



Keith Macdowall - New Haven - Chairman Ted Parisi - Trumbull Joe Magdon - Milford Phil Scarpellino - New Haven Dick Tully - Southington Liz Alling - New Haven Jim Reynolds - East Haven In August 2006, the sport of softball in Connecticut became unified in honoring its past with the merging of its fast pitch and slow pitch Halls of Fame. Prior to this merger, the two entities had each separately elected and inducted members to their respective Hall of Fames. That changed with the formation of one combined Hall of Fame to be known as the Connecticut ASA Hall of Fame.

New CASA state commissioner Hank Koritkoski oversees the umbella organization with the fast pitch and slow pitch committees continuing to function as separate groups in selecting candidates for the CASA Hall of Fame.

CASA stages an annual Hall of Fame dinner to formally induct its new members.

The Fast Pitch Hall of Fame was established in 1971, with the Slow Pitch Hall starting in 1985. Committees to select CASA Hall of Famers meet frequently and accept nominations for new candidates. To be eligible for slow pitch consideration, a player must be retired for 5 years or if the player is over 50 years of age, the 5-year waiting period is waived. The Bernie Iassogna Hall of Honor, named for the nationally and internationally known umpire, is open to managers, coaches, sponsors, umpires and friends of the game.

For fast pitch nominees, applications should be submitted to the HOF fast pitch committee or a district commissioner by June 30 each year. Any individual who had an outstanding softball career in Connecticut is eligible, with emphasis on state, regional and national tournament play as one of the important criteria for Hall of Fame consideration.

Patti Fernandes

From 1977 thru 2005 Patti Fernandes was a key cog in the success of the legendary Raybestos/ Hi-Ho Brakettes of Stratford.

She patrolled the outfield, primarily centerfield, from the beginning of her tenure with the Brakettes until 1997 when she took on the dual role of player-coach. After hanging up the spikes after the 1997 season, Patti assumed the responsibilities of full time coach until her final season in 2005.

As a player, she was part of the following Brakettes' championships: 1977 ASA Nationals, 1978 World and National, 1979 Olympic Sports Festival and 1980 ASA Nationals. The team also had runners-up finishes in 1981 and

1993 and a third place finish in 1995.

During her eight year stint as coach, the Brakettes collected three consecutive ASA National Championships in 2002, 2003 and 2004. In her final year (2005) the team finished second.

Outside the world of amateur softball, Patti served as the head softball coach at Southern Connecticut State University. In 2001 she was honored as the Division II Conference Coach of the Year.

She was the first female athlete inducted into the Stratford High School Athletic Hall of Fame. She was inducted into the Connecticut Basketball Hall of Fame as a referee and the Connecticut Softball Hall of Fame.

Patti also had the honor of refereeing in the 1999 and 2001 NCAA Division II Women's Basketball National Championship.

To this day, she still calls Stratford her home town.



Kevin LaMay

Bestowed with the honor of being the first Modified player to be inducted into the Fast Pitch wing of the Connecticut ASA Hall of Fame, Kevin LaMay comes with 20 years worth of credentials that make him deserving of that honor.

Primarily a power hitting leftfielder who also maintained a lofty batting average, he began his career in 1974 with Foster's Market of Thomaston. He spent five years with Foster's before moving on in 1979 to co-found Skider's Gym, also of Thomaston.

Spending eight years with Skider's, Kevin helped lead that team to five consecutive State Tournament appearances to go along with an

equal number of trips to the Nationals.

Highlighting that successful run were three straight State Titles that included 18 wins in a row from 1982 to 1985. The 1984 team traveled to Knoxville TN for the Nationals where it placed 4th and Kevin earned Second Team All American. After the 1986 season, Kevin took his talents north to Massachusetts where he hitched up with The Tighe Club from Wilmington. He also brought along the formula for success as that Tighe Club squad earned a trip to the Nationals in all six years that Kevin played there until his retirement in 1993.

