Jesus said in John 14:6, "I am the way, the truth and the life. No one comes to the father except through me."

AND WE NEED TO UNDERSTAND THE PROBLEM

An authentic loving relationship with God would require complete freedom.

There can be no real freedom without choice, and with choice there is always the possibility of making the wrong choice. If you don't have the freedom to, there would be no real freedom.

THE GREAT FREEDOM PROJECT

Galatians 5:1 "For freedom Christ has set us free; stand firm therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery."

He knew that our freedom would draw evil out in reaction to his good. He knew we would be tempted. He knew what we would choose. He knew what the wrong choice

would do to us. And he knew that our flesh is too weak to defeat evil and overcome death.

He knew it would take one like us, but stronger than us, who would be able to defeat death and overcome evil by the power of love.

Romans 5:8 "...but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us."

Ephesians 1:7 (ESR) "In Christ we were made free by his blood sacrifice. We have forgiveness of sins because of God's rich grace."

The apostle Paul put it like this in 2 Corinthians 5:21, "For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God."

And in Ephesians 2:8 Paul says, "For by grace you have been saved by faith. And this is not of your own doing; it is the gift of God."

Because we are all saved by grace no one can boast. All comparisons and all competitions are removed. Everyone gets the same amount of love and mercy. It is all unconditional. It is all a free gift.

If Jesus is just another human like the rest of us, then his exclusive claim is unfair. But if he is truly the Son of God then he is greater than us and his claim has authority. Christianity differs from all other faiths because it doesn't begin with our speculations but with God's revelation. At the center of Christianity is the person of Jesus Christ. If there is no Jesus there is no Christianity.

Galatians 2:20 "I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me."

SHOULD I BE IMMERSED EVEN IF I WAS SPRINKLED AS A BABY?

Yes, and only if you can say, "My parents had me sprinkled out of love for both God and his church. They did it with full conviction and understanding, with the hope that I would grow up to share their faith in God." Yes, if you can say, "If it wasn't for my parent's love and guidance I might not even be seeking this today."

Yes, if you are doing it: to experience God's grace in your own life. To move forward in your faith. To assure yourself of your own obedience.

And yes if you can say, "I am doing this as my personal response and obedience to Jesus."
