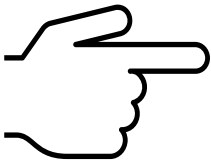


The Day After Pentecost

Weeks ago, the Magistrate directed The Judahite's attention to his presentation entitled *The Day After Pentecost 2022*.

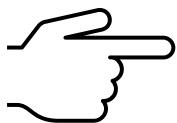

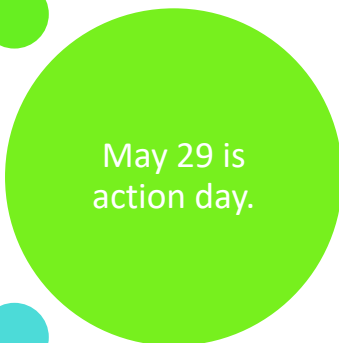
The appointed time given for 1st phase implementation.
