When I was 17 years old, I served on our Church Council as the Youth Representative. I have served on Swamp's Church Council probably half of my 32 years here. I also helped teach the Adult Sunday School class.

I love music. I took guitar lessons when I was 10 years old. In Junior High School, I switched to the Bass guitar. I played in the Band, sang in the Chorus. I bought my first Bass in my Freshman year in High School. I played with a local Band. We played at Church Dances and in some Bars. I was invited to play Bass with a band called "Country Addition." I was 17 years old. The other guys were 40 something. We played Rock and Blues music. Darryl Dech got me interested to participate here at Swamp. I continue to play in a Band. We have even cut some CD's.

I remember standing next to my Mom in church. She came from a family of 8 kids. They all would break into singing songs including harmony a lot. My one Uncle sang for a Barber Shop Quartet. BUILDING A CULTURE OF GENEROSITY

SWAMP EVANGELICAL LUTHERAN CHURCH

Dear Swamp Lutheran family:

Although I recall how we lived weekly paycheck to weekly paycheck, I grew up in a family that didn't talk much about money. I saw the envelope on the table each week to be taken with us to church, but for the life of me, I cannot tell you if it included \$1 or \$1000. We never talked about it.

So, I guess my family was generous within its means. I learned to give each week, but I didn't learn what to give. Fortunately, people have mentored that for me.

When I was in seminary, twice per year a church friend would send me a check for \$100 to "help me with my studies." It taught me to think more of others.

Also, while in seminary, I met Sarah. She shared her journey with me. When she and her husband, Doug, first got married, they thought they should tithe 10% because they read about that in the Bible. However, financially, that was not a possibility for them. So, they made a covenant with one another to grow their giving by a percent each year. When Doug died, they were giving away 38% of their income!

Recently, a fellow pastor told me a story of how one of her parishioners, Bob, who is homebound because of his immune system issues called her and asked her to meet him in the parking lot. He handed her a check and said, "I should have given you this last year, but I was worried about the future too much. As I see people hurting, I realized that I actually have enough and I want you to use it to make a difference." It was a check for \$4,000!

I'm surrounded by generous people who continue to teach me about generosity. As we think about our giving for next year, Jen and I have decided that we will increase our monthly automatic online giving by \$80. We aren't sure how exactly that will go with college tuition bills for Abigail on top of our normal expenses, but we have trusted in God's provision in the past and have not been let down yet.

I look forward to hearing more of your stories of generosity as we travel this generosity journey together.
