Setting the scene.....



- Roe formation is a highly energetic process that requires a well balanced mix of essential nutrients:

- Protein
- Lipid
- Carbohydrate
- Micronutrients







- Nutritional imbalance will result in the production of inferior products
 - Low GSI
 - Poor colour, flavour and texture

Setting the scene.....



- Urchins are highly receptive of formulated feeds
- Demonstrate rapid generation of roe
- Further research required
- Tailored nutrition is essential moving forward
- But where should we be heading??

- Prioritising research towards the maximisation of applied outcomes

- Assessment of natural products
- Understanding wild profiles

- Pellet binders
- What are the trade-offs??
 - Digestibility
 - Animal health
 - Bacterial build-up....





Potential challenges and considerations



- Commercial scale-up
 - Low volume = high value
 - Industry uptake
- Matching flavour profiles
- Diet format should be developed in close consultation with system design and husbandry practices
