One definition of a promise is to cause someone to expect something. I think too often people look at someone's promise as an intention to do something.

God has made many promises to us that He faithfully keeps. My challenge to you is look at and consider the many, many promises of God. Look at the promises that God's Word offers and gives. As we have discovered, the Holy Spirit uses God's Word as a vehicle to reach our souls and hearts. Consider these words, (Romans 10:17) "So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ." Through the power of God's Word those spiritual plugs have been removed enabling us to hear of God's Love through the blood of Jesus Christ.

THE MOTHER'S PROMISE by Sally Hepworth, 813.54 Hep. From the inner cover blurb: "All their lives, Alice Stanhope and her daughter, Zoe, have been a family of two, living quietly in Northern California. Zoe has always struggled with crippling

social anxiety and her mother has been her constant and fierce protector. With Zoe's father shrouded in mystery, their team of two works – until it doesn't. Until Alice gets sick and needs to fight for her life...Desperate to find stability for Zoe, Alice reaches out to two women who are practically strangers but who are her only hope: Kate, a nurse, and Sonja, a social worker. As the four of them come together, a chain of events is set into motion and all four of them must confront their darkest fears and secrets – secrets about abandonment, abuse, estrangement, and the deepest longing for family...Imbued with heart and humor in even the most dismal moments, this is an unforgettable novel about the unbreakable bonds between mothers and daughters and the new ways in which families are forged." This novel grabbed me and never let me go even as twists near the end had me yelling out in dismay – sorry Doug! And be sure to keep the tissues near at hand. – Janie Carlson

And the most difficult decision they'll ever make...Frances "Khaki" Mason has it all: a thriving interior design career, a loving husband and son, homes in North Carolina and Manhattan – everything except the second child she has always wanted. Jodi, her husband's nineteen-year-old cousin, is fresh out of rehab, pregnant, and alone. Although the two women couldn't seem more different, they forge a life-long connection as Khaki reaches out to Jodi, encouraging to have her baby. But as Jodi struggles to be the mother she knows her daughter deserves, she will as Khaki for the ultimate favor....Written to baby Carolina, by both her birth mother and her adoptive one, this is a story that proves that life circumstances shape us but don't define us – and that families aren't born, they're made..." **Another page turner that was hard to put down! – Janie Carlson**

FRAGMENTS OF FEAR by Carrie Stuart Parks, 813.6 Par. "...is a heart-stopping read of suspense and God's mercy and grace. Tavish is the type of character who grips you tight in her clutches and takes you along on a wild ride until you turn the last page. It's a stay-up-late-to-finish novel. **Highest recommendation!**"

STARFISH PIER by Irene Hannon, 813.54 Han. This is book 6 of the Hope Harbor Novels. "A year ago, ex-Delta Force operator Steven Roark left the rigors of combat behind to run fishing charters in Hope Harbor, decompress, and talk some sense into his kid brother. Business is good – but making peace with his past is more challenging than he

expected...First-grade teacher Holly Miller leads a low-profile existence – until she's recruited to advocate for a cause that's dear to her heart. When she solicits Steven's assistance, sparks fly – especially after they find themselves on opposite sides of an issue that disrupts their placid seaside community...As these two seemingly incompatible souls wrestle with their differences, might they discover more common ground than they expect – and a future filled with promise?" <u>ONE LITTLE LIE</u> by Colleen Coble, 813.54 Cob. This is book 1 of the Pelican Harbor series. "It started with one little lie. But Jane Hardy will do everything in her power to uncover the truth in this gripping new romantic suspense." To be continued in <u>TWO REASONS TO RUN</u>, coming out in print September 2020. STILL LIFE by Christa Parrish, 813.6 Par. "Ada escaped her family's self-enclosed world to elope with a mysterious stranger. Five months later, she's a widow in a strange new world." "This is a cunningly complex work that captures themes of abusive religion, supernatural love, and merciful escape. It will resonate with anyone who has ever felt called to a drastic change – or tried to hear the small whisper of God's voice."

<u>SHELTER</u> by Robin Merrill, FIC Mer. "She begged God to rescue her. He said, "Go." So she headed out into a blizzard. In a car that wasn't exactly hers, with a dog who wasn't exactly a rat terrier, she drove. Until she ran out of gas in the small Maine town of Mattawooptock. Mattawoop what? What on earth is God thinking? But it is there, in a weird little bathroom in a weird little church in a weird little town that Maggie Hansen finds herself. And as God would have it, she finds a lot more than that." I enjoyed this fast-moving book so much that the sequel <u>DANIEL</u> has been put on our library "wish list"! – Janie Carlson

A SWEET VOICE by Margo Hansen, 813.54 Han. "Shanghaied, tortured, and beaten down, Keane Wheatly turns to fellow prisoner for help. Together Keane and his friend Jake make their escape back to the Wheatly farm in Ulen, Minnesota, as far from an ocean as they can get. But adjusting to everyday life isn't easy with the memories they both carry. Each day they rely more and more on God's grace."

