They wake Jesus in their panic and he chastises them for their lack of faith and then calms the storm. The disciples are amazed that he even has command over the wind and the waves.

The next morning, they are met on the other side of the lake by a man who is demon possessed and we have another miracle performed by Jesus. I believe one of the things we are supposed to see in these back to back stories is that the work doesn't end. There will always be something new to do for the kingdom. I'm also convinced that all the storms that seem to continually pop up over and over again are opportunities to exercise our faith in Jesus.

In a couple of weeks, we will be celebrating Easter. We celebrate that death has been destroyed and now holds no power over us. Jesus has at once, for all time, conquered and calmed the worst storm we could ever imagine. He has provided a pathway to love and peace, hope and joy, and faith and assurance. It's ours for the asking.

The folks in Rolling Fork, Silver City and Amory Mississippi need our prayers as they navigate through the aftermath of this past weekend's weather events, please pray for them. I'm also convinced that you know someone who feels trapped in a different type of storm. Pray for them also. And maybe try inviting them to a place where the one who can calm any storm will be able to whisper some words of love and grace into their ears.


