

In August 2006, the sport of softball in Connecticut became unified in honoring its past with the merging of its fast pitch and slow pitch Halls of Fame. Prior to this merger, the two entities had each separately elected and inducted members to their respective Halls of Fame. That changed with the formation of one combined Hall of Fame to be known as the Connecticut ASA Hall of Fame.

USA Softball of Connecticut commissioner Hank Koritkoski oversees the umbrella organization with the fast pitch and slow pitch committees continuing to function as separate groups in selecting candidates for the USA Softball of Connecticut Hall of Fame.

USA Softball of Connecticut stages an annual Hall of Fame dinner to formally induct its new members.

The Fast Pitch Hall of Fame was established in 1971, with the Slow Pitch Hall starting in 1985. Committees to select Hall of Famers meet frequently and accept nominations for new candidates. To be eligible for consideration, a player must be retired for 5 years or, if the player is over 50 years of age, the 5 year waiting period is waived.

For nominees, applications should be submitted to the Hall of Fame committee chairs by April 1 each year. Any individual who had an outstanding softball career in Connecticut is eligible, with emphasis on state, regional and national tournament play as one of the important criteria for Hall of Fame consideration. Applications are available on our state website.

In 2017 Connecticut ASA re-branded to USA Softball of Connecticut and officially opened its physical Hall of Fame display which is located at Erin's Gym in Stratford.

Kathy Arendsen

Early on Kathy established her Hall of Fame credentials as she pitched her Holland Christian High School team to the 1976 Michigan Class B State Championship.

That success continued at the collegiate level as her Texas Woman's University squad captured the 1979 AIAW College World Series before she hurled Chico State University to the AIAW Division 3 College World Series title in 1980.

While still in college, Kathy joined the Raybestos Brakettes in 1978 for, what would prove to be, a long and illustrious 15 year career.

During her tenure with them, the Brakettes captured nine ASA National Championships.

Kathy represented the country honorably with the USA National Softball team. They won the ISF World Championship three times. The first came in 1978 in San Salvador, El Salvador. The second was in 1986 in Auckland, New Zealand where Kathy won the Outstanding Pitcher award. And the third was in 1990 in Normal, IL.

The National team also won the 1979 Pan American Games in San Juan, Puerto Rico. Kathy had the honor of being the flag bearer in the closing ceremony. They had a runner up finish in the 1983 Pan Am Games in Caracas, Venezuela.



Kathy was a USA Softball Olympic Team Selection Committee member from 1994-2000. She was in a 1981 ABC Wide World of Sports episode in which she struck out Reggie Jackson. Also, in 1981, 60 Minutes had a feature story about the Brakettes. And she appeared in a PM Magazine television episode, pitching to the Durham Bulls.

Kathy now makes her home in Green Valley, Arizona.



Dick Ayer

Dick had a fifteen year modified softball pitching career and, in fourteen of those years, his team qualified for the State Tournament. Quite an accomplishment.

From 1983 until 1986 he hurled for Skider's Gym. He racked up a 25-3 record his first year with Skider's. That 1983 squad won the first of three consecutive Connecticut State Modified Championships and also qualified for the Nationals in Austin, MN.

They also made the 1984 Nationals in Morristown, TN.

Dick played with the Owls in 1987 before spending the next eleven years with American

Sportsworld where he was part of another State Championship team in 1989. The 1998 Sportsworld team played in the New England Regionals in Massachusetts.

Other teams Dick pitched for were Red's Hardware (Thomaston Sunday League) 1987-1997, Thomaston Fish and Game (Thomaston League) 1988-1995 and the Raiders (West Hartford Fall League) 1990-1996

He totaled an estimated 185 pitching wins in ASA league play and was part of six league champion combines.

While compiling some impressive playing statistics, Dick also was an outstanding coach.

For 31 years he led the varsity softball program at Shepaug Valley High School.

His 452-162 coaching record, which was the fifth highest win total in Connecticut at the time of his retirement, was highlighted by State Championships in 1978 and 1992.

