From Pastor Scott

"I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?" Isaiah 43:19a

Appropriately enough, my first Sunday leading worship with you was Reformation Day, October 31. On Reformation Day, the church celebrates the day in 1517 when Martin Luther, an Augustinian monk and professor of theology, nailed his Ninety-Five Theses to the church door in Wittenberg, Germany. Luther's study of scripture led him to conclude that many of the church's practices and doctrines were not aligned with scripture.

The purpose of his posting of those theses was to foster public debate. It worked. In fact, it sparked much debate and ultimately launched what historians call the Reformation which divided the Western Church into Roman Catholic and Protestant camps. Luther and those of like mind were kicked out of the Roman Church, forcing them to establish their own independent worshipping communities. We Lutherans are the product of the Reformation.

However, we must re-

member that the real main character in Reformation Day is not Luther. It's the Word of God. What Luther discovered is that for centuries, the true teachings of the Word of God had been hidden by century upon century of tradition. That's what Reformation Day is about: it's about pulling back the covers and re-God and the beauty and the truth of the gospel. That's why we celebrate Reformation Day.

At Swamp, as I begin my service as your pastor, we too have begun a new chapter in the life of the church. One strength I see is the strong committee and mission work you do. I perceive a real sense of Christian community at work at Swamp. Another intriguing thing for me about Swamp is your commitment to the past combined with an openness to new directions and approaches to worship and mission. That is, while you respect your traditions, I sense a desire for renewal and some new beginnings.

Do not be alarmed, I do not come here with a multi-point action plan to impose upon the worshipping community at Swamp. For now, I want to get

to know you better and observe how things are done currently. Sure, I have some ideas, but I don't claim to have all the answers. Likewise, I am not the main character in Swamp's future. The main character is God. I firmly believe that the Holy Spirit works in and through all of us. Consequently, I see my role leasing the power of the Word of as guiding a process of exploration and visioning as we discern just what God is up to here and what God is calling us to be and do. I hope that you will join in this process as it unfolds.

> We must never forget that along with our challenges come opportunities. Since the only constant is change, I am sure that over the next several years we will reform as we do some new things but, in the process, we will respect our traditions as we create new ones. As the saying goes, we must avoid throwing the baby out with the bath water! Let us always remain faithful to God and respectful of one another.

I am feeling so blessed to join you in the Holy Adventure that God is calling us to embark upon together. May God continue to bless and keep us all.

CHURCH COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS OCTOBER 20, 2021

Council Meeting Highlights 20 October 2021

Your Council met Wednesday, October 20, 2021. Highlights include:

Learning Committee: Swamp will be hosting a "Fall Blessing" on November 21, 2021. They will do pumpkin decorating, pumpkin bowling, playing fall bingo and other fun games. They are asking everyone to bring a non-perishable food item for the food bank. More details to follow.

Love, Inc: The family has moved out and they are currently seeking a new family.

Service Committee: The community meal held Thursday, October 14 served 56 people.

They will again be doing the reverse advent calendar.

The summer lunch program served between 50 and 60 lunches at each of the district's parks, Reamstown, Adamstown and Reinholds. Thanks to Denise Kidwell, Ruth Kramer, Gaile Gehman, Pat & Nancy McQuate and Lori Sauder.

Community meals for 2022 are scheduled for January 13 and May 12.

Helping Hands: Our food bank has provided food to 12 families in October.

They prepared a funeral luncheon for Sue Kittler.

Will be doing the pig stomach drive thru dinner on Saturday October 30 from 2 until sold out. Would like to ask the congregation to make a dessert for the dinner. It can be dropped off Friday night October 29 from 5-8pm or Saturday morning.

Youth Ministry: Will be making a Thanksgiving meals for families this year. A Christmas event is being planned.

Property: Lighthouse Vocational Services are unable to continue cleaning the church due to staffing shortages. After contacting several cleaning companies, it was decided to hire "A Clean Hometown Services" from Denver to clean the church.

Three new programmable thermostats have been installed in the sanctuary, 2 for the A/C and one for heating.

Bids are being accepted for professional carpet cleaning of the social hall, classrooms and offices. Separate bids will be given for the sanctuary.

Other items discussed: The Treasurer's position on Council will be changed in the by-laws from a voting member to a non-voting member and will be voted on at the annual congregational meeting in December.

The COVID task force made and council approved the following policy:

out of concern for our vulnerable neighbors, we strongly urge all people to wear a mask while inside the church.


