NEXT STEPS

Our church has officially voted to disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church. What are the next steps?

The vote will be approved by a special session of the Louisiana Annual Conference on May 27, 2023.

If approved, and there should not be any issues, separation will be official on May 31, 2023.

The office staff and church leadership is busy changing our official name with the Secretary of State, obtaining a new Federal Tax ID number, changing names on our banking accounts, removing the Cross and Flame emblem from all church property, setting up a new web page and all the other administrative changes that need to take place,

We will have to purchase new Hymnals. The United Methodist Hymnal we currently use is exclusively for use in United Methodist Congregations. We are looking at purchasing a Hymnal from Seedbed Publishing named "Our Great Redeemer's Praise." Information will soon follow with how to purchase one in memory or honor of someone. Our current United Methodist Hymnals will eventually be boxed up and given to the Louisiana Annual Conference per the withdrawal agreement. If your family purchased one of these hymnals in honor or memory of someone and you wish to have that particular hymnal, it will be made available to you.


We will begin exploring whether we will remain independent or associate with another Wesleyan/Methodist denomination. Some disaffiliating churches are choosing to remain independent, but the majority are moving toward the new Global Methodist Church. We will have a series of meetings to discuss our options and will vote when everyone is comfortable and ready.

I will be traveling to Jackson, MS., this Saturday May 6, 2023, to hear from Bishop Scott Jones who has left the United Methodist Church and has joined the Global Methodist Church. Bishop Jones will be giving an update on the current state of the GMC. Bishop Jones will be speaking and taking questions from 2:00-3:30pm, at Holy Trinity Anglican Church in Madison, MS. The meeting is open to anyone, and I welcome anyone who may want to attend with me.

We will have meetings on Wednesday evening May 10, 2023, Sunday evening May 14, 2023, and Wednesday evening May 17, 2023. All meetings will be at 6:00PM. We will have additional meetings if needed or desired.

The book club will meet on Monday, May 15th at 11:00 a.m. May's book is Moloka'I by Alan Brennert. Please come with a suggested summer reading list.