Dick was chosen the 1990 Connecticut High School Coach of the Year.

He was co-founder of the Shepaug Softball Little League for Region 12 towns.

Dick makes his home in Plymouth, CT.



Jon Brandt

Launching his 25 year Hall of Fame worthy softball journey in 1988 in Hartford area league play, Jon got his first taste of success beyond the local level in 1990 when his Heavenly Hog/Pagani Caterers team finished second in the Eastern Class B Sectionals and qualified for the State Tournament.

He joined B & G Lounge & Pierce Construction in 1991. In each of his four years there the team produced a top three finish in the Eastern Class B Sectionals plus a trip to the State Tournament in 1993.

1995 saw Jon switch allegiance to Steele Wheels/Kahoot's/Wish's. In his six years there, they captured the Eastern Class B Sectional title five times and made the States each year, winning the Class B Title in 1995 which earned them a trip to the Nationals. They also racked up four other top four State Tourney finishes and earned berths in both the 1996 and the 1998 Regionals, the latter producing a second place finish.

They made trips to the National Tournament in 1997 (13th place), 1998 and 1999 in addition to participating in National Qualifiers in 1996 and 1997 (2nd place). 2001 saw Jon join National Gold/ Team Demarini. They earned a fourth place finish in the Class B States and followed that up with fifth place honors in the 2002 Class A Nationals.

In 2004 Jon helped Monaco Ford achieve a third place finish in the Class C States before joining Giant Glass in 2005 when they placed ninth in the Class B Nationals. Jon also enjoyed success at the Major level. He was with TPS/Checking/Starr when they captured the 1995 Louisville Slugger Tourney.

In 1996 he latched on with Midas Touch Jewelers when they earned a fourth place finish in the Major National, winning six straight after losing their opening game. Overall he was part of over 20 regular season league and playoff title teams and contributed to numerous other tourney title runs by his teams throughout the Northeast.

Jon compiled a lifetime batting average of over .700 with 500 plus home runs. An outstanding defensive pitcher, he amassed over 800 mound wins in tournament play.

He earned over 15 MVP awards including co-MVP of the 1995 B States.

Jon was also the manager/coach and the secondary sponsor for the teams he played on in the 90's.

Jon makes his home in Manchester.



Barbara Clark

Barbara was a member of the dominant Raybestos Brakettes of the 1970's. She began her career with them in 1970 when they placed second in the Fast Pitch Women's Major National Tournament.

Then, for the next eight years, the Brakettes reigned supreme, winning the Fast Pitch Major

National title each of those years with Barbara on board.

She was on the teams that captured the 1974 World Championship in Stratford and the 1978 World Championship in San Salvador, El Salvador.

Barbara caught for five ASA Hall of Fame pitchers: Joan Joyce, Donna Lopiano, Diane Schumacher, Kathy Arendsen and Barbara Reinalda.

In addition to catching, she also played the outfield.

Barbara served as an assistant coach with Micki Stratton at the University of Bridgeport.

She resides on a farm in Milford that has been in her family for generations.



Michael Fanara

For many years, baseball was big in Michael's life. He competed at the collegiate level for the University of New Haven.

Upon leaving college, softball opened up another opportunity of competitive play for Michael. He said that he was thankful for the many teammates he had over the years that allowed his different teams to win countless tournaments and travel the country.

Launching his Hall of Fame softball career in 1994, which is still continuing today, Michael has displayed his talents for some of the best teams in Connecticut: East Coast Security, Latella's,

Cable Systems, Connecticut Sportsplex, Steve's Sports and Ray's Together.

Versatile enough to play all the outfield positions, middle infield and second base, he sports a lifetime batting average of approximately .685 while also hitting over 300 home runs.

Highlighting his 27 year resume of playing in over 50 National Tournaments were three National Championships and four State titles—two Men's, one Co-ed and one Senior.

Michael also was the recipient of eleven All Tournament awards.

