At some point we have to stop just singing about our story and begin to actually tell it. I'll meet you in the mission field, I'll be the guy telling my story to whoever will stop and listen. Will you join me?

August 13th-Kenya Uniform Drive begins. Money bags will be distributed.


August-Moving Mountain Ministry Hygiene bags-check in the office for details.
