It's official, we are a real denomination. Actually, we were already a real denomination, but all the "provisional" and "transitional" language has been dropped from all our documents and organizational structure. Thanks to the convening conference held in Costa Rica this

past week, we now have an official constitution and an official Book of Doctrine and Discipline. The conference worked on perfecting about half of our former transitional Book of Doctrine and Discipline, the second half will be perfected during General Conference in 2026. It was approved by the convening conference to hold the 2026 General Conference at a yet to be determined location in central Africa. Our denomination has been intentional about showing the world that the Global Methodist Church is not simply Global in name only, but we are truly Global in nature.

The General Conference voted and approved a different form of Episcopal leadership than we are used to having. In our former denomination, Bishops were "residential" in nature and were deployed to Annual Conferences where they had more of an administrative and bureaucratic role. In the GMC, we have chosen to have fewer Bishops and have them serve in a "general superintendency" role. Six bishops were elected to serve as interim bishops for the next two years. They will be joining the two fulltime bishops we already have. Their primary responsibility will be as guardians of the faith. They will have oversight of Annual Conferences and will have more of a teaching and equipping role in our denomination. Beginning in 2026, Bishops will be elected at General Conference to serve a six-year term and can be reelected once. There were also some accountability safeguards which were approved. Our annual conferences will be led by an elected Conference Superintendent.

We also approved a new denominational mission statement. "The Global Methodist Church exists to make disciples and spread scriptural holiness across the globe." That's a lot to live into here in little ole Franklinton. We have our task defined for us. We now have to be about the work of making disciples and spreading scriptural holiness. I'll see y'all in the mission field.