While still being an active player, he is also in his sixth year of umpiring in Milford. He has volunteered as an umpire and for numerous other duties for Tom and Tim Collins in their yearly Swing for a Cure Tournament.

Michael now resides in Milford.



Alison Hudyma

Instilled with a love for the game by her father at an early age, Alison started playing baseball with the boys until she eventually found Babe Ruth Softball in her home town of Stamford. Alison played softball in middle school and high school, making varsity as a freshman playing second base. After her freshman year she joined the Wildcats travel team, playing second and third base. As a senior, she was the recipient of the Allyson Rioux Award, a scholarship that recognizes top student athletes in Stamford.

Recruited as a utility infielder by UCONN, Alison quickly established herself as the team's starting second baseman her freshman year. UCONN won the Big East Tournament that year and ended the

season in the top 25. Alison was a starter all four years and proved her versatility by playing First her sophomore year, shortstop as a junior, and third her senior year.

After her sophomore year she played one season for the Brakettes before moving on to the Montclair Majestics (NJ) for a few more years. After graduating from UCONN Alison transitioned to the slow pitch game. For 18 years she was part of several league championship caliber teams, both women and coed.

In 2013, Alison was inducted into The Fairfield County Sports Hall of Fame. UConn Hall of Fame pays tribute to athletes from Fairfield County who had stellar careers at UConn.

After college Alison coached for Wilton High School Varsity team as an assistant coach for two years and head coach for one.

Alison played for Partner's Pizza (Norwalk), Longfords (Stamford), Oracle (Milford), Jennie's Pizza (Monroe) and for women's travel on Slammers (NJ) and Storm (Westport). She also won a State Title with Storm.

She played coed with Jake's Place (Darien), Slaterock (Westport), K-Star (Milford), and Total Look Salon & Spa (Westport) and coed travel with Slaterock and Total Look.

Slaterock was an exceptional team, winning State Titles in 2004, 2005, 2008, 2011, 2012, finishing second in 2010 and winning National Championships in 2008 and 2009.

Alison slowed her softball career drastically after wanting to spend time with her family and sustaining a shoulder injury in 2018. She continues to coach for her daughter and volunteer as the Coaching Coordinator for Monroe Baseball and Softball Little League. She plays here in there, helping out friends when they are in need of an extra player, and always for the annual memorial game for fallen police officers.

Alison makes her home in Monroe.



George “Goose” Legierse

George, better known as “Goose”, compiled a list of impressive accomplishments, both individual and team wise in his 27 year career.

After starting his softball journey in 1992, he played every year in Connecticut State Tournaments from 1994 until 2006. Included in those appearances were the following championships: 1998 Co-Ed with GMC Mortgage, 1999 Class B with ChecKing/Worth, 2002 Class A with ChecKing / Worth, 2003 and 2004 Class B with ChecKing / Worth and 2005 Class A with ChecKing / Worth/Hit n Run.

“Goose” played in a Class A or Class B National every year since 1995, bringing home the Over 35 championship with Production Painting in 2008 and the Class B Eastern title with ChecKing/ Worth in 2009. He also played tournaments with Barchellas Fellas (1995-1998).

“Goose” was part of 17 Stamford A League championships (1996-2019) and 9 Connecticut Sportsplex A League titlelists (1999-2009). Teams he played with were Pasiak Trucking, Matthew/ Tucci Lumber, Finescape, Premier Lighting Group and ChecKing/ Worth.

Throughout his career he played left field, catcher and pitcher while maintaining a .700 batting average year after year but he is better known for his power which included hitting over 2000 home runs.

“Goose” earned Connecticut State Tournament MVP honors three times: 2002 and 2005 Class A and 2003 Class B. He also made the 2008 National Over 35 All Tournament team.

He has participated in multiple charity events and fund raisers supporting ASA softball.

“Goose” now makes his home in Stamford, CT with his lovely & “supportive” wife, Lori, and two dogs, Koda & Stella.



