And pray for yourself. Sometimes it feels selfish to pray for ourselves but pray anyway. If you are praying for a selfish desire that is not in God's will, He'll quickly let you know. ## THE UMC-COMMENTS MOVING FORWARD

As a way to stop any misinformation, and keep all of you informed as to where our church stands in the disaffiliation process, I'll try and walk you through the process that we are currently in.

First, we haven't disaffiliated from the United Methodist Church. We are exploring that idea. Our church council has voted to begin the process of disaffiliation. That doesn't mean we have left the UMC. It simply means we are talking about it. The council at its last meeting voted to invite our District Superintendent, Rev. Jan Curwick, to attend a meeting of the council. This meeting will be for her to bring us all financial information for us to consider.

After the meeting with the DS, we will have a church meeting to get that information to you. We will have as many meetings as you the body needs to make an informed decision of whether to proceed with the disaffiliation or to simply stop and remain in the UMC.

After this period of discernment, the church council may ask for a formal Church Conference to vote on disaffiliation. If the council votes to move forward with a vote, the DS will again be contacted, and she will set a date for the Church Conference. We will send notice either by email or US Mail to every professing member on our church rolls. We will also give notice of the time and date of the meeting by announcements from the pulpit and via the weekly bulletin and monthly newsletter.

At the meeting, only those professing members who are listed on the membership rolls of the church will be allowed to vote. The vote will be taken by private ballot. It will take a 2/3 majority of the members present at the church conference to disaffiliate.

If the church votes to disaffiliate, at this point we will begin revising all pertinent legal paperwork to reflect the disaffiliation. We will then begin talking and discerning if we would like to be an independent Methodist congregation or if we would like to align with another Methodist denomination.

The last step would be for the Louisiana Annual Conference to vote to allow us to disaffiliate.

It is a lengthy and at times confusing process. As we enter a season of discernment, I invite you to ask questions. It is the desire of the council that we have input from you at every step in this process. Ask questions and stay informed.


