

"The Days of Elijah" is a song written and recorded by Robin Mark. He released the song in 1996 and says the song was a reaction to world events in 1994. Mark says he was watching a "Year in Review" program and began to despair over the state of our world. This was the year of the Rwandan Civil war and the first cease fire in Northern Ireland. He said the review was full of sappy stories, happy stories, and tragic stories like the Rwandan war where an estimated 1 million people lost their lives, He says as he prayed, he began to feel much like the prophet Elijah. Elijah's story is told in the Book of Kings in the Old Testament. During his ministry Elijah felt isolated and alone in the culture in which he lived, yet God asked him to stand up and speak boldly on His behalf.

Advent is a time when we remember the birth of our savior and look forward to his future return. It's easy to get caught up in the Christmas culture wars and get offended at being told "Happy Holidays" rather than "Merry Christmas". We can despair over the moral decay of our culture or the crass consumerism that has seemed to replace our religious observance of the birth of Jesus. We can feel alone and isolated in a society that no longer seems to value our faith. Or... Or we can celebrate.

We can choose to announce the truth and reality that God loves his creation by our words and deeds. We can choose to help usher others into the Kingdom, by how we treat others and how we react to adversity. We can choose kindness and love rather than bitterness and anger. We can choose to share the story of Jesus by becoming part of His unfolding story. We can choose to be the person who stands in love and declares "Prepare the way of the Lord".

We may as Robin Mark sang be living in the "Days of Elijah". But we also have a choice in how we live there. Choose wisely my friends. Choose to be a herald of the Kingdom. Choose to announce the Lordship of the Christ. Choose Love.