Highlighted by those 12 straight trips to the Modified Nationals in all corners of the country from Spokane, WA to Austin, MN to Miami, FL, Kevin's 20 years in the game bred success on the biggest stage. He finished with a lifetime batting average over .410 while hitting over .420 in State Tournament play and .400 at the National level.

He also hit well over 500 home runs and earned several local league and tournament $\mathrm{MVP}\xspace's.$

Kevin now resides in rural Washington, CT with his wife Sharon and three boys, Ryan, Kyle and Trey.




Scott Lund

A slick fielding shortstop, Scott enjoyed a 14 year career not only in the Fast Pitch game but also in the Modified Division. He began his career in 1974 with Celeste out of Waterbury. After six years with Celeste, Scott moved on to spend two years (1979-1980) with the legendary Raybestos Cardinals of Stratford. In 1980-1981, Scott shared his talents with Reed Construction of Andover, MA and Domars Bombers of Waterbury. 1981-1982 saw him playing with Stingers from Waterbury. He then spent the rest of his playing time from 1983 to 1988 with Domars/ Callahans also from Waterbury.

Scott played in several State Fast Pitch Tournaments in Milford and Stratford. He traveled to Nashua, NH and Worcester, MA for New England Modified Regional Tournaments .

He also played on the National stage in both Fast Pitch (Michigan and California) and Modified (Austin, MN and Marietta, GA).

Scott maintained a lifetime batting average of close to .390 while sporting a .940 fielding percentage at arguably the toughest position on the field, shortstop. He was MVP of the New Britain Fast Pitch League in 1978 and was chosen by his Domars/ Callahans teammates as their MVP each year he was with the team. Scott now resides in the city of Waterbury with his wife Lynne of 40 years. They have six children-Kelly, Andrea, Scotty, Joey, Suzy and Cathy. He is also the proud Pa of eleven grandchildren.



Scott Phelps

One of the best third baseman in the annals of Connecticut Fast Pitch history, Scott Phelps earned his Hall of Fame berth by being an integral part of several Hartford area championship teams in his 16 year career. Scott was known for coming up with big defensive stops at key moments of games.

Scott and his brother, Buddy Phelps (CT ASA Hall of Famer-2015), successfully held down the left side of the infield for the majority of Scott's playing career.

Beginning with the Spigot Cafe (1972-1973), he went on to Jet Concrete Construction (1974-1975), Brother Bones Cafe (1976-1977), Cypress Arms (1978-1982), Beacon Cafe & Dorber

Graphics (1983-1984), American Tool (1985) and Shannon's Cafe (1986). In addition to being regular participants in several well known local tournaments such as the Jim French Tournament in Groton and the Canton Tournament, Scott's teams participated in the Connecticut State ASA Tournament every year from 1978 thru 1986. In 1981, the Cypress Arms had a bye to the N.E. Regionals. That year, Phelps led the Cypress Arms in nearly all offensive categories.

He and his Cypress Arm teammates won three straight State Titles in 1978, 1979 and 1980. They also earned berths in the ASA New England Regionals each year from 1978 thru 1981. His Dorber Graphics squad participated in the 1984 ASA New England Major Division Regionals.


His "back to back" home run (following Cypress first baseman Peter Curran) sealed the team's first state tournament title in 1978.

Phelps played for a number of excellent managers including Peter Riccio, Ned Wentworth, Mike Corrado, John Farrell, Rich Wilkison, Ron Cox, Sr. and Kevin O'Leary.

In addition to his brother Buddy, Scott played alongside CT ASA Hall of Famers Billy Campbell, Dean Lang, Ron Cox, Jr., Billy Benzing, Rich Wilkison, John Nedesko, Vinnie Mahoney, Jim Berry and Mike Matterazzo.

After his playing days were over, Scott continued to contribute to the game by managing the Old Lyme Little League, Senior, and Summer League teams from 1987 thru 1999. Five of those teams won league championships.

Scott and his wife Daria have raised four children and now have five grandchildren. They continue to make their home in Old Lyme.



George Perlotto

Pitcher, first base, third base. George Perlotto handled each of those positions in a career that spanned four decades.