TO SEE AND KNOW by Margo Hansen, 813.54 Han. This is a sequel to **A SWEET VOICE**. "Garrett Foxe needs answers and the place to find them seems to be in Ulen, Minnesota. The papers he found among his mother's things reveal that she had lied to him all his life. Can the people here help him find the truth?"

THE WORDS BETWEEN US by Erin Bartels, 813.6 Bar. "...this is a story to savor and share: a lyrical novel about the power of language and the search for salvation. A secondhand bookstore owner hiding from a legacy of scandal, tragedy and heartbreak must unlock the secrets of the past to claim her happiness." "Vividly drawn and told in expertly woven dual timelines."

<u>UNFINISHED – BELIEVING IS ONLY THE BEGINNING</u> by Richard Stearns, 248.4 Ste. "So you believe in God. Now what? Just before he left, Jesus sent his followers into the world with a revolutionary mission: to change the world by proclaiming God's truth and demonstrating his incredible love. But the single task he gave us to accomplish remains *unfinished*. Why are we here, what is our purpose, and where do we fit in the bigger story that God is writing? How should our faith affect our careers, our money, our families, and our lives? And why does it matter? We will find our deepest purpose only when we discover the unique role God created for us to play in his unfolding story."

LWML Sunday will be celebrated October 4th. Even though the LWML MN North District Convention did not take place in Grand Rapids in June, the convention delegates approved District Mission Grants for the 2020-2022 Biennium of Through your mite offerings, LWML \$140.500. supports mission work all around the world. One of this biennium's district mission grants is \$8,000 to **Scholarships** for Men **Preparing Ordination.** Jesus set in motion the Great Commission to proclaim His Gospel, but without workers, many are unable to hear the saving Gospel

message. Through this grant, men at either of our seminaries will receive equal funding to help offset the expenses for their tuition.

Another one of this biennium's mission grants is for \$5,000 to **Main Street Living North.** This grant is designed to meet the needs of people who are home bound, in assisted living and nursing homes, as well as to those without a church to attend on a Sunday morning. This has also been an option during the Covid pandemic. Through this ministry the message of Christ can be taken to viewers through Minnesota, North Dakota and into Canada.

This year's LWML Sunday theme is "Kingdom People Produce Kingdom Fruit," based on Matthew 21:43: Therefore I tell you, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people producing its fruits. In Matthew 21:33-46, Jesus teaches that the kingdom of God will be taken from the religious leaders of the day and be given to people producing its fruits. By God's grace in Christ, we are blessed to be these people in the kingdom of God. He graciously nurtures us and generously gives us everything we need to produce fruit for the kingdom during the fruit-bearing season of our lives. Because of your donations to mites, we can share the Gospel and bring others to Christ. Thank you for your support of LWML, enabling us to produce fruit for God's kingdom.

The first Sunday of each month is designated as Mite Box Sunday. Mites can be place in the big mite box on those Sundays or in the wooden box by mailboxes at any time. During this time of the covid pandemic we have been not able to do the normal activities we do to support our missions but we can still collect our Mites.

LCMS STEWARDSHIP MINISTRY NEWSLETTER ARTICLE - OCTOBER 2020

The following stewardship verses were originally intended to be put in the weekly bulletins. Because we're not printing weekly bulletins, we've included them to be printed in the October newsletter. Please read and ponder them as you go about your day. – Stewardship Board

LUKE 14:11 – "FOR EVERYONE WHO EXALTS HIMSELF WILL BE HUMBLED, AND HE WHO HUMBLES HIMSELF WILL BE EXALTED." The Kingdom of God is always upside down and backwards like this. We must die in order to live. We must be humbled so we can be exalted. It's like this with giving as well. When we give away, then we receive much more than we bargained for: peace of mind, contentment, and joy.

MATT. 22:40 – "ON THESE TWO COMMANDMENTS DEPEND ALL THE LAW AND THE PROPHETS." We serve God and our neighbor through the various vocations (holy callings) that God has given us. We do not need to go searching for good works or

inventing our own. God has given us roles to fill in home, at church, and in society, and that will keep us plenty busy. When we seek to fulfill the duties of these vocations in a spirit of faith, God-pleasing works are the result.

