From Pastor Kurt

The Church of Jesus is “in the world” but also not “of the world.” I’m not being deliberately confusing by that statement. I actually mean something quite important.

The Church is comprised of ordinary people who live regular lives in a day to day manner. We go to school, live in families, engage in commerce, have jobs, take vacations, raise children, consume entertainment, volunteer in our communities, vote for people we believe will serve us best. We live in the world alongside lots of different people, most of whom do not share our faith in Jesus. Yet we must cooperate and engage in activities that make the world in which we live not just tolerable, but a better place for ourselves and the generations who will follow us. The Church is always “in the world.”

But the Church is not “of the world,” either.

There are worldly values the Church is called to resist because we are followers of Jesus and not someone else. Self-interest, greed, making judgements about others based on birth-given characteristics, revenge, intolerance, to name just a few of the values incompatible with Christian discipleship. The way of Jesus means loving your neighbor in the same way you love yourself. But even more than that. The way of Jesus means being willing to give of yourself for the sake of your neighbor, making sacrifices for your neighbor in need. These are not worldly values. It’s what I mean when we say the Church is not “of the world.”

We know, however, that life is not that simple. We can’t simply divide ourselves into “worldly” and “unworldly” spheres of

living. Life is a lot more messy than that. But it also means we don’t simply give up and stop trying to live as faithful disciples of Jesus. We need to ask ourselves each and every day, “Is what I am doing today reflective of a follower of Jesus? How am I witnessing to the call to be faithful to the one who went to the cross on my behalf?”

Martin Luther called this way of living “sinning boldly.” He didn’t mean deliberately sinning in life. He meant that even our decisions to follow Jesus faithfully will always be colored by worldly values of self-interest. We are both “in” but not “of” the world. Because Jesus knows we live in both worlds at the same time we are assured of his constant love and forgiveness. We live under an umbrella of grace, living “in” the world but always moving towards that more perfect world in which Jesus calls us.

Call Committee—Interviewed candidate #3 on 7/19
Went to see them preach 8/15 and checked references and the com-

Next Steps:

We will be setting up a one hour meeting with just call
committee and council to answer any questions and
give intro information on the candidate.

Then do an interview with the candidate until all ques-
tions are addressed.

If all are in agreement the candidate will come to our
church and lead the worship service. Afterwards,
there will be a congregational meeting to vote. If the
vote is at least 2/3 positive, then the candidate has
30 days to accept the call.

Other items discussed: Pastor Strause will be spending more time visiting in homes and hospitals. He is trying to bring Holy Communion to as many homebound and nursing home residents as possible. If you know someone who would like to receive Holy Communion please contact the pastor or call the office.

The COVID task force will meet tomorrow to reassess the current COVID situation and will make recommendations to council.

The roof update: \$44,006 total has been received. We have reached our goal in the 2 year period.
