From Pastor Kurl

For many years my family keeps a July 4 tradition. We watch the movie version of the Broadway musical "1776." The movie brings to life the events surrounding the debate in the Continental Congress in Philadelphia whether or not the 13 English colonies in America should declare independence from Great Britain, the drafting of a Declaration of Independence, and its final passage. Watching the movie each year reminds us these were real people struggling with an idea never tried before; the breaking away from a mother country and creating a new nation.

As citizens of the United States of America we celebrate our nation's founding on July 4, this year

falling on a Sunday. We do well to take this time to remind ourselves of the founding principles enshrined in those original documents. "We hold these truths to be selfevident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness." An unanswered question at the time of the Declaration's drafting concerned who was to be included in the phrase "all men are created equal." Many of our nation's conflicts centered on defining and struggling over expanding who was to be included in that phrase and allowed and encouraged to participate in the voting fran-

chise; Blacks, Native Americans, Women. In many ways the struggle continues to the present day.

"All people are created equal." As faithful Christians we are committed to such a statement. The origin story (Genesis 1:26-27, 2:5-25) of God creating the first human beings enshrines this basic truth in our lives. Whatever divisions arise between people, whether based on race, culture, or gender, are of human origin and not divine origin. As Christians we are called to affirm this "self-evident" truth. As citizens of this nation we are called to continue the work of ensuring that no one is excluded from this basic truth of our founding.



Why Three Baptismal Fonts at Swamp? by Pastor Denny Trout



When Swamp was built in 1959, the first font was dedicated. This modern dish design is now located in the Narthex. The positioning, at the entrance of the building, is appropriate because Baptism is how one enters the Christian faith.

The second font is located between the Nave and the Chancel area. Both fonts are used but the latter is more convenient during worship services. This font was designed by Pastor Trout and skillfully created by Raymond Weitzel for the 200th Anniversary of the Swamp Congregation, 1806-2006. (Ray also made the library table in honor of that anniversary date). The idea for the font was to have running water representing alive in Christ. (nothing lives, is nourished or cleansed in this world without water, a symbol of Baptism). The use of water is no accident, therefore, realizing three fourths of the earths' surface is water and about the same percentage of the human body is water. In this font there three tiers. They represent the Trinity. The sea shell is the Christian symbol of Baptism.

The third font is at the back door of the building as a symbolic memorial of "whose" we are! This marble font was salvaged from the Zion Lutheran Church in Union Deposit (5 West Main Street). Pastor John Vought, who is Pastor Trout's close friend, was not sure what to do with the font when they remodeled the building. Pastor Trout volunteered to rescue this hand carved piece of marble. At first he was not sure what to do with it either, so it stood as a bird bath in his garden. Seemingly not appropriate, Pastor Trout moved it to the church where it sits now. It was one of the few things that survived the fire of 2010, which now gives it even more significance. "In Christ We Endure"!