Don Lewis

Don launched his 35 year softball career in 1975, playing with and contributing to several league title winning teams in Central Connecticut.

Amongst those teams were Marsal Realty and McNeil's Pharmacy (Cromwell), Airex (Plainville), St. Francis Club, Portland Restaurant (Portland), Wethersfield Sanzaro Landscaping and The Club (Glastonbury).

His Fireside Cafe out of Moodus, who won three straight league titles (1976-1978), qualified for the ASA Central Sectionals in each of those years.

In 1984 Don joined Iffland Lumber, one of the state's top tier teams of the 80's. They won the Class A Northern Sectionals, placed second in the State

Tournament and participated in the New England Regionals. They also captured the Central Connecticut State League title.

The 1985 team captured the State Class A championship. 1986 saw Iffland win several top level tournaments throughout the northeast, finishing off their season with a trip to the Class A Nationals where they finished 25th out of a 70 team field.

They won their Class A Sectional Tournament in both 1987 and 1989, were State runner up both years and finished third in the New England Regionals in 1987.

Don left Iffland after the 1990 but continued to be part of local league title winning squads. Amongst those were Al's Mobil, T.E. Burkes, The Polish Club, Marlborough Wranglers, Cafe 66 and Rand Construction.

All together he was part of 32 league championship teams and a half dozen Over 40 titleists.

Primarily a left or left center fielder, he maintained a .500 lifetime batting average. He made many All Tournament teams and won several tourney MVP awards. Don wore other hats outside of softball. He was the financial guy for the Fireside Cafe and Airex softball teams.

He played semi-pro basketball with the East Hartford Explorers in the New England Basketball Association, was league MVP twice and scoring leader three times before leaving the team to launch his own franchise, Airex. He was player-coach, took care of the finances and handled the behind the scenes duties (securing playing sites, scorekeepers, timers. etc.). And he took care of the press coverage.

He was Commissioner of the Middlesex Over 40 Softball League from 2000 to 2008. For 35 years Don has organized and run an annual Christmas Party for distribution of toys to the Portland Youth Organization and food for the Portland Food Bank.

He has held a "pig roast" for over 30 years for charity.

Don, who was truly a Renaissance Man, resides in Cromwell.



Tommy Malinoski

Gifted with both power and speed, Tommy had a remarkable 27-year career, playing for some of the top teams in the state during the 90s and early 2000s. He refined his skills with A-1 Remodeling from 1994 to 1996, consistently batting over .700 each season, hitting more than 30 home runs, driving in over 70 runs annually and winning three division titles.

In late 1996, Tommy joined Ray's Together. Over his eight-year stint, Ray's won three Connecticut Class B State Championships (1998, 2000, 2001) and a New England Regional title. In 2001, Ray's finished seventh in the Class B Nationals, where Tommy earned second team All American

honors.

Following the retirement of Ray Montambo, Ray's Together sponsor, after the 2003 season, Tommy began a five-year tenure with CheckKing in 2004. That year, CheckKing won the Connecticut Class B State Championship and placed second in the Nationals in Oklahoma City. In 2005, they clinched the Connecticut Class A State title and finished third in the East Nationals. The 2005 team also became the Over 35 National Champion, with Tommy being named the tournament MVP. They made another appearance at the Class B East Nationals in 2007.

Locally, his teams dominated the Bethel Businessmen's League, winning championships from 2001 to 2003 and achieving the triple crown three consecutive times. In 2006, his Pippa's Sports Bar team won the Danbury A Division crown in 2010 and 2012.

Tommy's agility allowed him to cover all outfield positions, as well as play first base and catcher. He was selected for five National All Tournament teams and two All Connecticut State teams, maintaining a lifetime batting average between .650 and .685, with over 1000 home runs and 1500 RBIs.

Respected not only for his playing prowess but also as an exemplary teammate, Tommy sponsored numerous softball teams and served as a player-coach towards the end of his career. He now resides in Southbury, CT.



