Giving Thanks Generously

This month, we celebrate Thanksgiving for God's abundance. Scripture teaches that God owns the world and everything in it because God created it (Genesis I). It's a time for us to reflect on our many blessings, giving thanks to God for all that we have. Even though we know in faith that God's creation is abundant, many of us live with a sense of scarcity.

Lynne Twist, an expert on money and our relationship to it, writes, "Regardless of where you live, how much money you make, or how successful you are, there's a message you've been fed your whole life that is reinforced daily by the media, in television, magazine and internet advertising...And that message is that you don't have enough, you are not enough, and there is always something more that you need to get or be in order to be successful, happy, and worthy of respect and love. And the worst part is that you've heard it so many times now, you believe it's true." Scripture teaches otherwise.

Over the last two years as your pastor, I have seen the Holy Spirit active here at Swamp. The generous work of this congregation is most certainly pleasing to God. The Spirit continues to lead us forward to new things as we are invited to grow in generosity to God's work.

As Mike Ward argues in his book, *Abundance*, God provides us everything and we need to recognize that it is not only enough, but enough to share. Soon, we will be sending out information for our fall generosity appeal to fund the ministries of Swamp for 2024. As you follow the lead of the Holy Spirit in your giving decisions, understand that, as Christians, we give in response to the Gospel.
