From Pastor Scott

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE LOWER SUSQUEHANNA SYNOD ASSEMBLY HELD ON JUNE 2-3

In addition to myself, Swamp's lay representatives, Connie Taylor and Guy Templin, attended the Friday evening, June 2nd Zoom Assembly session. On Saturday June 3rd, we drove to Trinity Lutheran Church in Camp Hill for the in-person portion of the assembly.

There were 349 voting members: 200+ lay and 100+ clergy (including retired). With about 227 congregations in the Synod, I was a bit disappointed in the low attendance.

The Assembly voted to add the option for congregations to increase their number of representatives to the Synod Assembly by adding, in addition to the regular one male and one female, a youth representative and/or a representative of color or a language other than English.

It was reported that, while the Synod had a \$50,000 deficit, we also had received \$234,000 in government COVID grants to more than meet budget.

Bishop Elizabeth Eaton, Presiding Bishop of the ELCA, was the keynote speaker. Bishop Eaton thanked the Lower Susquehanna Synod for its mission support of \$712,000 and for the Synod's offering of \$443,000 for world hunger and \$526,000 for Ukrainian war relief. She reported that the ELCA will discuss changing its structure to more properly represent the decrease in membership.

The National Youth Gathering being held in New Orleans July 16-20, 2024, was promoted.

In 2025, the Assembly will be four days long as we will be electing a new Bishop. Bishop Dunlop will be retiring after 12 years of service as Bishop.

Sadly, absent this year were the various organizational information display tables. And the bookstore set-up was missing too.

Overall, it was a nice time to meet and worship in-person with our brothers and sisters across the Synod. The venue worked but was a little tight. My hope is that we return to the format from previous years of a Thursday evening through Saturday Assembly that includes a day of learning along with the business meeting and worship. For that to work effectively, I believe that we need to return to a larger venue like a college or university.



GENEROSITY MINUTE

Stewardship of our leisure time

I commend enjoyment, for there is nothing better for people under the sun than to eat, and drink, and enjoy themselves, for this will go with them in their toil through the days of life that God gives them under the sun. **Ecclesiastes 8:15**

Busy-ness keeps us from living with joy and peace in today's 24/7 world, but Scripture reminds us that this is hardly new. Ecclesiastes was written some 2,500 years ago! Ecclesiastes does not give license for mindless pleasure-seeking, but rather affirms that our hard work should be balanced with time for relaxation and enjoyment with friends and family.

Saints and mystics have long touted the need for rest and renewal. In the monastic tradition it's referred to as otium sanctum – Holy Leisure. Not just wasting our free time, but using it for renewal. As steward/disciples, we aim to use our leisure time wisely. Here are some ideas:

Keep the Sabbath: God actually *commands* us to stop working one day per week, as Exodus 20:8-11 makes clear. It's one of the Top Ten! Though we are prohibited from *working* on the Sabbath, there is no prohibition against leisure. (Why else would God give us a day off?)

Plan your vacation: Even if you're taking simple STAYcation, *plan* your time for maximum rest and enjoyment. Visit local museums or historic places. Take day trips to local parks, mountains or waterways. Invite friends or family over. Select books to read, movies to stream and games to play.

Manage your schedule: Are you a slave to your appointment book, driven by other people's priorities? Put yourself first – scheduling in time for leisure. Even if it's just 30 minutes here and there, make – and take – time for yourself!

Find an activity you like: What do you do just for you? Exercise? Read? Scrapbook? Play an instrument? Walk? Fish? Discover – or REdiscover – what brings you joy, then make time to do it.

Socialize: Friends and family make life enjoyable. Spend time with them. Ideas: a hike, a picnic, a meal on your deck, drinks under the stars, a game of cards or a board game.

Invest, don't waste, time: Many activities pass the time but don't give back much in renewal or refreshment. Choose activities wisely. God expects us to work, but not work ourselves to death. Sabbath and leisure time provide means for us to find balance in our life, as well as friendship, love, renewal and purpose.