From 1961 until 1993, he shared his talents with several Northwest Connecticut teams. Plus he also played while serving his country in the U.S. Army both in Vietnam and while stationed in Fort Bragg, NC.

Amongst the Connecticut teams for which he played were Cavallieri Post 38, Celeste Restaurant, Gahan's Cafe, Zion Church, Torrington Northstars, Torrington Ram Merchants and Hemlock Construction.

While compiling local league championships over the years in Torrington, Waterbury, Col-

linsville and Hartford, George also was a member of State Class A Championship squads in 1985 and 1989.

New England Regional Class A titles were also recorded by his teams in 1986 and 1989.

George played at the U.S. Army National Championships in Fort Rucker, AL in 1970 and the ASA National Class A Championships in 1989 in Highland, IN. In a career in which George played over 1100 games, he compiled a lifetime batting average over .370, highlighted by a .472 average in 1970.

He also had a pitching won-loss record of 379-98 with a 21-4 ledger in 1990 being his best season. He struck out over 3000 batters and finished with an ERA of 2.42.

Although his playing credentials are quite impressive, George is probably most proud of what he has done after his playing days were over.

In 2001, he began giving pitching lessons out of his home. In 2005, what began essentially as a hobby, turned into a full fledged business, Fastpitch Dynamics LLC.

He now averages 25-30 students a year with many of his past successes pitching, not only in high school, but at all levels of the college game.

Several of his students have won Pitcher of the Year and All State Awards as well as earning athletic scholarships.

He was also coaching youth softball and is a recruiting consultant for several college programs.

George now resides in Granby



Ludger Bedard

One of the state's best pitchers in the late 60's, all through the 70's and concluding in 1984, Ludger Bedard put up some numbers that are worthy of a Hall of Fame inductee.

He spent 20 years plying his trade on the mound. After serving his country in the military where his playing days began, he then spent fourteen of those 20 years with St. Jerome's of the New Britain Church League while also playing two years with Reed Construction.

During his tenure with St. Jerome's they annexed five league titles and his Reed Construction teams won back to back ASA State Championships in 1976 and 1977.

Ludger also contributed to Reed Construction earning a New England Regional title and pitched for them in National Tourna-

ments in Ohio.

Consistently hurling against some of the best teams in Connecticut, such as the East Hartford Dovelettes, Celeste Restaurant of Waterbury and Reed Construction, as well as outside the state, Ludger compiled an outstanding lifetime record of 457-67 as well as an ERA under 1.00. He set a New Britain Church League record by stringing together 18 straight wins and posted a 20-1 ledger in 1975. While racking up a pair of perfect games, over ten no hitters and sixty shutouts,

Ledger averaged over ten strikeouts per game including a New Britain Church League record of 18 in one game.

He was a four time MVP of the League and also four time MVP pitcher. He was the starting pitcher in several of the League's All Star games in which they went up against some of the top teams in the state.

Ludger now makes his home in Kensington.



Rick Diniz

Quite a journey, literally, was the 43 year softball career of Rick Diniz. Beginning as a catcher in 1965, Rick took to the mound within five years and built himself a Hall of Fame caliber pitching resume that took him from coast to coast and beyond.

Two years as the catcher for Rufor Machine in Brockton, MA launched his career. After taking a year off because of injury, Rick returned to the playing field in 1968 with the California Cuties, playing in over 100 games both in the U.S. and Canada.

It was at this point that Rick transitioned to the mound. After pitching 115 games in another intercontinental tour in 1970, he eventually

returned to the Northeast and led a Falls River, MA squad to a second place finish in the New England Regionals.

His level of success continued to escalate as his 1974 and 1975 Interstate Battery teams won Regional Championships and went on to the Nationals where they finished 9th in '74 and 4th in '75.

Then, in 1976, Rick joined the Raybestos Cardinals and that legendary team went on to capture the New England Regional title and the National Championship in the Major Division.

Injuries forced him to the sidelines for two years but he returned in 1979 with the Scrapers of Poughkeepsie NY. In 1980 he and the Brewers, also from Poughkeepsie, were New York State Champions and finished 2nd in the Regionals.

