Advent

Advent is a time of waiting...and preparing to welcome the Lord. In the reading plan below, the first three readings feature themes of anticipation, preparation, and welcome. The fourth reading provides an opportunity to reflect on what it means to imitate Jesus by becoming a little child, just as he did.

- Week I: Zacchaeus (Luke 19:2-10)
- Week 2: Martha and Mary (Luke 10:38-42)
- Week 3: The Visitation of Mary (Luke 1:39–49)
- Week 4: Jesus and the Little Children (Matthew 18:1–5 and 19:13–15)

Christmas

Many Christians forget that Christmas is not a single day, but an entire season that ends on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Here is a reading plan for the Christmas season;

- Week I: The Birth of Jesus (Luke 2:1-20) or Following the Star of the Messiah (Matthew 2:1–12)
- Week 2: The Holy Family Flees to Egypt (Matthew 2:13–15, 19–21)
- Week 3: The Finding of Jesus in the Temple (Luke 2:41–51)
- Week 4: John Baptizes Jesus in the River Jordan (Mark 1:4–11)

Lent I

This is the first of two Lenten reading plans; the second, below, suggests doing readings from the Passion during Holy Week:

- Week I: The Last Supper (Luke 22:14-34)
- Week 2: In the Garden of Gethsemane (Matthew 26:36–46) and/or Betrayal and Arrest (Mark 14:43-52) and/or Peter Denies Jesus (Luke 22:54-62)
- Week 3: Jesus Before Pilate (Mark 15:1-20)
- Week 4: The Way of the Cross (Luke 23:26-32)
- Week 5: The Crucifixion of Jesus (Luke 23:33-43)
- Week 6: The Death and Burial of Jesus (Luke 23:44-56)

Lent 2

This Lenten reading plan is designed to be used with the reading plan for Holy Week (below).

- Week I: Jesus Feeds the People (Matthew 14:14-20)
- Week 2: Jesus Calls Peter to Walk on Water (Matthew 14:22–33)
- Week 3: Jesus Heals a Blind Man (Mark 10:46-52)
- Week 4: The Woman Caught in Adultery (John 8:2-11)
- Week 5: The Raising of Lazarus (John 11:1-7, 17-44)
- Week 6: Jesus Cleanses the Temple (Matthew 21:12–17)
- Week 7: The Anointing of Jesus (John 12:1-8)

Holy Week

This reading plan can be used by itself during Holy Week, or in addition to the second Lenten reading plan above.

- Palm Sunday: Jesus Enters Jerusalem (Luke 19:35-44)
- Monday: The Last Supper (Luke 22:14-34)
- Tuesday: In the Garden of Gethsemane (Matthew 26:36-46)
- Wednesday: Betrayal and Arrest (Mark 14:43-52)
- Thursday: Peter Denies Jesus (Luke 22:54-62) and/or Jesus Before Pilate (Mark 15:1-20)
- Friday: The Way of the Cross (Luke 23:26-32) and/or The Crucifixion of Jesus (, Luke 23:33-43)
- Saturday: The Death and Burial of Jesus (Luke 23:44-56)

Easter

The Easter season lasts seven weeks, from Easter Sunday through the Feast of the Ascension. The first three weeks of this plan feature stories of the Resurrection; the remaining four weeks focus on themes of healing, renewal, and the call to discipleship.
