NOTES FROM PASTOR CECIL

"The best laid plans of mice and men often go awry"

Robert Burns, Scottish poet, 1759-1796

I was reminded of this quote this past week. The line is taken from a poem by Burns titled "To the Mouse". The quote and poem remind us that oftentimes our plans are futile in the larger scheme of life.

I have a friend who took a trip this past week to the Holy Land. Scott is a United Methodist pastor and has always longed to venture into the land where all of scripture takes place. He saved and paid for the trip. He was all packed and ready. He took his COVID test prior to departure and was negative. He survived the 10 plus hours of flight into Tel

Aviv. Upon arrival the Israeli government requires all persons entering the country to take a COVID test. Scott tested positive. He was returned to Jerusalem for quarantine. I saw him post this morning on Facebook that he would be able to rejoin his group today for the journey back home. Instead of visiting Bethlehem, Jericho, Capernaum, the temple mount, Gethsemane, the Church of the Holy Sepulcher, or any of the other numerous spots of interest to Christians, Scott counted people walking along the side street near his hotel from his window in his room. I hate that Scott didn't get to experience all that Israel has to offer. I pray that one day, after all this CoronaVirus stuff has passed, Scott gets the opportunity to return to the Holy Land.

We often make plans that get interrupted. I'm not saying that God didn't want Scott to see all the sights of Israel. Sometimes life is interrupted by the brokenness of creation. In either event, I'm reminded that God has more in store for me than my plans. Jeremiah 29:11 says, "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."

In short, God knows what he's doing. He is intervening in our lives and working through the brokenness of this world to work something great for us. Keep your eyes on him during times of change or disappointment and he will give you hope.

ANNUAL CHURCH AUDIT




IN MEMORY OF EILEEN **PEPPERMAN**


UNITED METHODIST MEN'S CLUB




