Pastoris Message

By the tender mercy of our God, the dawn from on high will break upon us, to give light to those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace. -Luke 1:78-79

As the Thanksgiving holiday comes to a close, our attention focuses on Christmas. In the secular world, we call it the Christmas season with all eyes on Christmas day and family meals, gift giving, and holiday cheer. For the Christian Church, we are about to enter the Advent season which begins on December 1 and ends with the celebration of the birth of Jesus on Christmas. For the Christian Church, the season of Christmas does not begin until Christmas day and runs for 12 days until Epiphany.

"Advent is the first season in the church year, comprising the four weeks before Christmas. The word 'Advent' comes from the Latin, 'to come,' and the church has observed Advent as weeks of preparation since the fifth century with themes of watchfulness, preparation, and hope infusing this season. Together we both anticipate the celebration of God's coming in the form of the Christ child and the final coming of Christ in the time to come." (https://blogs.elca.org/worship/890/)

"The 'now-and-not-yet' nature of the fulfillment of our hope in Christ is never more rhetorically real than in the season of Advent. In its great wisdom, the lectionary launches us into this wheel of time with a season that, much like our own lives, is full of endings and beginnings—and, of course, waiting" (Sundays and Seasons, Year A).

During Advent, as the daylight shrinks by the day, Christians are called to focus on the light of the world breaking through the darkness in our world. It's a hopeful, expectant time where we focus on the promises made by God through Christ. Each week in worship we light, in succession, the candles on the Advent wreath for Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love.

I encourage you to read again slowly the passage from Luke above. Then, as you sit in the dark places of your life, make this Advent a time for prayer, devotion, meditation, and preparation for the light of the world to enter your heart and our world anew. Let the light of Christ dispel whatever darkness troubles you.

Generosity Minute

It's the thought that counts'

Jesus said, "Give, and it will be given to you." -Luke 6:38

Why is it so hard to find that all-too-elusive "perfect gift" for the loved ones in your life? For many of us, it's because they already have everything they need and most of what they want. It sometimes feels impossible to find a gift that won't be banished to that closet for unwanted, unneeded, and unused presents -- alongside the loud ties, the strong perfumes, the unread books, and the garish sweaters.

When it comes to gift-giving, it's often said, "It's the thought that counts." If that's true, why do we still put so much emphasis on the gift?

This year focus on the thoughts behind your Christmas gifts. Thoughts in keeping with the season. Thoughts of meeting real needs and giving where it will be much appreciated. With so many disadvantaged people in the world, at least some of our Christmas budget would be well spent helping our needy neighbors.

If you are buying for a loved one who has everything, consider instead giving a monetary donation in their honor to a worthy charity that helps the poor. Some charities, such as Heifer International and ELCA Good Gifts, let you buy a specific item – such as a goat or pig for a family, or a water well for a village – to help people in the developing world.

Make the gift in your loved one's name or honor, and then describe it in a card attached to a low-cost "token" gift, such as a small box of chocolates or a bottle of wine. The better part of your gift will go to someone who truly needs it, and your loved one will share the joy of loving and helping your neighbors in need.

Just remember, 'It's the thought that counts!"

Church Council Highlights Nov 20, 2024

Love, Inc. Homes of Hope is now Builders of Hope TL in partnership with Ephrata Area Social Services:

- They have a family in the house and are doing great!
- The group participated and sold 446 steak sandwiches in the fundraiser at St.John's UCC on November 9. Approx. \$2500 was raised in this effort.

Service:

- The Community meal will be held on January 9 and May 8th 2025.
- The CROP walk raised around \$1000.
- November- December, a goods gift tree is placed in the Narthex. This is in lieu of the hat and mitten tree. Directions are
 placed near the tree.
- The reverse advent calendar project will be done again this year to benefit our food bank. Details in bulletin.

Kitchen Krew:

- Food bank provided 42 families with 111 folks with food in November.
- We received and sorted food from the Scouting for Food program for our food bank. Over 900 lbs of food was donated.
- 137 folks were served at Glenn Allen Beard Disaster Response breakfast. The kitchen donated the food for the event.
- 65 folks were served breakfast after the Polka Mass Service last week.
- They stuffed baked and sold 135 pig stomachs at the annual take out event.

Welcome:

- Seventy-one Thanksgiving cards were mailed out this month.
- We will be postponing the Tree lighting event this year.
- They will be collecting items for the homeless veterans until December 1st.

Learning:

- · December 1- Hanging of the Greens.
- Christmas Program will be held December 22 with Santa and cookies afterward.
- College Students recognition will be January 5.

Worship:

- We are returning to communion down the center aisle until the end of the year.
- November 27 will be a Thanksgiving eve service at Mellinger's Church beginning at 7:00pm.
- Afternoon of music will be held December 15 at 2:00pm.

Youth Ministry:

- Thanksgiving meal for needy families- November 24.
- Hospitality bags-December 1.
- Wreaths Across America-December 14.

Other items discussed:

- Directory update: we will be taking photos after church for the next several weeks. Call the church office to schedule a time.
- We are still looking for lay members to attend the 2025 Synod Assembly. If interested, see Pastor Brubaker.
- Glenn Allen Beard's disaster trip is being planned for Asheville, NC. in early April. Let him know if you are interested in helping.
- We received a quote of 2700 from Burke Asphalt for striping the lines in the parking lot and also filling the cracks.
- We received a donation to cover \$2000 of the cost and will do a second offering on Nov. 24 to cover the remainder.
- Nominations- Alan Worley, Deb Sweigert and Jen Weitzel have agreed to a 2nd three-year term.
- Dave Sauder is stepping down with one year left on his three-year term.
- Fritz Fichtner opted not to stay on for 2nd term.
- Cody Leisey and Grady Daub have been nominated to replace the folks stepping down. They will be approved at the
 congregational meeting on December 8th.
- The spending guidelines have been approved by Council and will be presented for approval at the Congregational meeting.
- Changes in the Constitution will also be voted on at the Congregational meeting.


