Caffrey started umpiring in Waterbury in 1975, working Men's Modified as well as Men's, Women's and Youth Fast Pitch softball.

In 1980 Rick became the assigner for Modified leagues in Waterbury where he became a mentor and friend to countless brother and sister umpires. He also was the Umpire in Chief of the Modified State Tournament with his great friend and Tournament Director Hall of Famer Jay Santoli.

Rick umpired and assigned both the Waterbury midweek and weekend leagues with over 50

teams.

In the mid 80's he began umpiring college games. At around the same time he took over as the state ASA representative for the Waterbury board.

He also was privileged to work the 1992 Women's Major Modified Tournament in Drifton, PA.

Rick passed away in 1998.



Mary Cavataro

From an early age Mary proved to be a talented and versatile athlete, playing and earning awards in high school field hockey, lacrosse and softball. In 1983 she began her 33 year softball career in Stamford industrial leagues where her teams regularly earned the league championship.

As their starting left fielder and number three hitter, Mary led Nicolby's from Greenwich to the 1987 ASA Eastern Regional championship. This was one of several Regional Tournaments Mary played in in the mid and late 80's.

Her Gartner Group corporate team won State Industrial crowns in 1994, 1995 and 1997. Mary earned tourney MVP honors in 1994.

She played in many State Tournaments and has fond memories of fun times at Calf Pasture in Norwalk.

In her 40's she began playing in Milford for the Shoreliners and then Keep It Clean, winning several league titles while also making a few trips to the ASA State Tournament.

At the age of 47 Mary was named MVP in the Women's Open A at the Trentonian Tournament that was hailed as the largest annual slow pitch softball event in the world. She batted .890 and, together with her shortstop, turned ten double plays. Of all the awards she's been honored with, this one sticks out because she was probably the oldest player in the Open/A event as she helped her team (Slammers, NJ) win that championship.

In her 50's she began playing with Slate Rock, perennial Westport town champion, many years going undefeated.

Mary moved to France for a few years where she founded and coached the first women's softball club in the Mantes La Jolie (West of Paris) district. She was also assistant coach of the men's baseball club there and occasionally umpired men's games.

She was known as a great defensive player, talented enough to occupy just about any position on the field. She patrolled the outfield in the early years before moving to the infield later in her career.

Her love for the game found her taking the opportunity to play in a multitude of high level tournaments where she earned several well deserved MVP and All Tournament honors.

She met her spouse of 20 years thanks to softball and, with her spouse, runs a tournament team (STORM) that she's been coaching for eleven years.

Even though "retired", she has played in the CT Masters and still plays in the Monday night Stamford ASA Women's Open Rec and Westport Co-ed leagues. She now resides in Wilton.



Russ Dehlinger

After being on the softball fields for over 40 years as a player and coach, Russ Dehlinger had an amazing understanding of the game and a unique ability to make the right moves at the right time.


With a roster comprised of local Milford athletes only, he led his teams (Shamrock Express, Stonewall Restaurant, Helwigs, and Paul's Package Store) from 1992 to 1996 to five straight CT Class D State Championships without ever losing a tournament game. That success continued in corresponding New England Regionals and National Tournaments. In 1996, his team finished 17th in a field of over

130 teams in the Class D Nationals in Montgomery, AL. Similar success at various Nationals was accomplished in Michigan, Tennessee and Louisiana. In 1994 he coached his team (Helwig's/JTI) to the Over-35 CT state title, then in 1997 and 1998 to Class D Regional and Sectional championships (Carpenter Construction) in Vernon Ct. The 1998 Carpenter Construction team went on to play in the Over 40 Nationals in San Antonio, TX.

In the early 2000's The Governor continued his run of success at additional tournaments, local and national, including the Over 45 Nationals held in Stratford, CT in 2001 and in South Bend, IN in 2003 (Decades and Fireside).

After taking some time off from softball to reflect and relax, in 2009 Russ was coaxed off his poolside chair at home in Ft. Lauderdale, FL to co-manage a team in the Senior 50AA Eastern National Tournament in Burlington, NC (Helwig's). His team won the Tournament with a 6-0 record.