In 1981 Rick came to Connecticut and spent the next decade earning a total of 6 state championships starting with Peter Pan Cafe that first year, Tanasi Construction in the mid 80's and American Legion Post 8 in the latter part of the 80's.

Outside of 1993 when he helped Post 8 earn a New England Regional runner-up finish, Rick spent to rest of his career hurling in Puerto Rico and Hispanic Leagues. He hung up his cleats in 2008 having earned numerous MVP and Outstanding Pitcher awards.

Rick's long career produced over 1000 wins on the mound and less than 100 losses. He had a cumulative ERA of a little over 1.00 and he estimated that he racked up between 7,000-8,000 strike outs.

To cap off his lengthy career, Rick umpired Fast Pitch in New York from 2003 to 2010.

After traversing the North American continent playing softball, Rick has settled down in Hartford.



Bill Baer

Versatility. That describes the 20 year playing career of Bill Baer.

Bill played every position while contributing to the making of several tournament championship teams. He finished with a lifetime batting average of over .300, belted in excess of 150 home runs and earned over 300 wins on the mound.

He began his career in 1975 with the West Hartford Trojans and, with the influence of teammates like Gene Riley, Joe and Gus Prete, Bill became totally immersed in the Fast Pitch game.

Then, two years later, Bill formed his own team in the Canton League. For the next 16 years, he

was sponsor, coach and player with his team playing under the names of Radios Unlimited, New England Video and New England Fastpitch Club.

His teams made numerous appearances in State, Regional and National ASA Tournaments.

On the state level, he had runners-up finishes in 1987, 1988 and 1990 before claiming a Class A State crown in 1991.

Titles were won on the New England Regional level in 1988, 1990 (co-champions) and 1991. Each one of those teams went to the Nationals in Fargo, North Dakota (1988), Arizona (1990) and Colorado Springs (1991) with that 1991 team finishing 24th.

On the local level, he helped earn his teams three championships in the highly competitive Canton Fast Pitch League plus capturing the Early Bird League crown in 1984 while also accumulating high finishes in state (Canton, Groton) and out of state (Middletown, NY Major) and even across the border (Grafton, Canada) tournaments.

While having a 20 year Hall of Fame worthy playing career, Bill's generosity as sponsor and coach cemented his spot in the Hall Bill calls Winsted his home.



Tony Catapano

Tony started his first softball team right out of high school in 1973. Catapano's, a neighborhood team from the Hill section of New Haven, played in the New Haven Sunday Morning League for 4 years before moving to the Tuesday Night League with Cip's Home Plate and other highly talented teams.

Catapano's made the New Haven city playoffs every year starting in 1974 and won 2 City Championships. As the team continued to pick up better players it started winning New Haven Sectionals and advancing to the State Tournament. American Plumbing sponsored Tony's team in 1980 and 1981.

In 1982 Tony met Norman Bender and that was the beginning of a soon to be championship run. While Benders won 3 New Haven City Championships, they began an ascension to bigger prizes.

The 1982 team lost in the District finals. In 1983, they won the Districts but lost in the State finals. Then in 1984, after winning the Districts, the States and the Regionals, they captured the ultimate prize, a Class A National Championship. Benders went on to win two more State Championships in 1991 and 1993, five Sectional Crowns and a total of six City titles in the always competitive New Haven League. They also won three Class A National Qualifiers.

Beginning in 2000, Benders went to six straight Over 40 Nationals, capturing two second place finishes and three thirds.

Overall Tony's teams went to 13 State Tournaments, winning three; 6 Regional Tournaments, winning two; and 16 Nationals in Class A and Masters, highlighted by their 1984 championship.

While his managerial resume was impressive enough on its own, Tony's accomplishments didn't stop there.

He's been an ASA umpire for 41 years. He served as the Special Olympics Softball Commissioner for the 1995 World Games. He has been involved with the Special Olympics State Tournament since 1996.

Also he has umpired for 15 years in the Jim Valvano Play to Win Tournament and was the Leukemia Society Tournament Director from 1990 to 1994.

