



This month we traditionally set aside a day of thanksgiving in our nation. We do indeed live in a blessed land – God has been so good to us and it is our privilege to thank Him for His bounty. In this letter let me point out that we are not just citizens of a truly bountiful land. Above and beyond this we have been called by name by the Holy Spirit of God to be citizens of heaven temporarily living in this beautiful country.

As sons and daughters of God, redeemed by the blood of His Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, we are called to live by higher standards than those who do not follow Jesus. We are to walk by faith – not by sight. We are to see things differently than those who do not have a faith perspective. The greatest difference, of course, is that believing children of God will spend eternity in a vastly different place than those who choose not to put their trust in Jesus.

In this temporal realm, however, the difference between us is in how we think, how we speak, and how we act toward others. When it comes to standards to live by, the worldly view is "whatever." This usually means whatever is good for me, whatever I feel like doing, whatever I want. When it comes to our dealings with those who disagree with us, we do whatever we want because our opinion matters the most.

Walking by faith gives us a much different "whatever" to live by. It is based on whatever God provides, whatever God instills within us, whatever God grants us by His grace. Anyone can see the obvious. Anyone can be annoyed by what goes against our grain. Anyone can become angered by a difference of opinion. We are called by the Holy Spirit to look beyond the obvious and the outward.


The Holy Spirit is our teacher who equips us to see whatever is honorable. Putting our faith into action trains us to look past what is our point of view to see whatever is based on God's just standards. It also enables us to see whatever is pure – not stained by a self-centered preference. Let's face it, even in church there are occasional flashes of our "ugly self," but when the emotions subside, let's look instead to whatever is lovely about those who beg to differ with us. This gives us the grace to focus on whatever is commendable in others.

All these traits are part of what it means to put Christian love into action. When the apostle Paul discussed the various gifts people are given within the church he recognized how good gifts can become divisive. Our gifts tend to give us a primary vantage point to see how things should be done. An equally valid, but different view, should not cause strife, but should complement the other. For all the possible misunderstandings that arise because we have differing gifts, Paul sums it up by saying, "Let me show you a still more excellent way" (I Cor. 12:31). Then he writes an entire chapter about love. We are to think about what this more excellent way is and take note of the qualities in others that are worthy of praise and generously dole out our thanksgivings to those who are worthy of our praise and thanks.

The reward for thinking about whatever is good is that the God of peace is with us. We are very used to hearing about the peace of God which passes understanding. That peace helps us to concentrate on Christ Jesus rather than the "what if's" in life. This reward surpasses even the peace of God. The promise is that God, who is peace, is with us and dwelling in us.

Have a very good Thanksgiving Day, but even better, have a thankful life. Thank God for who He is. Thank Him for calling us to be His very own children. Thank Him for your brothers and sisters in Christ that you have the privilege of worshipping with regularly. THINK ABOUT THESE THINGS.

Youth Ministry

The Holy Spirit has been hard at work with the youth this fall so far! Here is what we have been up to are looking forward to.

Release Time started in October and all 22 students in grades 3rd-5th have a prayer partner! Thank you, prayer partners! We had our first meet and greet on October 23rd where they were able to get to know their partner while eating a fun snack and making their journal that will be passed back and forth. Release time is a great opportunity for the kiddos to learn more about Jesus during school hours. The children get bused here to First Lutheran. The letter is sent home schoolwide, parents have the choice on which church to send their child if they want them to participate. This year out of the total 29 students 13 of them are members of First Lutheran. The other 16 students either attend another church or don't attend at all.

The youth group have been busy practicing bells for the Christmas Program December 18th. Jennifer Flem is once again directing the bell choir. They are learning *Come*, *All Ye Shepherds*. The

practice schedule for November and December are as follows: November 3rd, 24th, December 8th and 15th.

Sunday school is well under way. The next youth Sunday will be on November 3rd due to MEA break in October. They are excited about this youth Sunday as they will be singing with the praise team and the congregation. So, get your singing voices ready!

There are a few family activities coming up and everyone is invited to attend. This isn't just for the youth. November 3rd will be around the town scavenger hunt while learning more about Joseph and his life. Walking tacos will be provided before we head out and a treat will be waiting for you when you return. Youth are welcome to come without their family, please let us know ahead of time so we can plan accordingly.

December 4th and 11th will be soup suppers before advent services. A sign-up sheet will be outside of the youth office. This is a great way to start saving for the National Youth Gathering or any youth event coming up. If you are interested in donating a soup, please sign up. One time we didn't have enough and another time we had way too much.

December 15th will be decorating Christmas cookies and delivering to the shut-ins. Bring your signing voice so we can sing Christmas songs to them. Anyone is welcomed to attend!

December 18th is the Christmas program at the 6:30 service.

Lord of Life Escape Room in January! Looking ahead the youth will put on an escape room. Participants will have 1 hour to solve the puzzles and riddles. "An elderly pastor has just passed away. In the note he writes his goodbye, but also reveals that he has hidden his original Bible from when he was in seminary somewhere in the room and his family must solve a series of puzzles and riddles to find it." I just want to say thank you to those that work directly with the children in our church! You have no idea how big of an impact you are having on those children and their future! There may come a time in their life when they must make the choice about how their children will group up either going to church or not. Hopefully they will look back at the wonderful memories they had and will want to give that to their children.

Logan was just telling me a story about a boy that walked with her on the way to the church and on his way home after school last year. Logan told this boy where she was going, and he said he wished he could go to church. He then proceeded to tell her that his family doesn't believe in God, but he does believe that God created this world. He wanted to go to Sunday School, but his parents wouldn't let him. He walks by our church almost daily just wanting more.

I don't know about you, but that breaks my heart. How can we reach those children when they aren't even allowed to come to the church? But.... what if we teach our youth how to talk to those children about Jesus? Sunday School, Release Time, Youth Group, VBS, Family Camp are all opportunities to teach our youth.



- 1. New Media Update Tom L. stated that the system is up and running. We are still learning. Some lighting issues are being worked on. All the hard work is appreciated. The final bill to AVE of \$54,000.00 is more than is in the Media Fund.
- ***Motion was made, seconded and passed to recommend to the congregation to use the Securities AM Media Fund (current balance \$97,670.54) to pay the AVE bills and put the remainder against the mortgage balance after all bills have been paid. Congregation would have to approve this.
- ***Motion was made, seconded and passed to pay what we can from the Media Fund but leave \$10,000.00 in the fund for future needs.
- 2. Capital Projects Update Gary R. Capital Expense /Media Accounts report is attached to the packet. The garage windows, finishing work in the Sacristy and Altar should be done next week. The garage costs are higher because of cement work, landscaping and fill. We still have a credit from the original garage.
- **3.** 2020 Budget The proposed budget is attached to the packet.

- ***Motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the proposed budget and present it to the congregation.

 The Trustees Proposed Capital Budget will be put together before the November Council Meeting.
- **4.** Pastor's Retirement Update The pre-call meeting with District President Fondow will be October 22nd. Matt Pellinen will lead the call committee.

Time Line Poster in an amount up to \$100.00 to be paid from Thrivent Funds.

- 5. Internet Jessica is having internet problems on her computer and there is no wireless internet in the youth room. It was decided to have Paul Bunyan evaluate the internet system in the Church.