Stan Mardula

Stan launched his 38 year Hall of Fame career in 1980 and immediately experienced success beyond the local level when his Green Machine (Greenwich) team finished second in the Class A Connecticut State Tournament.

From 1981 through 1986 he played with VIP Limousine (becoming Delavan Deli in 1983, Dan Mar/ Delavan Deli in 1984 and DeVito Bros. in 1985). They qualified for the Connecticut State Tournament in five of those years, producing three straight second place finishes at the Major level (1981-1983). They also qualified for the New England Regionals in 1983.

The 1984 squad finished second in the highly competitive New England Softball League, in which Stan earned the league's MVP, and 1985 saw them being runner up in the Connecticut Class A States and Stan making the All Tournament team.

1987 saw Stan make the Class A Nationals with Pete's Mobil (Poughkeepsie, NY). He played Major ball with Taylor Brothers (Warwick, RI) in 1988 and then returned to Pete's in 1989 for a return trip to the Class A Nationals where they finished 17th.

The 90's saw continued success for Stan. His 1990 Brothers AC (Yonkers, NY) were New York State Regional champions and finished 17th in the Class A Nationals. After a season with Keystone/ Arno Construction (1991) Stan returned to the tournament trail as his Bank of New York (Westchester, NY) team finished ninth in the Class A Nationals in both 1992 and 1993.

After a second place finish in the Connecticut Class A States and a trip to the New England Regionals with LA Deluca in 1994, Stan was part of the Class A Over 35 19th Hole Connecticut State Champions in 1996 and Fly Juice in 1999. Both titles earned them trips to the Nationals.

Stan completed his list of Tournament credentials with a second place finish in the 2001 State Industrial Class A tourney and a trip to the 50 and Over Nationals in 2018.

He was also part of 30 local league champions, 20 in Greenwich and 10 in Stamford. Stan compiled a lifetime batting average of around .625 while also hitting over 700 home runs. He was a slick fielding first baseman who also played the outfield and caught.

Stan is still active in senior leagues, both as player and manager, in his home town of Greenwich and Jupiter, FL. He was an ASA umpire for ten years and is a proud member of the Knights of Columbus and the Loyal Order of Moose. Stan now resides in Palm Beach Gardens, FL.



Mike Mattern

Mike was a two sport athlete, baseball and basketball, at the University of New Haven in the early 80's. He was talented enough on the diamond to be drafted by the Cincinnati Reds in 1983.

After playing one season in the Reds' farm system, he turned his attention to softball in 1984 and began a 23 year Hall of Fame career.

Frog Pond out of Stratford was the first stop for Mike before catching on with Avco-Lycoming in 1985.

He played with Avco-Lycoming for six years. In each of those six years they were both the Connecticut State and New England Regional Class A Industrial champions. They also went on to win the National Class A Industrial crowns in 1986, 1989 and 1990 and added a second place finish in 1988.

A two year stint with Midas Touch Jewelers (1991-1992) added a New England Regional title in 1991 to Mike's resume before he duplicated that feat with Ray's Together in 1993.

Bender Plumbing (1994) followed by Barcelo Fellas (1995) and Steve's Sports (1996-1999) were the next stops for Mike before he joined Pitney-Bowes in 1999. That Pitney-Bowes squad captured the Connecticut Class A Industrial championship in 1999 and 2001 thru 2006.

He also participated in local league play with Windmill (1992-1996), Mario's Cafe (2001-2003) and the Ascot Club (2004-2006).

Mike played outfield as well as all the infield positions while compiling a lifetime batting average of over .600.

He participated in at least one National Tournament per year from 1985 thru 2006 and earned several All Tournament team selections at the state, regional and national levels.

With softball now in his rear view mirror, Mike has become an avid pickleball player and golfer.

Off the playing field, Mike has volunteered his time to helping the Special Olympics.

Mike now resides in Shelton.



Tom Oliver

Tom began his umpiring journey in 1992 in Stamford.