Tony did play the field but it was his managerial and coaching leadership and numerous other contributions for 40 plus years that earned him this year's Bernie Iassogna Award.

He makes his home in North Branford.



John Cologgi

John began his 23 year career as a power hitting outfielder in 1983 with Redwood Inn out of Shelton. After helping Redwood reach the State ASA Tournament in his two years there, he moved on to play with some of the best slow pitch teams in Connecticut.

Beginning with a four year stint with Sikorsky Aircraft, John's resume reads like a listing of some of the all time great teams in Connecticut slow pitch annals. Milford Seafood, Sonny's, Ray's Together, Olympic Steel, Bender Plumbing, Keystone, Merrill Lynch, Century 21 and finally Steve's Sports were all championship caliber squads to who's success John contributed. State Tournament berths were almost an annual

affair for John. In his career, which ended with Steve's Sports in 2006, his teams appeared in 13 of them. There were also five trips to New England Regionals and 13 entries into the ASA Nationals.

Championship trophies were picked up along the way. His 1988 Sikorsky squad earned the Major Industrial Nationals. The 1990 Sonny's team was the Class A State titlist and the 1993 Olympic Steel team earned the Class A Industrial crown. While playing a major role in team success, John also earned himself his share of individual National Tournament honors.

In 1986 he made All Tournament second team. In 1988 he made first team. In 1991 he made first team while winning both the batting and home run titles. He also earned the National Triple Crown Points Award.

Then, with his Olympic Steel team taking home the gold in 1993, John arguably had his best year on the National stage as he made first team All Tournament while also earning MVP, batting and home run titles.

Overall John amassed over 950 home runs and maintained a lifetime batting average of .700 plus.

While acknowledged to be statistically an outstanding player both offensively and defensively, John has also added to his Hall of Fame credentials in other ways. Beginning in 1993, John donned the blue and presently serves as Vice President of the Milford Umpires Association.

He also was a member of the 2003 Century 21 team that raised nearly \$100,000 dollars for the Make-A-Wish foundation through achievements on the softball field. The team's manager, Kevin Russo, a 2015 Hall of Fame inductee, praised John not only for his playing ability but for his "leadership and non-negotiable loyalty to his team".

John resides in Bethany with his wife Lisa and their daughters Haley and Paige.



Barbara Iversen

Barbara's resume, as both a player and teacher of the game, make her an outstanding inductee into the Connecticut ASA Hall of Fame. Proving herself adept at shortstop, a position she played her entire career, she began her time on the softball field with a four year stay (1974-1977) with the Niantic Merchants. Barbara helped lead a pair of teams to State Major Championships, Buffalo Water Tavern in 1981 and Beren's Merchants in 1984. Besides Buffalo Water Tavern and Beren's, she also played with South Windsor Ten Pin, Family Pizza of Colchester and had a 19 year stint with Mr. G's of New London where she compiled a lifetime batting average of over .700.

Barbara's teams were regular State Tournament participants and made several trips to the New England Regionals and one journey to the Nationals. She accrued several tournament MVP awards.

While her playing career spanned 32 years, Barbara also contributed as a youth coach and umpire in both New London and East Lyme. She was and is a Special Olympics Volunteer in Connecticut and her present home state of California. Barbara coached a very successful Old Lyme Middle School squad and then moved on to turn the Old Lyme High School into a league powerhouse. Although selected to the Slow Pitch wing of the Connecticut ASA Hall of Fame, Barbara also made her presence known in the college Fast Pitch game. At Mitchell Junior College, she made the All Tournament Team as a freshman and, as a sophomore, she was selected as the NJCAA Region 21 2nd team catcher. She won the Varsity M Outstanding Athlete Award both years and served as the Varsity M Club President.

She also was a varsity pitcher, catcher and third baseman at Central Connecticut State for one year and had a chance to play with the Connecticut Falcons Pro team but had to refuse so as not to lose her amateur status for college play. In 1990, Barbara was inducted into both the St. Bernard High School and the Mitchell JC Athletic Halls of Fame.

