The Angel of the Lord appeared to Gideon and said, "The Lord is with you, you mighty warrior", Judges 6:12. Apparently Gideon is on my mind lately. It's a great story and I invite you to read all about Gideon and his exploits in chapters 6-8 of the Book of Judges.

Gideon was certainly perplexed by this statement from the Angel of the Lord. He didn't feel as though God was with him and he most assuredly didn't feel like a mighty warrior. The Midianites and the Amalekites were running amok in Israel. Scripture tells us they were pillaging and plundering their way across the country. Livestock were being stolen or slaughtered. Crops were trampled or destroyed. Gideon was threshing wheat using a wine press to hide from the Midianites. He felt far away from God. In fact, he really blamed God for all the oppression he and the Israelites were suffering.

He also didn't see himself as much of a warrior. He tried to protest when the Angel addressed him as a mighty warrior. He said that he was the least of his father's children. And he was from the least clan and least tribe to boot. In Gideon's mind, there surely had to be someone more qualified to lead an army and liberate the Israelites from oppression.

I think we all have times where we identify with Gideon. Maybe there are times we don't feel like God is really with us. Maybe we don't feel worthy of being called to do anything for God. Or maybe both. Let me help clear some of this up for you. God, throughout scripture, uses the ordinary for his purposes. He seems to always call the least qualified, the least imposing and the weaker person to be his warriors. And God is always near to us, even when we distance ourselves from Him, He is there, just waiting on us to turn back to Him.

One of the great lessons of Gideon's story is that the victory belongs to God, not us. God chooses to use the less qualified and less worthy folks among us so that we can't brag about the victory being won by our strength or cunning or ingenuity. The battle and the victory belong to God.

I pray that you begin to see yourself this year as the mighty warrior that you can be. You might think of yourself as weak or insignificant, but God sees you as the warrior for his kingdom that he is creating you to be. Just let God do his thing with you, yield yourself to his Lordship and let yourself be used. The Lord is with you, you mighty warrior, now go live like it is true.

PROGRESS REPORT ON SCHOOL UNIFORMS 2022/2023





THE WORK HAS BEGAN

On Wednesday, November 2, 2022, Centenary United Methodist Church in Franklinton wired \$1,925 USD to Church's Account. On Thursday, November 3, 2022, \$1,925 USD arrived safely into the church account @the rate of Kenyan Shillings 118.42 per dollar, giving us a total of Kenya Shillings 224,991 for the school uniforms. On behalf of Chepkoiyo community and Kamasai missionary area where most children have been selected to benefit from the 2023 support, we thank you all at Centenary United Methodist Church in Franklinton, USA.

We identified 100 students from two schools, within Chepkoiyo village and Kamasai missionary area. The tailor is currently in the progress of taking measurements, work done 80% so far. Before we break for Christmas holiday, she shall have taken all the measurement in Kamasai area. Sewing of uniforms will begin on 28th of December through mid January 2023. Because of increase in prices of materials, each uniform (Girls-shirt and dress; Boys-shirts and shorts) will take Kenya Shillings 1,500 per student. Th remaining Kenya Shillings 74,991 will be used to purchase face masks to benefit other children too within the schools.

This report samples pictures and stories of few children from Chepkoiyo, Mission School, to demonstrate the criteria the church leaders used to select beneficiaries and what some of the student beneficiaries had to say when asked to say a work to friends at Centenary.

May our Lord God continue to bless you all with good health and perfect peace. May our good Lord continue to bless your ministry.
