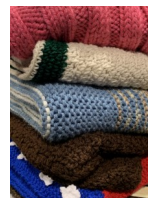

CONFIRMATION CAMP Eight youth from Swamp attended the Lancaster County Confirmation Camp held at Camp Kirchenwald on June 17-25. Swamp Students attending were Beckah Koehle, Brooke Koehle, Haylee Martin, Lillie Martin, Madison Nye, Molli Smith, Maya Van Zant, and Melia Van Zant. Overall, 36 students participated. Educational sessions were held in the mornings and regular camp activities occurred the remainder of the day. Campers enjoyed swimming, hiking, canoeing, climbing, high ropes, nature walks, worship, and Capture the Flag! Additionally, campers went on an excursion one morning to The Wittel Farm near Elizabethtown to learn about sustainable farming, creation care, and to participate in weeding and harvesting. Pastor Scott spent the week at Camp Kirchenwald to teach and experience camp along with our students. He says, “By the grace of God, I managed to climb the tower via the rock wall course” but concluded that he was “not 25 anymore!” Special thanks to Connie and Jen Taylor for their assistance teaching several of the educational sessions.



GUESS WHO?

I was baptized at Swamp Lutheran & Reformed Church when I was 13 years old. I attended church every Sunday. One Sunday the preacher would be there from the Reformed Church, the next Sunday the preacher would be from Swamp Lutheran Church. I was a member of the Luther League. We would help at church dinners and various church functions. I remember going to “Home Coming” at the Reformed Church where Swamp, Mellinger’s and Lincoln Congregations came and worshipped together. The combined choirs would sing. There would be featured soloist. And we always had great tasting food. This event was held in August. I also remember going to Church dances, Halloween parties, and going to Dart ball games – all held at the Church. During WWII, we would be given addresses of Soldiers serving in the war. We would write them letters. Sometimes I would write to more than one soldier each week - including Nurses. At one time, there used to be a picture of those that served hanging in the church.

We walked everywhere! I remember as a kid, walking to Blainsport to the Fire Dam where we would go swimming. The Fire Dam was located on Route 897 near Texter Mountain Road. I attended Denver High School. It had a Fire Slide on one side of the building. It is now an apartment building. I was a High School Sophomore when Peace was declared. School was dismissed. We all went to Church to celebrate the end of the war.

I had a few jobs starting with hemming the bottom of shirts, putting straps on Loafer shoes, removing pullers from full fashion hosiery using a plastic pick. Occasionally we would make nylons that had a black bow at the heel. I became a Manager in a knitting mill located at Mechanic Street & Creamery Road in Reinholds. I had 75 girls working under me. One item we made there was a “Shimmy Shirt” for young girls and Winnie the Pooh tops. I retired from Keystone Nite-wear in 1968.

I do a special job for Swamp Lutheran Church. This is a job that I love. I started this job under Pastor Minnich where I served on the Swamp 25th Anniversary Committee. I continued in this task after the committee completed this event. A lot of my work was lost during the fire in 2010. I helped in the Dedication of the Stained Glass Window and also on Swamp’s 100th Anniversary. I continue to collect as much detail as I can.

I have seen a few ministers at Swamp Lutheran Church. There is something at Swamp that feels “homey”. Pastor Minnick served our church for 33 years and Pastor Trout served our church for 50 years. Seasons come, seasons go. Time marches on. But at Swamp Lutheran Church, we continue on together as a Church Family – striving to be part of God’s family as best we can.

SCHOOL KITS

LWR SCHOOL KITS— Last year, Swamp assembled and delivered 108 backpacks to the LWR pick-up site. Thank you to all who donated supplies and helped us reach this goal!

We are presently accepting donations of items for this year's Lutheran World Relief School Kit Project through the end of September. Please help make this year's project a success. **Donations may be given to Jane Lesh, Denise Null and Connie Taylor.** Questions to Debbie Carvell 717-336-5638.

