Our worship is rooted in the ancient pattern of the church—gathering, word, meal, sending. The shape of this liturgy and much of the actual words/prayers come directly from scripture. Though we make seasonal shifts, the constancy of our worship reflects God's constant love and promises through forgiveness, scripture, and the sacraments of baptism and communion. Following this liturgical pattern, as well as the Revised Common Lectionary, a three-year cycle of scripture readings, connects us through our worship with Christians around the world and throughout time.

All baptized Christians are welcome to receive **Holy Communion**. We believe "Holy Communion is the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ given with bread and wine, instituted by Christ himself for us to eat and drink." (Small Catechism, Martin Luther) Children who do not yet receive Holy Communion are welcome to come forward for a blessing.



WORD

God speaks to us in scripture reading, preaching, and song

Acts 1:1-11

Before he is lifted into heaven, Jesus promises that the missionary work of the disciples will spread out from Jerusalem to all the world. His words provide an outline of the book of Acts.

[Luke writes:] ¹ In the first book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus did and taught from the beginning ² until the day when he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. ³ After his suffering he presented himself alive to them by many convincing proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. ⁴ While staying with them, he ordered them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for the promise of the Father. "This," he said, "is what you have heard from me; ⁵ for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now."

⁶ So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?" ⁷ He replied, "It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. ⁸ But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." ⁹ When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. ¹⁰ While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. ¹¹ They said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."

Reading: Ephesians 1:15-23

The risen and exalted Christ reigns over the entire universe. The author of Ephesians prays that we are given the wisdom to know the power of the risen Christ and the empowering hope that the knowledge of this inheritance provides.

¹⁵ I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love toward all the saints, and for this reason ¹⁶ I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers. ¹⁷ I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, ¹⁸ so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, ¹⁹ and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe,

according to the working of his great power. ²⁰ God put this power to work in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, ²¹ far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the age to come. ²² And he has put all things under his feet and has made him the head over all things for the church, ²³ which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all.



On the day of his ascension, Jesus leaves his disciples with a commission, a blessing, and a promise of the Holy Spirit.



⁵⁰Then he led them out as far as Bethany, and, lifting up his hands, he blessed them. ⁵¹While he was blessing them, he withdrew from them and was carried up into heaven. ⁵²And they worshiped him, and returned to Jerusalem with great joy; ⁵³and they were continually in the temple blessing God.

GOSPEL MESSAGE

May 29, 2025 ASCENSION OF OUR LORD Welcoming All in the Passive Voice

"Repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in [Jesus'] name to all nations" (Luke 24:47). If Luke were working with an editor, he'd be admonished for his use of the passive voice. Matthew is all about the community: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations," complete with baptism and teaching (28:19). Mark, as ever, pulls no punches: "Go . . . proclaim," and those who don't believe will be condemned (16:15-16). John—well, John always marches to his own drum anyway. But why does Luke speak in such distant, almost disembodied terms?

Luke is citing his sources. Jesus' words in this passage originate in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the Psalms. "Thus it is written," he says (v. 46). Jesus delivers a distinctive message, grounded in scripture: the good news is about repentance and forgiveness. Jesus' death, resurrection, and ascension aren't a dividing line but, rather, a fulfillment of God's journey with creation that started long before and will continue long after Jesus' days on earth. This is a story for *all* nations.

In the book of Acts, Luke begins with Jesus' ascension and then spends twenty-eight chapters detailing the remarkable inclusivity of God's promises in Jesus. And it's here we might find the reason for Luke's awkward prose at the end of his first volume. The thing about passive voice is that it removes the individual actor and privileges the action. And really, isn't that the entire point? The disciples will spread that message. Paul, a Pharisee, will spread that message. Timothy and Lydia will spread that message. And we have the honor of spreading that message.

As Lutherans, we believe that the source of the action is always the Holy Spirit. The Spirit moves us, individually and in community, to make repentance and forgiveness known and to welcome all—in the passive voice.
