## **NOTES FROM PASTOR CECIL**

I sit in my office during this strange time of the year. Christmas Day has passed, and we await the New Year. Theologically, I know that the Christmas season extends to the Epiphany, but it somehow feels that Christmas as a celebration is over. I sit and wonder what I should be doing with myself.

The writer of Ecclesiastes tells us in chapter three that there is a time for everything. We have just had a time of celebrating and await a time of new beginnings in the New Year. So, what now?

I will choose to use this strange time to pray and reflect and I invite you to do so also. As a church we are trying to return all our programs to a bit of pre-pandemic normalcy. We need your help in that endeavor. First, we need your participation in worship. Many of us have gotten used to staying

home and watching services via the internet and it has become habit. It is time to return. Covid-19 and all its variants will continue to spring up from time to time. I ask that you continue to take proper precautions. Wear a mask to church if it makes you comfortable, stay home if you have been exposed or are not feeling well. We are all grown ups and can navigate this together.

Second, we need you at our different programs and functions. If we want Sunday School to continue, we need to attend. If we want the church to offer Bible Studies, we need to attend. If we want our children and youth to have disciple building programs, we need to make sure they are here. Y'all get the idea. We can only do those things that are supported. I know that life is busy and complex in this age we live in, but it boils down to priorities. If you want to be a better disciple or if you desire to see your children grow in their love of God, make it a priority.

Third, we need you to volunteer. God has gifted you with some wonderful and unique abilities. He gave them to you to be used for work in His Kingdom. We can't have programs without volunteers. We can't have classes without teachers, we can't take trips without chaperones, and we can't have outreach without leaders. I promise there is something for you to do at this church, just ask.

Fourth, we need you to be invitational. Invite! Invite! The only way to grow a church is for you the members to bring folks with you. Reach out to those members who you haven't seen since all this started. Invite you neighbors who claim they are members of such and such church, yet you never see them go. Invite those who you know are unchurched. Invite folks from work. Invite! Invite!

During this strange week pray about your place in our church. Pray about where you will attend and support. Pray about where you will lead and make a commitment to do so. On January 2, 2022, during our morning service you will be given a chance to come forward to the Altar Rail and make a commitment to God and this Church about where and how you will serve. I look forward to seeing you then.




### **CHURCH FLOWERS**

- A. Acquired a portable smoker/grill and 30-gallon jambalaya pot for fund raisers.
- **B.** Participated in the following mission projects:
- 1) 4-21-21 Cooked 200 chicken quarters and served meals at Wesley Chapel, SELU.
- 2) 5-23-21 Cooked 100 chicken halves, sausage and lamb chops for CUMC picnic at Barry & Hope Bickham's home.
- 3) June/July 2021 Prepared 25 additional flood buckets costing about \$80/bucket (total of 50 buckets for flood victims).
- 4) July 2021 initiated Kenyan School Uniform fund raiser. Coin bags were distributed to congregation & Sunday School kids.
- 5) 9-10-21 delivered 49 flood buckets to flooded LaPlace Methodist Church and served 200+ jambalaya dinners to hurricane victims and first responders at St. Charles Methodist Church in Destrehan.
- 6) 9-17-21 Prepared and served 200+ grilled chicken dinners for Hurricane Ida victims at Independence, La.
- 7) 9-26-21 Prepared and served 400 + grilled chicken plates as a fund raiser for Kenyan uniforms and Vidalia Methodist Church.
- 8) 11-12-21 Cooked jambalaya for 50 at Bogue Chitto State Park (CUMC campout).
