As we enter the season of Lent this March, we are invited into a time of deep reflection, penitence, and renewal. Lent is not just a time to give something up; it's an opportunity to draw closer to God and to prepare our hearts for the joyous celebration of Easter.

Generosity Minute

Lenten thoughts about wealth

Jesus taught, "Watch out! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; life does not consist in an abundance of possessions." -Luke 12:15 (NIV)

For centuries, Christians have observed the season of Lent by taking on new spiritual practices (such as special prayer or bible reading) or abstaining from things that are enjoyable or extravagant (such as tobacco, chocolate or alcohol).

Lenten disciplines assist us in looking inward, seeing ourselves for who we really are, and with God's help, identifying things that keep us from drawing closer to God. With these awarenesses, and with God's help, we can then do something about them.

It's only fitting that Christians look at their relationship with wealth. Jesus had no problem with wealth, per se, but he repeatedly warns that wealth can distort our values and put a wedge between us and God. Or, worse, that money can supplant God as ruler in our hearts.

For those of us who are comfortable in our incomes and possessions, Lent invites us to look at our relationship with wealth. Here are some ideas for thought and prayer:

- Jesus says, "Life does not consist in an abundance of possessions." How is that different from the
 relentless message our consumer culture gives us? In what, then, would Jesus say our life consists?
 In what does your life consist?
- For Lent, keep a journal of everything you buy. At the end of Lent, analyze what your purchases say about your values, identity, and relationship with wealth.
- For Lent, buy only things you need, and NOT things you merely want. What do you learn in the process.
- For Lent, double your regular giving to charity. Or simply give to the point where it is a sacrifice.
- If you dare, try tithing giving 10 percent of your income to God's work. What do you learn about yourself?

May this Lent be a time when you draw close to the Lord your God.

Flood Bucket Project

SLY needs your help in donating items for flood buckets which will be packed by the Youth and donated to Lutheran Disaster Response to support those impacted by flooding.

Items needed for each bucket:

(do not feel obligated to get everything on this list; some or one is appreciated)

- One Round five-gallon bucket with lid
- (No screw lids. Bucket must be free from all residue. Advertisements on outside are acceptable)
- One 32-64 oz bottle of liquid laundry detergent
- One 16-40 oz bottle of liquid household cleaner
- One 16-34 oz bottle of liquid dish soap
- One 4-8 oz pump spray air freshener (3 solid or gel air fresheners also acceptable)
- One Scrub brush-with or without handle
- Two Non-cellulose sponges
- 18 re-usable wipes. (no terrycloth, microfiber or paper towels; remove from packaging)
- Five scouring pads (no stainless steel or pads with soap in them; remove from packaging)
- 36-50 clothespins
- One 50-100 ft clothesline (cotton or plastic line)
- 24 ct. roll of heavy-duty trash bags (33-45 gallon size; remove from packaging)
- Five N95 particulate respirator dust masks (1-3 mm thickness; no surgical masks)
- Two pairs of durable kitchen gloves (removed from packaging)
- One pair of work gloves (cotton with leather palms or all leather)

All items must be new except for the bucket

Contributions help provide services to people in our community in the areas of food, clothing, SCIAL SERVICES fuel, transportation, and meals on wheels.





Church Council Highlights February 19, 2025

Service:

- The next community meal will be in May.
- The summer lunch program is on June 25.

Kitchen Krew:

• Food bank provided 22 families with 65 individuals with food in February.

Welcome:

- Judy Habecker is stepping down from mailing cards. We sincerely thank Judy for her ministry for so many years!
- 76 cards were mailed in February.
- Game day will be held March 9 at noon with refreshments.

Learning:

- April 19- Easter egg hunt with the Easter Bunny.
- May 18 last day of Sunday school.

Youth Ministry:

- The Souper Bowl of Caring netted 157 lbs. of food for our food bank.
- · March 30 they will assemble disaster flood buckets.
- April 11-12 will be the Flashlight egg hunt and sleepover.

Property:

- On January 26, we had a pipe burst in the old choir room.
- We hired Restoration Relief for the clean-up. The drying out process has been completed.
- Currently, we are working with our insurance company to get the repairs done to the room.
- While we are preparing to finish the room, we have to consider what we want the purpose of the room to be. Any thoughts, see Randy Krater.
- Snow removal- Anyone interested in helping shovel the snow Sunday mornings or weekends when it snows, contact Randy Krater.

Other items discussed:

- Directory update: We have extended the deadline to March 16 to have photos taken or submitted. Photos will continue to be taken on Sunday mornings after the church service.


