From Paston Scott

Dear Friends in Christ, Happy New Year! At least that is my prayer for us all. 2021 has been another difficult year under the shadow of the COVID pandemic. I doubt many of us escaped unscathed or unaffected in some way by the pandemic. Friends, coworkers, or loved ones have either been infected or worse. This, of course, is on top of all the other trials and travails of

ordinary life. We are weary.

I, for one, am particularly chagrined that I contracted COVID right before Christmas, although I am fully vaccinated and have the booster (kept my symptoms mild). I have recovered. It grieved me to not be able to lead you in worship inside the church. Sigh. I want to thank Guy Templin and my daughter, Abigail, for their technical and production assistance with the live Zoom service I was able to Time is a time for growth and lead from my living room on Christmas Eve. For those who were able to watch it, I hope it penetrate ever more deeply

left you fed in Word and Spirit. It is still available on the website.

Looking ahead, I long for the ordinary. I am sure you do too. And yet, in the life of the church, Ordinary time are those times of the year when we are not observing feasts, special sessions, or solemnities. We Lutherans do not talk much (or at all) about Ordinary Time, but our Catholic siblings do. According to the US Conference of Catholic Bishops, "Christmas Time and Easter Time highlight the central mysteries of the Paschal Mystery, namely, the incarnation, death on the cross, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus Christ, and the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. The Sundays and weeks of Ordinary Time, on the other hand, take us through the life of Christ... Ordinary maturation, a time in which the mystery of Christ is called to

into history until all things are finally caught up in Christ."

Ordinary time, then, does not mean ho-hum time. It is a term based on the Latin term. ordo, which means order and is tied into counting time. Thus, the numbered weeks of Ordinary Time, in fact, represent the ordered life of the Church—the period in which we live our lives neither in feasting (as in the Christmas and Easter seasons) or in more severe penance (as in Advent and Lent), but in watchfulness and expectation of the Second Coming of Christ.

Know that life is not yet normal, per se, but that we live in expectant hope even though things continue to seem out of order and disorienting. Live in that ordinary time where we focus on the life and teachings of Christ that not only comfort us but guide our lives of love for our neighbors in need. Blessings to you all for the new In Christ, Pastor Scott year!



CHURCH COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS DECEMBER 15, 2021

Council Meeting Highlights 15 December 2021

Your Council met Wednesday, December 15, 2021. Highlights include:

Learning Committee: On November 21, the 4 youth and the leaders prepared meals for 2 families.

- ♦ 28 Hospitality baskets were put together and delivered.
- ◆ The Christmas program will be held today. Santa will be in the social hall after the program.
- A request was made to put a survey before the congregation concerning changing the Sunday School times before Council votes. Pastor Brubaker will put together a draft survey and send it to Council for approval. After council approval it will be put on the website, email and also a hard copy will available in the church. Please vote!

Service Committee: They will again be doing the reverse advent calendar. The food will be used in our food bank.

The next community meal will be January 13, 2022. See Jodi Showalter if you are interested in helping.

Disaster Response: After a discussion on the Kentucky tornado disaster...it was decided to use the disaster relief offerings from the next four services for the tornado relief.

Helping Hands: Our food bank has provided food to 13 families in November.

Served lunch for Hanging of the Greens and cookies for the Night of Music.

Youth Ministry: December 5th was their Christmas party.

They are planning snow tubing in January with surrounding congregations.

- **Property:** Ray Weitzel attended the meeting to explain the door locks to Council. After a discussion, Council voted to move the lock box inside the building so Service folks can get in the building without having anyone go to the church to open doors for them. This is being done on a temporary basis
- Carpet cleaning will be done by Woods Carpet Cleaning of Lancaster at a cost of \$3000.

- New blue tooth electronic programmable thermostats are installed in the sanctuary for AC and Heating units.
- New heat pump control board installed for office unit.
- ◆ Front lawn 75 watt LED lights replaced with 125 watt LED units
- Boiler state inspection completed and passed. Will get certificate in the mail.
- New regulation by West Cocalico Twp...Septic system now has to be pumped every 3 years—pumping is scheduled with Nolt's Services.

Scouts: Cub Pack 95 has re-chartered with our church with Pastor Brubaker on their roster.

Worship: Christmas Eve we will have 2 services...4:30 and 7:30pm. December 26 there will be one service at 8:30 with readings and carol singing.

Other items discussed: The COVID task force met and Council approved the following recommendations:

The policy of our church continues: For those who are fully vaccinated, wearing a mask indoors is optional. However, in light of continued high transmission of COVID disease in our area and out of concern for our vulnerable neighbors, we strongly urge all people to wear a mask while inside the church.

If you are not vaccinated, you are <u>required</u> to wear a mask while inside the church.

Every other pew in the sanctuary will be roped off to provide distance between family units starting Christmas Eve.

Added chairs will be added to the overflow area starting Christmas Eve and moving forward until numbers decrease.

Pastor Brubaker's installation will be held January 9th 2022 at 4pm with a reception after.

From Stewardship to Generosity

A reflection by Rev. Robert Schnase "Giving, not getting, is the way. Generosity begets generosity."

-Luke 6:38, The Message

What's the difference between "stewardship" and "generosity?" What comes to mind when you hear those words? For what distinctive purposes are they best suited? How do people respond to those terms?

We are stewards of the earth. We are stewards of those things entrusted to us, inherited by us, and earned by us. We are stewards of our wealth and possessions and physical bodies. Stewards are people in ancient times who were trustees, who had responsibilities, who cared for things owned by someone else. Today you don't hear much about stewards and stewardship outside the church; it's a language derived from our biblical roots and our church heritage. It risks becoming insider language, not easily accessible or immediately understandable by those new to the church.

Generosity is an aspect of character. The opposite of generosity is selfishness, self-centeredness, greed, and self-absorption. No stories from Scripture tell of people living the God-related spiritual life while fostering a greedy attitude. Generosity extends beyond merely the use of money, although it most definitely includes that. There are generous spirits; generous souls; people who are generous with their time, with their teaching, with their love. Generosity finds many biblical sources, and is a fruit of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22-23). It sounds more organic, more generative, less legalistic, less formal than stewardship.

Generosity is not a spiritual attribute someone acquires apart from the actual practice of giving. It becomes discernable through action. We never describe people as generous who keep everything for themselves and only serve themselves.

Generosity focuses on the spiritual qualities of the giver, derived from the generosity of God, rather than on the church's need for money. One of these terms is not superior to the other. Perhaps there are shades of differences in how they are perceived by young and old, those new to the faith from those long-established in our churches. Using both wisely helps us reach people at different places on the journey of faith.

What has been your experience with the term "stewardship?" With "generosity?" What's the difference between them?

Which most helpfully inspires your giving as you seek to grow in the image of God and in service to Christ?