In total, Russ led his teams to 8 National Tournaments, 6 State Tournaments and 4 Regionals. While the team names may have changed over the years, the players throughout that run did not. If fact, many of the players that he brought together continue to play with one another to this day. Russ in now retired from softball but he remains an inspiration and friend to many.



Mark S. Golub

For thirty years Mark S. Golub, aka "The Rabbi," helmed the 4 Corners, a softball team that rose to local fame and prominence in the early 2000s. With an abundance of passion, heart and laughter, the beloved coach led the long-running and successful franchise to numerous titles and championships, not only at the local level but at state, regional and national levels.

Beginning in 1994, they had a remarkable run that lasted for over 12 years, winning a National Championship, 2 State Championships, a CT Sectional Championship and 7 League Championships. Among their many tournament victories:

National Champions - 2004

CT State 35 Masters' Champions - 2002 (35), 2000 (35)

CT Regional "B" Champions - 1995

Stamford City Champion titles - 2005, 2004, 2002, 2001, 2000, 1996

League Champions - 2004, 2002, 2001, 1998, 1996, 1996, 1994

State ASA Class B Southern Sectional titles: 1996, 1995

State ASA Masters Over 35: 2002 (winner), 2001 (runner up)

Tournaments became the highlight of every players' year, where win or lose the team spirit made for a lively and memorable experience.

In 2004 the FC traveled to St. Augustine, Florida where they won the National Championships.

As a softball manager and coach, the Rabbi was known not only for his skill and ability to lead the team to victory, but for his infectious laughter and loving spirit which was a force unto itself. Mark led a fulfilling and successful life off the field as well.

A father of 5, he was an actual practicing rabbi as well as media entrepreneur, television personality and educator.

He created two full-time television networks: the Jewish Broadcasting Service and the Russian Television Network of America.

And for over 40 years he was the host of L'Chayim, a talk show he created in 1979 in which he interviewed prominent Jewish figures. He was named one of Newsweek's "50 most influential rabbis" in 2009.

Together with his brother David, with whom he shared many things including his love for baseball and softball, he later became a successful theater producer, winning several Tony Awards for productions on Broadway.

Mark poured everything he had into all he did.

And of all his passions and accomplishments, the Four Corners experience was one of the great highlights of his life.



Rich Jacovich

Rich began his twenty year softball career directly out of high school in 1979 before attending the University of Tampa that fall.

His first team was the Golden Villa A's out of Waterbury who were managed by Hall of Famer Jay Santoli.

That A's team combined with Allyn's Cleaners out of Watertown in 1984 and won three consecutive Modified Pitch State Championships (1985-1987).

Rich earned a fourth State Championship in 1991 with Scoreboard out of Waterbury.

In total he participated in twelve Modified Connecticut State Tournaments.

From 1985 through 1996 Rich made ten trips to the Modified Pitch Nationals, both the ten man and nine man versions.

The highlight of those ten trips was in 1996 when he and his Action Motors teammates finished third in the ten man Modifieds and Rich earned All American honors. He had 25 plate appearances with five walks and eleven hits that included a pair of home runs, four doubles while collecting eleven RBI's and finishing with a .550 batting average.

Locally he was part of six Brass City Champions in the 80's and three straight Cheshire League winners (1996-1998). A 1987 Worcester Tournament title is also on his resume.

Rich finished his career with a .370 batting average, an over .400 on base percentage and 175 home runs.

He also was an ASA umpire for 17 years.

In addition to his outstanding softball career, Rich also was the recipient of the Gold Ring for his devotion to his Oakville/Watertown community where he still resides.



Jack Keegan 1973: FIFTY YEARS AGO:

A Hall of Fame worthy career began in the Middlebury Softball League behind Mary I. Johnson School. Pitching for Sabols and quickly running out of steam was Patty Hobart. Golf in the afternoon heat and that stop at the 19th hole had taken its toll. The Bullpen was empty, but, sitting on the bench and about to make his first appearance was Jack Keegan.

