From Pastor Kurt

This month Lutherans throughout the world observe Reformation Day. On October 31, All Saints Eve (Hallow'een) in 1517, a young Augustinian monk and Professor of Bible at Wittenberg, Germany, posted 95 propositions for an academic debate on the castle church door, which served as a community bulletin board. Martin Luther had no idea he was about to set off a fire-storm that eventually would change the face of Europe. The movement he started would become known as the Reformation and one of the churches resulting from the split of the Roman Catholic church would take his name, the Lutheran church.

At the heart of Luther's theology is the insistence that the good News of Jesus Christ is always proclaimed as a promise of new life, without any barriers or conditions. Here's an example of such promise filled proclamation: "Because Jesus died on the cross and now lives with death behind him, his love for others is victorious. There-

fore you are free to love your neighbor, not as a way of earning God's favor, but simply because your neighbor is in need." Hearing this proclamation as Good News for you is what Luther means by "faith." Faith is not a separate work we perform. Faith is the joyful response of hearing a gospel promise.

By the time Luther was active the medieval church had often obscured the gospel promise. Pilgrimages, indulgences, monastic vows, acts of repentance and contrition; all sorts of "good works" pushed the responsibility of salvation on the hearer and took it away from Christ. Luther's own spiritual despair that God's grace was so far away as to be unobtainable led him into hopeless depression.

But Luther was a scholar of the Bible. As he read deeper into the original languages of Hebrew and Greek he began to hear this gospel promise

for himself. "Since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; they are now justified (made right) by (God's) grace as a gift.." (Romans 3:23-24). He began to teach this in his classes and draw out the implications of this good news for the life of the church. This was the debate he hoped would happen when he posted his propositions to the church door.

Hearing the gospel of Jesus as promise is what made me a "Lutheran." It turns out Luther never wanted his followers to be named after him, but in the end he didn't get that choice. I'm glad to wear the name because behind it stands the man and the movement that is still so very relevant today. The world still needs to hear the only Good News that makes a real difference, that Jesus Christ lives and in him all things are made new.

Congregation Joins Ephrata Area Social Services in Food Distribution

A new partnership serving the needs of the hungry begins this month as Swamp Lutheran teams with Ephrata Area Social Services (EASS). A box of nutritious fresh produce as well as non-perishable items will be distributed to individuals and families beginning Wednesday, October 14 and continuing on the second Wednesday of the month. The goal is to provide 20 to 25 boxes each month.

EASS, working with The Central Pennsylvania Food Bank, will provide the fresh and frozen food items which will be delivered directly to the church. Swamp Lutheran will collect non-perishable items as well as provide the volunteers to assemble the boxes and distribute them to individuals for pick-up at the church.

Non-perishable canned and dry goods may be brought to the church each Sunday or to the church during regular office hours. Please note that we cannot distribute any items past their expiration date. A rotating group of volunteers are also needed to work once a month from about noon until 3:00 p.m. assembling boxes and distributing them to individuals and families. If you are interested in volunteering please speak to John Frantz.
