From Pastor Kurt

The Church's liturgical year comes to an end during the month of November. Our Church calendar focuses on the life of Jesus Christ, his ministry, and the mission of the people of God. Seasons and festivals all point to the mighty acts of God which take place in historical time.

I'll start at the end. This final festival of the church year is called Christ the King which falls on the last Sunday of the liturgical calendar. As the name suggests this particular festival points to the coming of Jesus Christ at the end of all time when he will be revealed as Lord and King of all creation. We affirm the Biblical truth summarized in the Nicene and Apostles' Creeds, that Jesus "ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living

and the dead." Yet Jesus' kingship is far from the tyrannical rule of earthly kings. Jesus reigns over a kingdom of love for the poor and outcast. In the great parable of the final judgment Jesus tells in Matthew's gospel the king says, "as you did it to the least of these you did it also to me." Jesus' kingship begins even now, in his body the Church, as we reach out to those in need.

The beginning of November sees the festival known as All Saints. In the fourth and fifth century of the Christian church festivals began to be celebrated to remember all the martyrs who gave their lives in faithful witness to the Lordship of Jesus Christ. Over the centuries these various festivals settled on November 1 as the day to remember those who had died for the

faith. Over time, as martyrdom ceased, the festival became focused on all the departed faithful. Today All Saints has become the church's "Memorial Day." We give thanks to God for the grace given to us through Holy Baptism as we remember all those Christians who have died and now enjoy the final victory of Christ. Local congregations also remember those in their own community who have died since the last All Saints Sunday. The liturgical year helps us learn about Jesus Christ and focus on his life and ministry. Certain festivals remind us of our calling as the baptized people of God who are washed clean of sin in Baptism and sent out into the world to be ambassadors for Christ who is our gentle and loving King.

Church Joins Ephrata Area Social Services and Central PA Food Bank in Food Distribution



Our partnership serving the needs of the hungry began October 14 as Swamp Lutheran teams with Ephrata Area Social Services (EASS) and Central PA Food Bank distributed food to area residents who have been negatively impacted by COVID-19. A box of nutritious fresh produce as well as non-perishable items was distributed to individuals and families on Wednesday, October 14. This will be a continuing outreach on the second Wednesday of the month. The goal is to provide 20 to 25 boxes each month.

EASS, working with The Central Pennsylvania Food Bank, provides the fresh and frozen food items which will be delivered directly to the church. Swamp Lutheran will collect non-perishable items as well as provide the volunteers to assemble the boxes and distribute them to individuals for pick-up at the church.

Non-perishable canned and dry goods may be brought to the church each Sunday or to the church during regular office hours. Items especially needed are things like pasta, boxes of cereal and canned fruit and vegetables. Please note that we cannot distribute any items past their expiration date. A rotating group of volunteers are also needed to work once a month from about noon until 3:30 p.m. assembling boxes and distributing them to individuals and families. The Birth of the Messiah: What the Bible Tells Us About Jesus' Birth



Most everyone is familiar with the Christmas story in the Bible. Shepherds and Angels, No Room in the Inn, the Manger and Wise Men; these are well-known figures in the story. However, the Bible is full of rich imagery and symbolism surrounding and informing the birth story of Jesus. There's much more to the story than what we might hear on Christmas Eve.

Pastor Strause will lead a six week Zoom Bible Study on Tuesday nights examining the Biblical record of Jesus' birth. We will explore the events leading up to his birth, the birth itself, and the immediate consequences of his birth, both on his family and the world around him. Because the birth of Jesus inspired artists and musicians throughout the centuries the study will be supplemented and supported using art and music.
