
## Advent 2

Recently, I find myself humming over and over that cherished African-American spiritual: **Sweet Little** 

Jesus Boy whose haunting chorus ends 'Sweet little Jesus boy... we didn't know who you was.'

That pretty much sums up the title of the preaching series for Advent: **The Greatest Story NEVER Told.** For many during this season—even among some professing Christians—**the story NEVER really gets told.**