Barbara now resides in Beverly Hills, California where she is Athletic Director and coaching at Milken School.



David T. Reno

Dave began his softball career in 1982 in Germany where he played three years of German/ America (All Army) Slow Pitch. Returning to the Unites States in 1985, he played in Milford for 11 years before deciding to don the "blue" in 1996. After joining the Milford Umpire Association under the direction of Tony Roberto, Dave also umpired in the West Haven and North Branford Associations.

He has worked every ASA Sectional and State Tournament along with Qualifiers since 1997 while also being a voIunteer umpire for Special Olympics.

Dave became the UIC for the North Branford Association in 2002 and was named the Assistant

UIC for Slow Pitch in the State of Connecticut in 2015. While his involvement and achievements locally are impressive, he has accumulated an outstanding resume at the National level.

In 2005 he worked the Men's Class C in Valdosta, GA. He made four appearances (2007, 2010 thru 2012) for the Men's Class A at the ASA Complex in Oklahoma City.

Dave worked with his son Christopher at the 2009 Men's Class D in Salem, VA and received a perfect 60 for 60 officiating evaluation in both the 2013 Men's Class A in Alabama and the 2014 Armed Services Men's in Fort Sill, OK.


He was invited to umpire in the 2015 Armed Forces National Men's at Camp Lejeune, NC but could not attend because of work.

Most recently he umpired in the 2016 Border Battle in early July between the United States and Canada's best players at the ASA Complex in Oklahoma City. He's also been invited to officiate at the A Major Men's Nationals at the end of September. His devotion to umpiring have earned him several awards such as the National Indicator Award and all four Medal Awards (Gold, Silver, Bronze & Blue). He was the first slow pitch umpire to receive the prestigious award ELITE in Connecticut & Region #1.

Dave also gives of his time to charitable work. For the past 6 years he has run the Turkey Shoot Out which raises funds for Ct Hospice, Milford Food Bank, Toys for Tots, Breast Cancer, Cancer, Wounded Warriors along with donating funds to various umpire, players, coaches, etc. in a time of need or sickness.

Dave is a member of the New Haven Football Officials Association and is a Varsity official for the New Haven Basketball Board #10.

Milford is where Dave calls home.



Barry Schueler

For a career that spanned 36 years and is still continuing with his playing in the Milford Over 50 League, Barry was an integral part of several of the top teams in the state. Playing in the outfield and also at second base, he ended up with a lifetime batting average of over .600 and a home run total exceeding 800. Barry began his career in 1980 with Shineys of Westport and was quickly recognized as a power hitting outfielder. After four years with Shiney's, he moved on to Sonny's of Westport where he became the cleanup hitter from 1983 to 1990 for the 5 times Connecticut Class A Champions.

A ten year stint with Ray's Softball of Bridge-

port followed. During those ten years, Ray's captured the 1995 Connecticut Class A Championship, the 1998, 2000 and 2001 State Class B crowns and the 2004 Over 35 State Title.

Also included in Barry's Hall of Fame resume were Over 35 titles with the Fly Juice 35 squad in 1999 and 2000, Class C Championships with Steve's Sports in 2002 and 2004 and a Co-ed crown with Slate Rock in 2012.

While highly successful at the state level, Barry's teams also appeared in seven New England Regionals, winning a championship in 1989. He also played in over 25 National Tournaments spanning Class A, B, C, over 35, over 45 and Coed.


Barry also earned several individual honors. While playing with Ray's, he made 1st Team All American in 1994 and 2nd Team in 1995. He also was 1st Team All American at the Major level with Calise's in 1998 and 1st Team Over 40 with Bender's in 2004. Numerous other MVP honors were earned at other prestigious tournaments throughout the Northeast.

His numbers and accomplishments speak for themselves but the glowing tributes that Barry was given in the nomination process regarding his dedication to the game by both teammates and opponents complete his Hall of Fame credentials. Barry has also given of his talents by coaching both of his children in youth girl's softball and boy's basketball in his home town of Trumbull over the past 13 years.




