"THE ETERNAL DIFFERENCE"

Many years ago, I had a conversation with a man who seemed rather serious about holding what I thought (and still think) was a ridiculous notion. He proudly state he had a "childlike faith." So far, so good. He went on to say that he did



not want to mess it up with studying the Bible. It is my most ardent hope that not even one person who will ever read this agrees with that man.

Why? Because faith needs to grow and stretch and be challenged. When it stands still it will stagnate at best, and, at worst, shrink.

We will never reach a level of spiritual maturity, or for that matter, of spiritual simplicity, where we can rightly say, "I have arrived, there is no more that I need to learn." Life is a learning process and we had better keep learning the unfolding of God's truth so we do not fall prey to the cares and concerns of natural, worldly thinking. The difference between God's Word and the world's value system is "the eternal difference."

If it were possible to gather up the accumulated wisdom of this world and add it to the sum total of human experience, it could not even begin to save one human being from perishing in everlasting condemnation. There! Did I say that strongly enough? Apart from faith in Jesus Christ, all will perish. On the other hand, "whosoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have everlasting life (John 3:16)." Yes, that is a familiar passage, but do not let the frequency of hearing it dull the razor-sharp intention of its words of truth.

If, then, clinging to God's truth is the passageway to eternal life and following the ways of this world leads to eternal separation from God, shouldn't it be the goal of every one of us, first of all, to believe this? Shouldn't we, then, go on to hold the position that spending our lives learning more and more about God's Word would be the best thing we could do?

In Jesus' ministry, He encountered people who were more than willing to follow Him on their own terms. They listened selectively for what they wanted to hear. They like the part about being forgiven, but balked at being forgiving. They loved the part about going to the Father's mansions, but they rejected the part about taking up their cross to follow. They delighted to hear Him "beat up" on the Pharisees, but they choked on His words about eating His flesh and drinking His blood. They drew a line of their choosing and said, "We will follow You no further" They departed and left Him. Jesus asked His disciples, "Will you also leave?" Peter said, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life (John 6)."

Can you see that it is a false security we reach for when we want to create a less demanding category of being a Christian than being a disciple? Jesus did not set up different camps based on their levels of willingness to participate. He simply called disciples. He called out people who would commit to studying His Word and keeping His Word and putting it into practice. His promise for disciples clinging to His Word was truth – the kind of truth that sets us free from sin, from Satan's deceptions, from self-absorption, from self-righteousness, and, ultimately, from eternal death.

How are you doing with Jesus' personal call on your life? How are you doing with being a disciple of Jesus Christ? There can be an eternal difference.

By the way, several Bible study classes are offered at various times throughout the week. There are plenty of chairs available to accommodate more disciples. Please consider attending any of them.

It all started in 2013 when I was asked to join the Youth board. My children were 6, 5 and 3 at the time. Why would I put my time and energy into something that my children are not even involved in? Well God called me to it so I said yes. We had a good group going through at the time and did some activities, I remember attending my first lock-in with the bunch.

school age coming through or the group just disbanded. As a board we made the decision to start having family events. Inviting the younger children and their parents in on the fun. Now several years later we are seeing this influx in children. We have been averaging 8-15 middle school/high school students that attend the events regularly. We have up to 30 that are of age to join the youth group. As you can see, we have been working for several years to build up the youth. This didn't happen overnight or just in the last year when I was hired. This has been a slow and steady process working with families and providing opportunities for them to grow in their faith. Creating relationships with one another has been a key ingredient in all of this. Since I have started working for First Lutheran, I have been pushing relationships. I do this

because I see the value in it. There is study after study done on the effects of adult/youth relationships. One example that just happened recently is an adult from First Lutheran was a mentor 20 years ago to a 9-year-old. That 9-yearold is now 29 and reached out to his mentor after 20 years to get together. What an impact the adult had on that child 20 years ago to have him reach out. Think back to when you were in elementary or middle school, was there one adult that just stood out? That made an impact on the path of your life. I am sure you can think of at least one person that had an impact on your life. Now how can we give that same impact to the youth at First Lutheran? I am starting to see a trend that I am not too excited about. I am praying that we are just in a lull and this won't continue. Either way I want to brina awareness congregation. The trend that I am seeing is the youth are starting to come through and help volunteer at events and the adults are stepping away thinking they are not needed. For instance, let's look at VBS, last year we had about eight youth helping and this year we had 13 youth. We needed the 13 youth this year or we would not have been able to put on VBS due to not enough adults volunteering. I am curious to see what next year brings if this is the trend we are on. We are down to three Sunday School teachers for two classes. Family camp we didn't see the helpers that we saw last year providing meals. Soon the youth are going to see this and wonder why they are having to do things when the adults are not doing them. We are setting the example and the

tone of the church. The youth watch us very closely and learn from us. What are we wanting to teach them?

