

METHODIST MEN'S BREAKFAST

The Centenary United Methodist Men met for breakfast on November 7, 2021 and heard an excellent presentation from State Senator Beth Mizell about the state of things in her district (Washington, St. Tammany, and Tangipahoa Parishes). She pointed out that members of the faith-based communities need to get involved in many areas of the legislative process in order to preserve many of the ideals that we, as Christians, hold sacred.

The issue of broadband expansion was also discussed and Senator Mizell pointed out that we have over \$180 million dollars coming to our district to expand broadband over the next two years.

It was also announced that our Bobby Draper Louisiana Methodist Children's Home Donation drive would reach its goal of \$1,000. Every member of UMM should be very pleased with this development.

Our speaker for our December 5th breakfast will be the Reverend Doctor Michael Sprague from Mandeville, La. He is the Louisiana State Chaplin with Capitol Commission and President of Grace Adventures, which reaches out to political, business and spiritual leaders in the New Orleans/Baton Rouge area. He spends most of his time in Baton Rouge working with legislators, lobbyists, administration, and capital staff in a non-political, non-partisan, pastoral/chaplin role.

The Bickhams, Barry and Jack, furnished us with another great breakfast and you are encouraged to come out in December and share another one with us.
