

- 1. Ghost crabs are also called Sand crabs.
- 2. Ghost crabs live in burrows in the sand.
- 3. Ghost crabs are pale and sandy colored making them almost invisible to see on the sand. This is called camouflage.
- 4. Ghost crabs have a hard-external skeleton called an exoskeleton. When they grow they shed their exoskeleton; this is called molting.
- 5. Ghost crabs have strong hairy legs that make them run very fast. They can run up to 10 miles per hour.
- 6. Ghost crabs have club-shaped eyestalks that can see all the way around them; 360 degrees!
- 7. Ghost crabs can catch insects that are flying in the air.
- 8. Ghost crabs only return to the water occasionally to wet their gills.
- 9. Ghost crabs can wick up water from the wet sand to wet their gills using tiny hairs on their legs.
- 10. Ghost crabs can hold their breath for a very long time.
