STEAL AWAY HOME by Billy Coffey, 813.6 Cof. “During the course of one fateful night – his first game in the Major League – Billy Coffey’s main

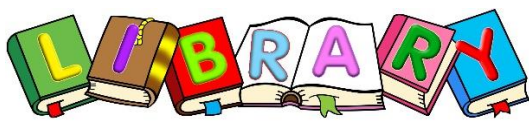

“Whatever your hand finds to do, do it with all your might” (Eccl 9:10).

God bids us to be faithful in the tasks He calls us to do. He calls us to be members of a family (husbands and wives; fathers and mothers; sons and daughters). He calls us to be members of society (those who govern and those who are governed). And He calls us to be members of His family, the Church (those who preach and teach and those who hear and learn). Each of these callings from God places a duty on us.

As members of a family, husbands are given the duty to die for their wives as Christ gave His life for His bride, the Church; while wives are given the duty to respect their husbands and submit

themselves to them as the Church does to Christ. Fathers and mothers are to raise their children in the fear and admonition of the Lord, teaching them the Ten Commandments, the Creed, the Lord’s Prayer, and the Scriptures concerning Baptism, Confession, the Office of the Keys, and the Lord’s Supper. Children are to honor their parents throughout their lives, and even when their parents are no longer alive, serving and obeying them, loving and cherishing them, and speaking well of them.

As members of society, God calls those who govern to bear the sword, that is, to punish those who do evil (those who live contrary to God’s will) and to reward those who do good (those whose lives are lived in conformity with God’s will). Those who are governed are to obey their leaders as to the Lord Himself, for their leaders bear the sword of God’s temporal justice for a purpose.

As members of God’s own family, the Church, He calls those who preach and teach to do so in faithfulness to His holy Word. To preach and teach the Law of God to convict the hearts of hearers of their sin and to encourage, admonish, and exhort them to do good works in accordance with God’s will. They are to preach and teach the Gospel, the full

forgiveness of their sins accomplished by Christ and received through faith, not by works. They are to administer the means of grace in accordance with the Gospel and the Word of God. They do all this for the young and old alike, for those who are near and far off. Those who hear and learn are to submit themselves to their preachers and teachers. They are support them by their prayers and their gifts.

Each of these callings from God place a duty on us. They make a claim on our presence; on our prayers; and our time, talents, and treasures. So, “Whatever your hand finds to do, do it with all your might” (Eccl 9:10). Pray for your family, your government, and your church. Give of yourself by means of your time, your talents, and your treasures to your family, your government, and your Church. That is what it means to be faithful in the tasks that God has given us. That is what it means to do it with all your might.



THIS YEAR HAS BEEN, let us just say, an interesting year so far. We have been through a lot. We all have experienced this pandemic differently. It is the same storm, but we are all in different boats experiencing different waves. One thing has remained constant in all of this, Jesus.

In June I thought for sure that we were going to decide not to have Vacation Bible Camp or Family Camp in August. I received a message from one of the children’s mom that said this was exactly what her daughter needed. Her spirits have been down, and

God knew a year ago what obstacles we were going to be facing. Having this opportunity out at Camp Fire Camp Bluewater was definitely God's plan. Having VBC in the church would have created too many obstacles and we most likely would have just cancelled it. Since we were planning on being outside anyways, this worked out perfect.

It was not always smooth sailing for us planning this. Sunday night at check-in I found out that a couple of the youth that I had planned on being leaders had to be gone every morning. Okay, no problem we will figure this out. Sure enough God was on our side and found someone to step up. She told us even after saying yes that the devil was after her. Telling her she would not be prepared as it is only two days away. He was trying to get in her head. She prayed, and God listened and the next morning she was able to dive into the material and was more than prepared for VBC.

I had asked the music leader to teach a class and she said that doing the music was going to be enough. I thought that each group could do their own music so we could do without someone leading the music, which is why I asked her to teach. At first I was bummed, but completely understood. Boy am I glad that God told her to say no. She did an absolutely amazing job with the kids teaching them the songs and the actions.

Wednesday morning came around and I was panicking that we were not ready. Matt looked at me and said, "Don't let Satan take your happiness." Boy was he right. I was allowing Satan to be in control and not trust God that it was all going to work out. We really paid attention to God and Satan that day. Watching God at work was so amazing, I wish everyone could have experienced it.

I want to personally thank the adults that stepped up to help that day: Mary Buech, Greg Robertson, Molly Bartel, Corrin Hultman, Heidi Clairmont, Sue Thorson, Shirley Mattfield, Gary Rosin, Pastor Steve Breitbarth, Brad Bensen and Matt Pellinen. Those children would not have heard the gospel that day if it were not for you taking the time out of your busy lives to be there.

I also want to thank all the youth leaders: Laine Spangler, Annika Spangler, Kate Clairmont, JoAnna Wahl, Daimon Hill, Chase Pellinen, Caleb Angell, Brayden Shaw and Austin Pellinen. You listened to God and shared his love with the children. Helping that day has shown you how to be a leader, how to share the Gospel, and overall how to be a better Christian. It has been an absolute pleasure watching you grow in your faith.

Those of you that donated money to go towards the food, it was so helpful! Thank you Dwight Kessler for giving his Thrivent Action Team card for the

picnic! Thank you Tim Kilpatrick for your donation of firewood and everyone who made bars.

This is why I do what I do. This is why I LOVE what I do. We get to make a difference in the children's lives. The most important thing in this world is Jesus. If we do not have Jesus, we have nothing. There are so many children and adults out there that do not know Jesus or have a relationship with him. What if you were able to change someone's life by sharing the love of Jesus with them? Wouldn't it be rewarding? God loves us so much and that news is worth sharing. Since this year has given us some setbacks and because some people are not able to be around children, we only have one Sunday School teacher. I really

want to thank those other teachers that are unable to teach this year, I am sure that decision was not made lightly. They have been a blessing to the children, and we are hoping to find someone just as dedicated as they are to take their classes.

Being a Sunday School teacher is so rewarding. These children need someone to share the stories of the Bible with them, especially when they are with their peers. Please pray that at least two people will step up to this rewarding selfless position. You will not have to do it alone; God is with you and I will help you with anything you need.