AND SO IT BEGAN:

For twenty-nine years the Lee High School softball and football coach played with and against the best modified softball teams in the country. Clinica from Miami, Silvestri's from Staten Island, the Cadillacs from Atlanta and Town and Country Cleaners from Waterbury. Jack began his career with Sabols in the Middlebury Softball

League in 1971-73. After three seasons and two championships the team changed names, leagues and players. From 1974-78 Domar's Bombers became the team to beat in the Waterbury softball leagues. In five years, Domar's won 12 league titles, Connelly Tournament and a State Championship. Keegan's final stop in Connecticut 1979-80 was with perennial power Town and Country. In two years, T&C won six league championships, two state titles, the New England Championship and a third place finish at the 1980 National Championship.

AND ALONG THE WAY:

In the early days, he came to the park with two pitches "real fast & real wild". Three years later with a fastball riser and knuckleball, Jack had become one of the best pitchers in the country and after 29 years, he retired.

Benji Labrador

Beginning in his late teens, Benji Labrador has been around softball for over 40 years.

His playing career started on the slow pitch side with Ray's Together before he moved into the fast pitch and modified game.


He debuted in the Bridgeport Boriquien League with the Tigers, enjoying a six year stay in which the team won the league title five times.

Benji then partnered with Pollulos for about three years before moving over to the Latin League which played at Wentfield Park. He was in the Latin League for about five years.

Benji was proud to serve his country in the Army Reserve. He left the service as sp/4 where he was honorably discharged.

He played third base, shortstop and caught and he's still playing today in the Bridgeport Over 50 League.

Benji has been coaching American Legion baseball in Bridgeport for 28 years as well as Hank's Yanks. He is also head of the Park board in his home city of Bridgeport.



Kenny Mathews

Kenny began his 26 year softball career after being introduced to the game by his father who played Fast Pitch for the Norwalk Eagles in the 60's and grandfather figure, the great John Buschbaum.

The following testimonial to Kenny's Hall of Fame worthiness comes from fellow Hall of Famer Ray Montambo.

I know when you think of home run hitters in Connecticut slow pitch, the names that probably come to mind are Mouse Lynch, Ozzie Mathews, Roy Richardson, Billy Zettergeen, Pete Gribben, Larry Chiapetta and Dennis Appel to name a few but there is at least one name missing from that list, Kenny Mathews.

Kenny started his career around 1983 playing recreational ball in Norwalk. He was quickly noticed by Sonny D'Matteo of Sonny's Softball. Sonny's became one of Connecticut's elite teams soon after winning several State Championships with Kenny being somewhere in the heart of the line-up.

He later switched allegiances to play with one of his good friends Ray Montambo and his Ray's Together softball team.

Kenny went on to play in many local, state and National Tournaments all over the country, winning numerous home run titles. His teams won championships in several divisions including Class A, Class B, Over 35 and Over 40.

He has also won two world Championships in the Over 35 Division in College Station TX, in 2006 and in Augusta GA in 2007. He was First Team All World both years and was voted MVP in 2007.

In addition to being a great home run hitter, Kenny batted in the mid .600's most of his career. Defensively he played the shallowest right and right-centerfield of any outfielder I have ever seen with the hits he took away vastly outnumbering the balls hit over his head. He just had a special feel for the game.

One tournament I have to mention was in 1998 when our Ray's Together team captured the State Title at Calf Pasture in Norwalk and Kenny had 19 straight hits and was our MVP.

That 26 year career saw Kenny play for some of the state's best: Sonny's, Ray's Together, 4 Corners, Heritage Carpentry and St. Ann's averaging .600-.800 with home runs numbering in the thousands.

Kenny was especially proud of the over a dozen Norwalk City Championships he was part of when he played for St. Ann's and the late Hall of Fame coach Tony Cappucia.

Kenny now makes his home in Norwalk.