How can we stop this trend? I would love for your feedback and ideas on how we can get more adults engaged with the youth or church overall. This is not intended to be more work for you, but an opportunity for the adults to bring their knowledge and skills to the youth. Set a good example and be leaders of the church. I can only say it so many times relationships, relationships, relationships. Share the Love of Jesus with one another. I pray that the adults of our congregation will be a role model to their peers and the youth of the church. If you are already doing this, THANK YOU! You have no idea how you are positively impacting the faith of the children.



Call to order: Tom Lattimore called the meeting to order at 5:35PM.

Unfinished Business

- New Media update Installation is ongoing and moving forward. AVE stated that our project has been a challenge for them. Training will begin when system is in place.
- 2. Capital Projects Update Garage workers had been taken off that project to do the AV project in the balcony. With that project completed, the workers will be back working on the garage. Gary Rosin stated that the entrance doors are in the cities and he will be picking them up. Summer of 2019 completion date.
- **3.** Constitution Update Update has been done and Synod has approved.

- **4.** Outside Building Cameras Update The cameras are here and will be tested and installed.
- 5. Update on Church Website The website renewal was changed to a one-year renewal. In order to get the five-year renewal, the website would have had to be taken down and completely rebuilt.
- 6. Church Vehicle At this time there doesn't seem to be sufficient need for a church vehicle. This can be reviewed in six months to a year.

New Business

- 1. Purchase of new Bibles for ClassroomsThe Bibles would cost \$716 and two
- \$100.00 gifts have been received toward the Bible purchase.
- ***Motion was made, seconded and passed to purchase new Bibles for classrooms with Thrivent Funds in an amount up to \$550.00
- 2. Consideration of a Daycare/Preschool
- Research & Feasibility Committee –
 Jessica had been approached about starting a Daycare/ Preschool in our facility.
- ***Motion was made, seconded and passed to look at the feasibility, licensing requirements, town's need, operating costs, staffing, etc. of a Daycare/Preschool through the DPC Committee.
- 3. 2020 Budget Jennifer F. would like to have budget drafts from each Board by September in order to make possible

adjustments before approval at the October Council Meeting.

- 4. October Congregational Meeting Date for the Congregational Meeting will be set in September.
- 5. AV Additions Additions to the AV system include:
 - Outlet for possible screen in the lower narthex by the clock (wires have already been run)
 - Audio Assist System/ Close Caption Options
 - Outlet behind the cross for backlighting
 - Lighting under the balcony overhang
- ***Motion was made, seconded and passed to un-table the backlighting behind the cross.
- ***Motion was made, seconded and passed to add an Audio Assist System that includes four units in an amount up to \$2000.00 from Media Ministry in the Revolving Trust Fund.
- ***Motion was made, seconded and passed with one abstaining vote to add an outlet in the lower narthex by the clock for future screen; add an outlet behind the cross for behind the cross lighting and possible Christmas decorating; LED lights for behind the cross lighting and LED lights in the back of the church under the balcony overhang in an amount up to \$3,500.00 from the AV Funds in budget.
- 6. Treasurer's Duties Jennifer F. discussed options with John Roessler,

CPA regarding the costs of payroll taxes and preparation of W-2's. At this time John has agreed to maintain payroll records, calculate payroll, do monthly submission of Federal & State Withholding, Social Security Taxes, etc. at zero cost. John indicated that he was willing to do this with no fee, but will evaluate after several months and at that time determine the possible fee amount. He will then talk with the church treasurer and agree on a fee.

- ***Motion was made, seconded and passed to have John Roessler, CPA do the payroll and quarterly Federal and State Reports with fee to be evaluated after several months.
- 7. Custodian Disability/Employee Short Term Disability
- ***Motion was made, seconded and passed to restrict any employee from any work while on disability until a written doctor's release is received.
- ***Motion was made, seconded and passed to add a tracking form for employee's absences, vacations and sick days.
- ***Motion was made, seconded and passed that the substitute custodian (Kathy and Jim Hohenstein have been doing Brad's duties since he has been on medical leave) will receive \$16.00 an hour for up to 28 hours a week to be approved by the Board of Trustees.
- ***Motion was made, seconded and passed to approve pay for Kathy and/or Jim Hohenstein retroactive back to when

they started subbing for the custodian up to 28 hours a week.

8. Pastor's Retirement – Pastor Zeige shared with the Elders his wishes on retirement and his concerns at this time. Tom L. will work on updating our call documents and will work with District President Rev. Dr. Donald J. Fondow on the call procedure.

Caring and Sharing Adjournment – The meeting was adjourned at 8:03PM The meeting was closed with prayer by Pastor Zeige and the Lord's Prayer.