EPH. 4:24 – "... PUT ON THE NEW SELF, CREATED AFTER THE LIKENESS OF GOD IN TRUE RIGHTEOUSNESS AND HOLINESS." We have a new identity in Christ. Our old identity was in Adam: sinner, enemy of God, and destined for death and destruction. But in Christ we have a new self: forgiven, child of God, cleansed, and destined for life everlasting. These two identities continue to struggle as we exist in this fallen world. St. Paul encourages us to "put on the new self" and consciously exert effort to cling to Christ in faith and claim our new identity in Him. Coming to the Lord's House, faithfully supporting the ministry, and praying and reading Scripture daily are the works of the new self.

MATT. 21:43 – "THEREFORE I TELL YOU, THE KINGDOM OF GOD WILL BE TAKEN AWAY FROM YOU AND GIVEN TO A PEOPLE PRODUCING ITS FRUITS." The Pharisees were not bearing fruit. They were faithful to the letter of the Law in keeping the Sabbath, tithing, and all the rest, but they neglected the heart of God's will. The grace of God belongs at the center. Our giving and all our other good works flow forth from receiving God's grace and living in that grace on a daily basis.

MATT. 22:5 – "BUT THEY PAID NO ATTENTION AND WENT OFF, ONE TO HIS FARM, ANOTHER TO HIS BUSINESS." The invitation to join God in His feast and in His work is easily ignored. The rest of life seems so much more pressing, and we always think there will be another time when we can catch back up with God. But what joys are we missing when we set aside God's invitation to join Him in His plans and purposes? What inheritance are we trading for the world's bowl of pottage?

MATT. 22:21 – "... THEN HE SAID TO THEM, 'THEREFORE RENDER TO CAESAR THE THINGS THAT ARE CAESAR'S, AND TO GOD THE THINGS THAT ARE GOD'S." So what is Jesus saying? Doesn't everything belong to God? Yes, and God has a place for everything. Some of what He gives us goes to Caesar. Some must come back to the work of His Church. And some goes to support the families He has given us. All belongs to God, and He has work for us to do with what He has given us in the home, in the Church, and in society.

JOHN 8:36 – "SO IF THE SON SETS YOU FREE, YOU WILL BE FREE INDEED." Reformation Day is celebrated October 25th! Luther is rightly remembered as a champion of the Gospel, but he also called himself "the apostle of good works." For only in being set free by the Gospel can we do good works. Jesus has set us free, and His blood covers over our sins. We stand before God as His beloved children, and we are invited to live our lives to His glory for the good of His kingdom.

Pre-k/Kindergarten Sunday school teacher needed





WE ARE STILL ACTIVELY SEEKING A SUNDAY SCHOOL TEACHER for the preschool and kindergarten class. This group of kiddos are at an intriguing age to hear the bible stories. Their minds are fascinating as they are like

a sponge and soak up the knowledge you lay before them. Their imagination is like a black hole, never ending. I have been blessed beyond belief having taught this age group for over seven years. I loved how each child is so different, but they all have a passion to learn more about Jesus and who God is. Being a Sunday school teacher is so rewarding and I will try my best to explain how. Growing up I heard the bible stories over and over. I read them in books, heard them in Sunday school, VBS, and at bible camp. As an adult we tend to forget or reread those stories that are the foundation of faith for so many. Jonah and the big whale, Zacchaeus, David and Goliath, the birth of Jesus, I could really go and on. As adults we tend to dive into the deeper parts of the bible on how we should treat each other and ourselves, talk about heaven, and so forth. We don't always take time to revisit those stories. What I love most about teaching the preschool and kindergartners is I get to reread the bible stories. I always pick out something new or a verse stands out differently to me than it did the last time I read it. Not only am I teaching the children the story, I am also teaching myself. I grow as a person learning more about the Bible. Sometimes those kiddos have such great questions. Questions that I don't think about asking. It sparks a conversation that I would not have had on my own.

Right now we don't have a teacher for the preschool and kindergartners. If you are able to set aside two hours a week for these kids, please let me know. I say two hours because one hour would be for preparing and one hour for teaching on Sunday morning. It really doesn't take a lot of time.

The curriculum comes with a section on how to build relationships (opening). Introduce the bible story, telling the story and saying the bible verse. How they can discover the lesson truths, this would be the lesson leaflet activity with stickers and coloring. Taking time to engage in active learning by moving, snack or creating a craft. We also have a wall of chalkboard for the kids to draw and color what they like, many wooden puzzles, and lots of other activities. Everything is provided so you can be a successful teacher. As always I am right here if you need support or help with anything.

Please pray that either yourself or someone will step up to be the leader in this classroom! Perhaps two people could take turns every other week or every other month.