Kris O'Hara

In a career that spanned 23 years (1992-2015), Kris O'Hara played with some of the premier teams on the highest level of slow pitch softball. Included on his resume were Sonny's of Westport (Class A), Busters, Midas Touch (Major), Chase Checking (Class A/ Major), Reese Roosters (Major), Benfield AM Las Vegas (Major) and Long Haul Trucking (Major/ Super Major).

Kris played in 15 ASA National Tournaments. Highlighting those appearances were two Major National Championships. The first came in 2000 in Lawton, OK with Long Haul/ TPS. In addition to the team crown, Kris also earned 1st Team All Americans honors and was the tourney

home run champion with 17.

Then, in Sanford, FL, Kris and his Benfield AM Las Vegas teammates captured the 2005 Major Division championship with Kris again earning 1st Team All American.

He was also 1st Team All American with Midas Touch when they had a fourth place finish in the 1996 Major Division tournament in Waterloo, IA.

Locally he was a member of three championship teams in the highly competitive Connecticut Classic League. He also was a part of a multitude of city league championship squads: Stamford (15); Greenwich (10); Westport (2); Rowayton (2).

Kris recorded a lifetime batting average of around .700 and hit over 1500 home runs while defensively being capable of occupying any position in the infield or outfield.

On a personal note Kris credited his dad, Edward O'Hara, with bestowing on him the love of sports, especially softball. He was not only Kris' coach but his favorite fan and sponsor. He instilled in Kris the meaning of being part of a team.

In return, he's coached and played with his hometown teams for several years. Kris also wanted to mention the outstanding sponsors, Finescape, Pasiak Trucking, Dickeys Power Club, Matthews Construction, Tucci Lumber, Minchin Buick and Premier Lighting that he's been associated with over the years. He said "I truly enjoyed being part of a team and have made lifelong friends forever." Kris now lives in Stamford.



Frank Orsini

Beginning in the early 80's, Frank Orsini enjoyed a 41 year Fast Pitch career playing for some of the top area teams.

On his resume are Reed Construction, Tanasi's, American Legion Post #8, Cigna, Shannon Cafe and the Merchants out of Fall River, MA.

With these teams, Frank made 15 ASA State Tournaments, seven New England Regionals and four National Tournaments.


They also won numerous local championships: Windsor League (8); Insurance League (4); and Canton League (1).

A versatile player, Frank manned first base, various outfield spots and even pitched. In his four decade career, he racked up some impressive stats. While playing in 1230 games he hit 510 home runs (18 in tournament play), drove in 1450 runs, scored 1700 runs and finished with a lifetime batting average of .375.

Frank earned MVP honors in the 1995 Binghamton Tournament.

Off the field Frank was proud of being a driving force in keeping the Windsor League intact by consistently encouraging other teams and creating new teams to keep the league alive.

Frank now resides in Bloomfield.



Douglas Roina

In a career that began in 1978 and is still going today, Douglas Roina has put together a softball resume that is indeed Hall of Fame worthy.

Starting with VIP Limousine in that first season of 1978, he played with several of the best teams in Connecticut: Norelco/ Thompson, 19th Hole (Over 35), Fly Juice, Bender Plumbing, Pasiak Trucking/ Finescape, Covello's Sanitation and Component Assembly Systems.

Douglas also was on teams in New York with one of those teams traveling to Delaware where they merged with a team sponsored by legendary quarterback Joe Theisman.

He played in 17 Class A National Tournaments, a like number of Connecticut ASA State Championships and five ASA Major and Class A New England Regionals. In his first season (1978) he experienced immediate tournament success as his VIP Limousine squad captured the Connecticut ASA Major crown.

Then, in 1996, he and his 19th Hole teammates won the State Over 35 championship. At the local level, Douglas was part of 15 Masters and 24 Class A league winners in Greenwich and two Class A Danbury league champs.

Considered by teammates to be an outstanding leadoff hitter, he had a lifetime batting average in excess of .700.

His efficiency at the plate earned him the Batting Championship in the 2013 Masters National Tournament with a .921 average. He also won three straight Danbury Class A League batting titles (2014-2016).

