

for two years now. It has been my privilege and pleasure to continue to use my God-given gifts and abilities among you. Some may remember when I first started that a goal we looked at together was three years. That was not set in stone and the reason I have announced my retirement at this two year mark is so that you could begin the process of calling another pastor. It

is *possible* that we could have an acceptance by another pastor sooner, rather than later. It is more *probable* that this vacancy period could stretch into a third year. We will see.

In the meantime, I am committed to serving you as best I can while the search is on. I have had some health issues that could change this plan and the status of my voice is another concern to consider – but, I will put my best foot forward to provide quality pastoral ministry to you. I am trying to work a bit less than full-time. My goal is to work an average of 30 hours a week between Sunday through Wednesday. Of course, if there are emergencies or funerals, etc., I will be ready to serve those needs on other days of the week. That's the plan from my point of view in this meantime.

As we look forward to the next pastor's coming I want to put out a strong word of encouragement to each and every member of our church to put their best foot forward as well. This is not a plea to look good for the next pastor. We all know that wouldn't work anyway. Any attempt to be on good behavior for another person would be rather short-lived. We don't usually change our actions for other human beings.

There is a commonly accepted concept known as the "80/20 principle." It applies well to church and other organizations. We are in danger of not having a successful Vacation Bible School program for lack of teachers willing to share God's Word with our young children. These are just a couple of examples we can cite. It is very realistically true, however, that if more and more people are willing to gather for worship, willing to care for one another, be involved with meaningful ministry, it appealing for will look more а prospective pastor to leave a warmer climate to move to northern Minnesota. Why? Because a good pastor thrives on the thought of leading people who are actively and faithfully following our Lord Jesus Christ. And that's the way it is!

LWML First Lutheran Women in Mission: Here are the highlights of what the LWML (Lutheran Women's Missionary League) at First Lutheran has been doing to serve The Lord and our church. As you may know we are focused on missions, in our church, our community and the world. Many of the activities we do throughout the year support these missions.

1. Our Mite Box contributions are submitted to LWML MN North District. The district keeps 75% for our district mission grants and 25% is sent to the national LWML to support their mission grants. In 2019 our Mite box Offerings were \$569.93. Posted on the bulletin board by the fellowship hall are the mites collected by month for 2019 and also a listing of the district mission grants the mites are supporting 2018-2020. FYI at our District Convention in June the delegates will be voting on new mission grants for the 2020-2022 Biennium. At last report we were about \$9,000.00 from meeting our District mission grant goal.

2. Our "Cookies for Coins" freewill offering in October was \$474.32. These funds were designated for mites only. These funds were submitted to LWML MN North District for our District Mission Grants. Thank you to everyone who baked , bought or contributed to this.

3. Our 2019 society missions were supported by the following activities. These funds are designated for our society missions only: Summer Concert Series Lunch-\$411.39, Sunday morning coffee-\$749.85, December bake sale-\$512.25, Red Stocking offerings-\$238.79, Lenten supper-\$146.00 & Advent supper-\$172.36. Our First Lutheran LWML Executive Board met January 8, 2020 and decided on distribution of our society mission funds as follows: Concordia Seminary-St Louis, Food Bank-\$500.00, Concordia Theological Seminary-Fort Wayne, Food & Clothing Coop-\$500.00, Elder Circle Assisted Transportation-\$230.00, Grace House of Itasca County-\$200.00 and \$800.00 designated to sponsor a college student(not determined yet) for Alaskan Mission Trip in June 2020.

4. In 2019 our funeral ministry served 8 funeral lunches. Thank you to everyone who helped with this ministry to our members' families. Each year we donate \$15.00 per funeral to our library to purchase a memorial book/books in memory of our members who have passed away.

5. We served the youth of our congregation breakfast at their lock-in. We hosted a birthday party one month at Grand Village. And we bought kitchen supplies and equipment for the kitchen.


