## **Generosity Minute**

#### The Gift of Generosity

"As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace."

-1 Peter 4:10 (ESV)

As we enter the month of June—a time of warmth, growth, and community—it's a good season to reflect on the quiet yet powerful virtue of **generosity.** In our Lutheran tradition, we know that all we have is a gift from God: our time, talents, possessions, and even the breath in our lungs. And just as we have received freely, we are invited to give freely.

Generosity is not merely about money. It is about a spirit of abundance rooted in faith. We are called to be stewards, not owners—caretakers of God's good creation and God's blessings. Whether it's helping a neighbor, supporting a mission, sharing a meal, or praying for someone in need, these acts are all forms of generosity that reveal Christ's love in the world.