After honing his skills in the local slow pitch leagues for a few years, leagues in which he still works to this day, Tom was introduced to the fast pitch game where he began to earn assignments at the state, regional and national levels.

Tom has worked the highest level of youth Fast Pitch softball, 18 Gold. He has been to that national nine times, receiving assignments such as loser bracket finals and championship plates.

He has also done the 18 JO Cup three times. He enjoys traveling the country, working tournaments in many states, coast to coast and border to border.

On the slow pitch side, Tom has officiated in three National Tournaments, Class D and E and Co-ed.

He has earned the National Indicator Fraternity Award and has been honored as an Elite Umpire by USA Softball.

Tom has umpired numerous CIAC League Championships as well as State Tournament finals.

At the collegiate level he has done six NCAA Regionals and been a crew chief of four Super Regionals.

Tom makes his home in Stamford.

Angela “Angie” Palmieri



Angie was the founder of the First Bank women's softball team in 1979. For 24 years she served as both player and coach for that team which excelled in the New Haven Bank League and became a state power under the Minit Print/Docuprint banner.

She was primarily a left fielder but was versatile enough to play all the outfield positions.

Angie maintained a .500 plus lifetime batting average and was voted the team M.V.P. four consecutive years (1979-1982).

As a coach, she had an outstanding eye for choosing players with just the right fit. Although the team held its own on the offensive side, Angie prided herself in recruiting players who excelled defensively.

Her teams claimed eight ASA Connecticut State championships in 14 State Tournament appearances. The team also captured two New England Regional championships in nine trips and qualified for the Nationals ten times.

While leading Minit Print to a high level of success, Angie also became a coaching tandem with her husband Ken, himself a Hall of Fame inductee in 2014, as he led his men's teams to several city league titles, a multitude of local tournament titles and six ASA Sectional Tournament appearances.

Angie now resides with husband Ken in Branford.



Dave Pierson

Dave is being inducted into the Connecticut ASA/ USA Softball Hall of Fame for his outstanding umpiring career. But, as will be noted, there's more to Dave than softball.

After advancing through the Cromwell elementary school system, Dave graduated from Xavier High School in Middletown where he was a four year starter on both the baseball and soccer teams. He went on to college where he earned both bachelor's and advanced degrees.

Shortly after, Dave got involved in officiating. For 33 years (and still going) he has umpired softball in high school, college and summer leagues. He has done numerous CIAC as well as ASA/ USA Softball Tournament games.

Included in his impressive resume are three Northeast Regional Men's and Women's Slow Pitch Tournaments, innumerable State Tournaments as well as Unified Special Olympics Softball.

In 2017 Dave traveled to Bismark, ND for the North America Special Olympics Unified Finals 2017 where he was featured in "Blues Across America" magazine for service on and off the ball field.

Dave has also been a baseball umpire for 25 years, working high school, college and American Legion ball. He has done numerous CIAC Tournament games including three State Tourney finals plus he has made a pair of appearances in American Legion State Tournaments.

His officiating versatility also extends into soccer where he has had a twelve year career including State Tournament matches.

Dave was inducted into the Cromwell Sports Hall of Fame in 2015 and the Middletown Sports Hall of Fame in 2022.

He was a softball bat tester at numerous state and two National Tournaments and score keeper at two Nationals.

Dave serves as a meet and greet ticket seller at both Cromwell High School basketball games (40+ years) and Portland High School (7+ years).

And he has been a volunteer at our Hall of Fame dinners for several years.


Outside of the sports field he has taught English and Special Education at both the elementary and high school level.

Mike “King” Piroh

Mike was a ball boy and eventually the official scorekeeper at the famous Raybestos Field in Stratford during its heyday in the late 70's and 80's which inspired him to go onto his amazing softball journey.

Beginning in 1987 and still continuing today, he has been part of several of the state's top teams over the last 30 plus years, contributing to their success beyond the local level.

The 90's had Mike being a member of the 1993 Connecticut Class A State Tournament runner-up team that also played in the New England Regionals.