He wasn't only an offensive force he also was a defensive whiz at second base who was one of the fastest at turning a double play.

Douglas was born and raised in Greenwich.



Sikorsky Aircraft

Prior to 2023 no Slow Pitch team had been inducted into the USA Softball/ ASA National Hall of Fame. That is no longer true as Connecticut's own Sikorsky Aircraft will be inducted this year.

The Industrial Softball dynasty has recorded some amazing numbers to earn the recognition. Beginning in 1963, Sikorsky won 17 State Industrial Championships. (1963, 1967 thru 1970, 1972 thru 1975, 1977, 1978, 1982, 1985, 2000, 2002 thru 2004).

But even more amazing are the 19 National Championships, all at the Major Industrial level (1979, 1980, 1982, 1984, 1987, 1990, 1992, thru 1998, 2000 thru 2002, 2004, 2011, 2014).

In total Sikorsky qualified for the National Tournament 46 times. In addition to their 19 titles, they finished second eight times and in the top five 35 times. They had over 50 players earn All American honors, totaling over 200 selections.

One of the highlights of the 1998 season was when Sikorsky President, Gene Buckley, donated \$10,000 out of his own pocket to enter the team in the first ever David Cone Charity Softball Tournament for Baseball Assistance Team/MLB in New York's Central Park.

This special event had many baseball legends involved as honorary coaches for the teams, such as Joe and Frank Torre, Derek Jeter, Bob Gibson, Tim McCarver and George Foster, to name a few. The Sikorsky team did not disappoint their president, going undefeated in five games and outscoring their opponents 98-5.

From the early 70's until 2014 here are the 19 Connecticut Hall of Famers who were part of that dynasty: Jeff Toni, Ed Muzyka, Mark "Kip" Trembley, Tom DeBernardo, Mark Berritto, Bob Kownacki, Pete Gribben, Ed Skowronski, Mike Homkovics, John Cologgi, Dennis Appel, Joe Magdon, Bob Hurd, Gene Kwalek, Mike "Spanky" Humeniuk, Ken Clark, Joe Arszyla, Frank Guillenetti and Jerry Licursi.

As with any successful organization there are great leaders. In Sikorsky's case these were the coaches: Harry Zylinski, Gene Kwalek and Ed Skowronski.

What made the team so unique and special over the years was the diverse backgrounds of its players and coaches. This group was comprised of workers throughout the company, from the manufacturing area, from the engineering offices, from the financial people, etc. Every member of the team had a role and were able to achieve and accomplish so many memorable events over the years.

Truly a remarkable run of success was Sikorsky Aircraft.



JeffToni

After honing his diamond skills by playing high school baseball, Jeff began his thirty year Hall of Fame worthy softball career in 1985 with Derby based Orazietti's before joining Naugatuck Valley Class B powerhouse Pepe's Construction. He also played with the Shakers combine and was teammates with fellow Hall of Famer Dennis Appel on another quality squad, Undercoverwear. Then, in the mid 90's, Jeff became an integral part of the success stories of both the legendary Ray's Together and perennial Industrial behemoth Sikorsky Aircraft.

During his time with those teams they claimed a total of eleven ASA Championships at state, regional and national levels.

Both teams captured two State Championships: Ray's in Class A and Sikorsky in the Major Industrial Division.

Ray's also won a New England Class A Regional crown.

Topping the list were the six Major Industrial National Championships earned by Sikorsky (1997, 1998, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2004) and one runner-up finish.

Jeff played in eleven consecutive Men's Major Industrial National Tournaments with Sikorsky from 1997 through 2007. He also played in two Men's Class A National Tournaments with Ray's in 1994 and 1995.

Jeff was named to eleven National 1st Team All-Tournament Teams (nine with Sikorsky and two with Ray's).

He also was a four time Tournament MVP, won five batting titles and three home run titles.

Jeff continued with Sikorsky's into the 2010's and played with other quality over 40 teams.

Primarily a middle infielder (second base and shortstop) and also a third baseman, Jeff was an exceptional hitter, both average wise and for power. His lifetime batting average was easily over .700 and he usually led his teams in home runs.