Items most needed: **notebooks, scissors, crayons, and pens.**

Items not needed: No backpacks (thanks to Jane!) No pencils thanks to a generous donor.

We appreciate everyone following the guidelines listed below, as Lutheran World Relief will not send anything that doesn't adhere to these guidelines. Each backpack will contain:

70-80 sheet notebooks of wide or college ruled paper approximately 8" x 10 1/2" – 4 per backpack

30-centimeter ruler or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other side – 1 per backpack

Pencil sharpeners – 1 per backpack

Blunt scissors (safety scissors). (They must say this on the packaging) – 1 per backpack

Unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers – 5 per backpack (**We have enough**)

Black or blue ink pens – 5 per backpack

Packs of 16 or 24 crayons – 1 pack per backpack

2 1/2" erasers – 1 per backpack

Muscle Memory

A reflection by Rev. Robert Schnase

“Therefore, show ... the proof of your love and the reason for our pride in you, so that the churches see it.”

-2 Corinthians 8:24, NIV

“Sarah grew up in a family that practiced tithing, and as a child she put ten cents in the offering plate for each dollar she received. She remembers receiving her first paycheck of \$56 from her first job as a teenager, and her sense of achievement and delight when she gave \$5.60 to the church. Now in her forties, Sarah has a high-paying job as a senior executive, and tithing continues to feel natural, a regular pattern of her life. She does it with ease and grace. ‘I love giving,’ she says, ‘and I cannot imagine living my life or loving God without giving back. Giving is one of the great joys of my life. Tithing was learned and practiced so early that I developed the muscle memory for giving. Like practicing my tennis serve for so many years that I don’t have to think about each step, my giving is part of who I am.’

For someone beginning to tithe, Sarah’s level of discipleship may appear unachievable. But with practice, anyone can develop spiritual ‘muscle memory.’

As those who consistently practice the tithe know, proportional giving (giving a set percentage of income) and tithing force people to look at their earning, saving, and spending through God’s eyes. It reminds them that their ultimate worth is derived from the assurance that they are children of God, created by God, and infinitely loved by God. God’s eternal love revealed in Christ is the source of self-worth; true happiness and meaning are found in growing in grace and in the knowledge and love of God.

Giving generously reprioritizes lives and helps people distinguish what is lasting, eternal, and of infinite value from what is temporary, illusory, and untrustworthy. The discipline of generous giving places people on the balcony, helping them look out at the consumerist society with new perspective, better able to see its traps, deceptions, and myths. The practice of generosity is a means by which God builds people up, strengthens their spirits, and equips them to service God’s purposes.”

Read 2 Corinthians 8. Paul concludes by saying that our giving is a proof of our love for God. Can we possibly desire God to shape our souls without giving?

If you practice proportional giving or tithing, does this practice affect your other spending habits?

If you do not practice proportional giving or tithing, what are the obstacles to a greater generosity toward God?

2022 Assembly Actions

- ☐ Adopted the agenda and Rules of Procedure.
- ☐ Adopted the proposed budget for FY 2023 of \$2,320,000.
- ☐ Adopted the beginning minimum base salary and housing allowance for 2023 of \$57,760 for ministers of Word and Sacrament who serve full time at the time of their ordination and the beginning minimum salary for 2023 when housing is provided of \$40,185 for ministers of Word and Sacrament who serve full time at the time of their ordination.
- ☐ Adopted the beginning minimum salary for 2023 of \$53,865 for ministers of Word and Service who serve full time at the time of their ordination.
- ☐ Elected Synod Council members: Debra Barrett, the Rev. Angela Hammer, Hallie McCoy, Andrea Oslikova, the Rev. Ben Siebert, and Evan Williams.
- ☐ Amended bylaw S11.05.01. to make the language agree with the Audit Committee Charter, a policy of this synod, and assure the independence of the committee.
- ☐ Added bylaw S7.26.01. to establish the process by which baptized and confirmed members of synod-authorized worshipping communities may be certified as voting members of synod assemblies.