In 1996 he helped Keystone Construction finish fifth out of 117 teams in the Class B Nationals.

During the stretch from 2000 to 2005, his Steve's Sports squad won the 2000 Class C Central Sectionals, captured four Class C State titles (2000, 2002, 2004, 2005), in addition to a runner-up spot in 2001, and a fifth place finish in the 2002 Nationals in Montgomery, AL in a 100 team tourney.

That same time period saw him with Ray's Softball as they won consecutive Over 35 State Championships in 2004 and 2005.

In 2013 he helped King's Court capture the Class D Sectionals. They repeated that feat in 2014 before finishing second in the State Tournament and then going on to finish first out of 67 teams in that year's Class D Eastern Nationals.

After 2019 and 2020 produced both back to back Wood Bat State Championships and Over 40 National runners-up for Mike, he and his Steve's Sports teammates captured the National Over 50 Major crown in 2022.

“King” also played two seasons with perennial powerhouse CheckKing.

He is a lifetime .650 hitter with over 500 home runs. Early on he played right centerfield before transforming into an outstanding fielding first baseman in his later years.

In Steve's Sports 2002 great run in the Nationals, Mike made the All American team and was the National Home Run Champion with eight round trippers. For his career he's earned a dozen All Tournament team honors.

For almost the last twenty years, while still playing, Mike has also sponsored and coached teams.

He has been a Social Studies teacher at Bunnell High School for the last 27 years along with coaching baseball and soccer.

Mike continues to play in the Senior Over 50 division with Steve's Sports. One of the major reasons he looks forward to each season is enjoying the friendships and the camaraderie between players.

“King” now resides in Milford with his girlfriend Deb.



Bob Rome

After launching his Hall of Fame softball career in 1982, Bob manned the shortstop position for some of the top Milford and state teams for the next 35 years.

Seven Seas (1982) and Bobby V's (1983) were his first stops before he began a twelve year stint with perennial powerhouse Devon News/Milford Seafood/ Time Out (1984-1995).

Bob moved on to Knickerbockers in 1996, Davco in 1997 and Merrill Lynch (1998-1999). In 2000 he began play in Over 35 leagues, advancing to Over 40 and Over 50 play before hanging up his glove and spikes in 2017.

All told he played in 19 Connecticut State Tournaments, 10 New England Regionals and 6 Nationals. His teams also won 12 Milford City titles.

A lifetime .575-.600 hitter who also hit approximately 525 home runs, Bob won six Tournament MVP's and made an All Tournament team in Burlington, NC.

Impressive as all his on the field accomplishments were, his workings behind the scene were equally admirable.

Bob was the team leader at designing and advancing a "vision" that Foote Field in Milford be modified from a recreational field to an official ASA tournament facility – fencing, lights, paved lots. The field was completed in 2020 and Bob was the Milford point-person from start to finish.

He also is a volunteer umpire for the annual Devon News Early Bird Tournament and is a participant in the annual Easter Seals and Heart Association tournaments. True to his softball resume and to the contributions he has made to the game, Bob makes his home in Milford.



Don Stokes

From 1986 until 2004 Don Stokes was one of the top modified pitchers in the state.

For the first fifteen years of his career he hurled for Jake's Auto Body/ Lithuanian Club. During that time span they garnered five Connecticut Modified State Championships, including four consecutive, and added three runner up finishes. They placed second twice in New England Regional Tournaments, once in Vermont and once in Maine, and had a fourth place finish in a 10 Man Modified National Tourney in Meadville, PA.

Jake's Auto Body/ Lithuanian Club also traveled to Spokane, WA, Atlanta, GA and Coral Gables, FL for National Modified Tournaments in addition to other high profile tourneys throughout the Northeast.


They captured innumerable league titles in Waterbury, Watertown, Thomaston, Prospect, Torrington and the Bridgeport Salsa League.

Don had a remarkable 41-4 State Tournament pitching record. He won over 20 games every year for 14 years for Jakes /Lit Club and totaled 291 wins.

