SAUSAGE DIP FOR THE SUPPER BOWL LVI

Yields: 8 - 10 servings Prep Time: 0 hours 1 min Total Time: 0 hours 10 min



Ingredients:

1 lb pork sausage, like Jimmy Dean

8 oz cream cheese

1 C chunky salsa

Thinly sliced scallions &/or chopped cilantro - optl.

Directions:

Heat a 10-inch cast-iron skillet over medium heat until very hot. Add the sausage and break up into small pieces with a wooden spoon. Cook until no pink pieces remain, about 6 minutes.

Reduce the heat to medium-low. Add the cream cheese and break up into smaller pieces.

Add the salsa and stir well to combine. Continue to stir until all of the cream cheese is melted, about 3 minutes.

Top with scallions and cilantro and serve right out of the skillet, with tortilla chips on the side.
