GUESS WHO?

I was confirmed at Swamp Lutheran Church when I was 18 years old in the Reformed Church. I met my wife at Moyer's Restaurant on the corner of Main Street and Mechanic Street in Reinholds. We have 2 daughters and a son. I owned a business from 1966 - 1989. I have seen many trains come & go. Since then, I have done various jobs here and there. I have served on the Church Property Committee. I was on the Call Committee after Pastor Minnich died. I helped in the Church Cemetery, marking the graves and also closing them after the service. I was Church Council President and then Financial Secretary for some time.

We did not have yearly Church Picnics. Instead, we had Parish Homecoming Services. Pastor Minnich started them in August 1939. The Parish consisted of Salem Lutheran Church (Lincoln), Mellinger's Church and Swamp Lutheran Church. The services were held at Swamp Reform at the Band Shell and their social hall. (We were sharing the church with them at this time). There would be Sunday School in the morning along with Church Services. Music was provided by the Choirs all day. In the afternoon and again in the evening, church services were highlighted with ministers from other churches. Lunch and dinner were served in the Social Hall by the church ladies. We would have Hamburgers, Hotdogs and Chicken Corn Soup.

I also helped in the kitchen for the Mother / Daughter Banquet. I was the "clean up guy". Usually, the dishes waited until after the program ended. I thought it would be a good idea to wash the dishes as they were being emptied and stacked instead of waiting to clean up later. I also participated in the Enter-tainment Program. We had a "Special Boscov's Fashion Show" featuring guys dressed up like the gals. I remember one guy singing, "Tip toe through the Tu-lips". I dressed like a pregnant woman pushing a baby coach!

Swamp Church shows that God has a humorous side. Swamp Lutheran Church has survived some very serious events. While our "A-frame" church was being erected in 1958, the pylon crashed to the ground. There were people working on site and people watching this memorable occasion and by the Grace of God – no one was injured. We worked through our Church Funds being embezzled and also Pastor Trout's Pension Fund. And then there was the fire during the blizzard in 2010. I think I was the last person on the property. That day I was helping to plow snow. And then the fire started later that day. We are stubborn Dutchmen. We push on. We don't let anything stop us.

When we voted on building our "A-Frame" church, we did not have the funding we needed. But we moved forward trusting God to see us through. I am very proud to have been a part of that. God is still with us today and He will help us to keep on moving forward.

Items most needed: **notebooks, scissors, crayons, and pens. Items not needed:** No backpacks (thanks to Jane!) No pencils thanks to a generous donor.

We appreciate everyone following the guidelines listed below, as Lutheran World Relief will not send anything that doesn't adhere to these guidelines. Each backpack will contain:

70-80 sheet notebooks of wide or college ruled paper approximately 8" x 10 ½" – 4 per backpack

30-centimeter ruler or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other side – I per backpack

Pencil sharpeners – I per backpack

Blunt scissors (safety scissors). (They must say this on the packaging) – I per backpack

Unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers – 5 per backpack (We have enough)

Robust Ministries

A reflection by Rev. Robert Schnase "But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well."

-Matthew 6:33, NIV

"It is through giving of ourselves as God has given to us that we help the body of Christ flourish. Offering our material resources to God is a fundamental activity that is so critical to the church's mission that failure to perform it in an exemplary way leads to the decline of the church. Churches that nurture proportional giving and tithing among their members thrive. They accomplish great things for Christ, offer robust and confident ministry, and they prosper for the purposes of Christ and make a difference in the lives of people.

Every sanctuary and chapel in which we have worshipped, every church organ that has lifted our spirits, every pew where we have sat, every Communion rail where we have knelt, every hymnal from which we have sung, every praise band that has touched our hearts, every church classroom where we have gathered with our friends, every church kitchen that has prepared our meals, ever church van that has taken us to camp, every church camp cabin where we have slept—all are the fruit of someone's Extravagant Generosity.