Attested to by former teammates Jeff performed all those above mentioned feats in a modest way and would always put the team first above all of his amazing accomplishments. He was both a leader and outstanding player every time he stepped foot on the field.

Jeff has worked as a Purchasing Manager at Sikorsky Aircraft for over 25 years. He coached his two daughters' girl's softball teams for several seasons and is active in the United Way Charitable Giving campaigns at Sikorsky.

He is also an avid low handicap golfer.

Jeff makes his home in North Haven. He attributes a great part of his success to his wife Robin and his children Josephine and Caroline.



Louis Urso

Louis' umpiring journey began in 1980 when he took a class at Central Connecticut State.

He joined the Plainville ASA board the following year and quickly moved up the ranks so that he worked his first Slow Pitch Sectional Tournament in 1987.

Louis started umpiring Fast Pitch in 1990, working Junior Olympic girls tournaments. In 1997 he started to officiate high school games, making the C.I.A.C. tournament list in 1999. He then moved up to the college ranks in 2001 and worked them until 2016.

His outstanding officiating ability saw him umpire in 25 Connecticut State Tournaments, 10 New England Regionals and 3 Nationals.

He became a member of the National Indicator Fraternity in 2013.

In addition to his contributing to ASA umpiring he has also worked 70 CIAC Tournament games, including 21 quarterfinals, 14 semi finals and 2 finals.

Louis also proudly served his country. He is a decorated U.S. Army Veteran (11-65 to 11-68) of the Vietnam War and was awarded the Purple Heart and Bronze Star for Valor.

Although Louis earned his Hall of Fame honor as an elite umpire, he also enjoyed playing the game.

He played Fast Pitch while in high school where he was the starting left fielder for his team that went to the New Britain Church League finals two straight years.

When he got back from the Army, Louis played slow pitch from 1969 to 1995. He was on 11 league championship teams in New Britain and Southington and was also part of nine tournament title teams.

Louis now resides in Southington.



Ronald Vigue

Ronald earned his Hall of Fame induction as a veteran girl's Fast Pitch coach with the Connecticut Bombers travel team as well as with his alma mater Lyman Memorial High School in Lebanon where he played baseball, soccer and basketball.

He has been the Bombers volunteer head coach for 15 years, compiling an overall record of 437-201-32. He was Fall Ball Coach with the Bombers from 2009-2013 and then in 2016 and 2017.

Throughout his years coaching them, he has worked with levels 12U through 18U.

Coach Vigue's teams have won multiple tournaments, including the biggest win as 18U

in the 2013 PONY East Regional National Tournament with an 11-0 record in Sterling, VA (his daughter was on this team).

That season also included four other tournament wins plus one second and one third. All of the girls on this National Tournament team went on to play softball in college.

In 2019 and 2020 his Bombers team came in second place at the Nationals.

In addition to his success with the Bombers, Ronald also took on the job of softball coach at Lebanon Middle School in 2007. After two seasons there, he moved to the Lyman Memorial JV Coach position and spent four years mentoring the younger players before taking on the mantle of Varsity Head Coach in 2013.

While compiling a career record of 115-105, Ronald has coached 24 All-ECC players and six All-State players. He has held numerous "Lebanon Sport Camps" softball summer camps at Lyman for local and surrounding girls.

Ronald has hosted BBQ dinners to help fund the trips he has taken the varsity team on in 2018 and 2022 for spring training at the Disney Wide World of Sports. He also runs an annual team breakfast and pasta dinner for the high school softball program and designs yearly inspirational T-shirts that he purchases for the girls to wear throughout the season.

Ronald hosted a benefit game for Coach/Umpire Hurlock.

He also found time to volunteer in the Lebanon Little League with his two daughters and son starting in 2000 off and on through 2012/2013. He helped organize a coaches clinic for Lebanon and HAMR (Hebron) coaches and ran clinics for elementary and middle school aged players during the winter with his high school players.

An individual who truly loves the game of softball, Ronald resides in Lebanon.






