### Pastoris Message

### A Tainted Thanksgiving

Timmy didn't want to put his money in the offering plate Sunday morning, so his mother decided to use some hurried creative reasoning with him. "You don't want that money, honey," she whispered in his ear. "Quick! Drop it in the plate. It's tainted!" Horrified, the little boy obeyed. After a few seconds he whispered, "But, mommy, why was the money tainted? Was it dirty? "Oh, no dear," she replied. "It's not really dirty. It just 'taint yours, and it 'taint mine," she replied. "It's God's." (from pastoralcareinc.com)

This little story is a helpful reminder about our relationship with our money and possessions in this season of Thanksgiving. Our gratitude drives our generosity, freeing us to serve God and others with our time, talent, and treasure. Julie Wesley, seminarian at Luther Seminary, shares her understanding of Luther's teaching on The Freedom of a Christian. She writes:

"Freedom From and Freedom For. Trusting that God has provided, is providing, and will always provide everything we need frees us from the anxiety of needing to provide for ourselves. Martin Luther described this in his essay, "The Freedom of a Christian." We are freed from the responsibility of fending for ourselves and freed for the opportunities to use what we have to serve God and one another. Even this freedom is an incredible gift from God!

Understanding this glorious freedom changes how we view the gifts God has bestowed upon us. All that we are and all that we have comes from God. It is not, however, for the sole purpose of our own comfort and pleasure. God has been generous to us so that we can be generous to others. In this way, what we receive from God is not gifted to us; it is entrusted to us. What we have is not ours because we worked hard to earn it and deserve it. It is ours only because God gave it to us and trusts us to use it to meet our own needs and the needs of others. We are then only stewards of our lives, our time, our talents, and our possessions." In this season of Thanksgiving, let us all be thankful for and good stewards of what has been entrusted to our care.

# **Generosity Minute**

### **Develop a Heart of Generosity**

Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances! -- 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

Would you like to be a more generous person, possessing a generous heart? Then try embracing gratitude as a spiritual practice. Since Thanksgiving is this month, November is a wonderful time to give it a try.

Gratitude and generosity go together. Whether you're a millionaire or just middle-class, when you are grateful for what you have, you'll likely be happier and more satisfied. You will see the world through eyes of abundance and be more likely to give of yourself.

How can we embrace gratitude as a spiritual practice? Paul gives us good advice.

**Give thanks in all circumstances:** Paul says give thanks IN all circumstances, not FOR all circumstances. In tough times, we can be grateful for what is going well and for the resources, relationships and faith that will help us through.

**Pray without ceasing:** Pray in the shower, in your car, on the beach, on your lunch break, at a stop light, in a grocery line. God hears all your prayers. Pray nonstop.

**Rejoice always:** Look for everyday celebrations every day. Do you have hot water? A car? Clean socks? food? Friends? Rejoice.

For a disciplined approach, keep a journal of your daily thanks, or a "gratitude list" that you can pray over and revise. Keep it up and it's a good bet that your developing "attitude of gratitude" will result in you becoming more generous and seeing the world through a lens of abundance.


### **Good Gifts Tree**



The youth (SLY) have been making Thanksgiving meals for needy families for a number of years. For the past 2 years, we have made Thanksgiving meals for immigrant families. The first was for a Ukrainian family who are neighbors of the Ranck's. Grace and Hailey used Google translate to communicate with them and explain what Thanksgiving is, since it's an American tradition. The youth had a good time making the meal.

Last year, we made the meal for the Syrian family we were sponsoring. That was quite a challenge, as I needed to change some of the dishes that we normally make due to their religious restrictions. They can only eat Halal foods which are foods that are permissible under the teachings of Islam. Haram foods are ones that are forbidden by Islamic teachings. For example, we made a turkey, but it had to be slaughtered in accordance with Islamic law and not all stores have these turkeys. When I went shopping for the ingredients for the meal, I had to read all the labels to make sure that none of the ingredients were forbidden. I also made 2 dishes that Syrian families eat, like homemade hummus. Pastor Scott suggested Tabbouleh, which you can buy at the grocery store. I added fresh parsley and mint from my herb garden to this dish.

It was definitely a learning experience for me, the youth, and the adult leaders. Jenny Weitzel was kind enough to take me with her to deliver the meal. Jenny also used Google translate to communicate with the mother who was very grateful for the food. We explained all the dishes to her, as well as our Thanksgiving tradition. She was excited to learn that 2 of the dishes were ones that they already eat. While we have taken food to other families in the past, this last year was very special to me, and I felt humbled to experience the sincere gratitude from the mother.

We need a family for this year's meal. We normally get names from Ephrata Area Social Services, but if anyone knows of a family who needs our help, please let Pastor Scott or me know. I would love to share our Thanksgiving tradition with a family from another culture, if possible.