He completed his career with Townplot Spirit Shop (2001-2004), adding two more state titles to his resume.

Don finished with a lifetime batting average of .405 while, in addition to being on the mound, also playing first base and DHing.

Ralph Vittorio

Ralph played sixteen years of ASA fast pitch softball with two teams.

He launched his career in 1970 with Blanchette Sporting Goods out of Shelton, spending three years with them and being a contributor to their capturing the 1972 Housatonic Fast Pitch League championship.

In 1973 Ralph joined Dorber Graphics from Milford. As an assistant coach and a top-of-the-order contact hitter, he helped lead Dorber to five Connecticut ASA Fast Pitch State Championships, five Housatonic Fast Pitch League titles and one Plainville Connecticut

State Fast Pitch League crown before retiring after the 1986 season.

Ralph's overall batting average while playing against the top competition on the East Coast from Pennsylvania to New Hampshire for Dorber was .345. Ralph also rose to the occasion against better pitching as illustrated by compiling a .400 average in the combined six Northeast Regional Tournaments that he played in.

With Ralph in the lineup, Dorber won one Jim French Memorial Day Tournament in Groton, CT, two Dalton, MA CRA Tournament championships and additional tournaments in Nutley, NJ, Keene, NH, and Lewisboro, NY.

Although Dorber finished second in the 1979 Philadelphia 4th of July City Tournament, Ralph was named Tournament MVP. He was also named to the Housatonic Fast Pitch League All-Star Team in multiple years.

Ralph was a standout defensively as Dorber's regular left fielder. When required he also adroitly served as catcher and at first base.

From 1970 until 1974 Ralph played on league championship ASA slow pitch teams in the Bridgeport Industrial League (Warnaco, Inc.), the Milford Sunday Evening Slow Pitch League (Dixie Farm) and in Valley leagues with Blanchette's Sporting Goods.

Ralph passed away in 2017.



Bill Uluski

Having authored over 100 Hall of Fame bios and coordinated several others with inductees who composed their own, I now have the task of writing my own which is a different and somewhat difficult experience.

First of all I am honored to be a recipient of the Bernie Iassogna Award which is presented to an individual who has contributed to the game of slow pitch other than as a player.

When I began playing in 1966 with a team whose name is lost in history, St. Tony's Tigers, the Hall of Fame didn't exist. And, even if it did, it wouldn't have entered my mind.

I played the game (average rec player at best). For fifteen years I coached Teledyne/ B & M Variety, a competitive recreational team in the Valley.

During that same time period I began a 45 year span of doing game writeups and publicity for Valley leagues and was the Valley Independent League's Commissioner for twelve years.

In 1992 I "upped" my game. Hall of Famer John Reilly put together a bunch of talented young players, including my son, and asked me to assist. They won the Central Sectionals that first year, finished in the top five in the States and qualified for the New England Regionals. They added four more Sectional titles, three more Regional trips and a National in 1996 where they finished 13th out of 132 teams. Tail Gator's was my next and final stop on the playing field in 1999. With them I got to experience two more trips to a National.

Then, in 2004, our Valley ASA Commissioner, Jim Carey, asked me to be his Assistant Commissioner. Jim was one of the most respected individuals I knew, not only in the softball and sports world, but in real life. So to say I was extremely honored would be an understatement.

Jim was the founding father of the Wood Bat State Tournament in 2008. He turned the tournament over to me in 2009 and I ran it until 2019.

In 2013 Jim brought me along to a Hall of Fame meeting. That same year Tom Chiappetta stepped down as the Hall of Fame Publicity Director which opened the door for me to do what I enjoy doing, being an advocate and proponent for the game and its people.

Ansonia has been by life long home town where I live with Betty, my wife of 56 years. We are the proud parents of son Brian (wife Debbie), daughter Robin (husband Rich) and grandparents of Marisa, Meghan, Sara, Olivia and Gabriella.
