Nicholas De Jonghe – Born in the year 1200 in Ghent, Belgium.

Boudouin De Jonghe – Born 1234. Married Therese De Halwin. Boudouin was the High Sheriff or Governor of Burges, Belgium in 1283. He was a nobleman.

Everhard De Jonghe – Born in 1235 in Ghent, Belgium. Died 1297.

Henri De Jonghe – An alderman in Ghent, Belgium

Nicholas De Jonghe – Born 1265.

Jan De Jonghe – Born 1300.

Gerard De Jonghe – Participated in the founding of a monastery at Bergambacht near Schoonhoven, Holland in 1390.

Jan De Jonghe – Was clerk of the monastery.

Floris Gerrits De Jonghe – Was Hoogheemraad of Bergambacht in 1438.

Jacob De Jonghe – Born 1335 in Flanders. Married Bate Martyns

Jan Jacobse De Jonghe – Born 1365 in Topwyk, Flanders. Went by the surname of “De Korenkoper” because he was a dealer in grains. Lived in Utrecht, Holland.

Matthew Gysbrechtsz De Jonghe – Was Burgermeister of Nieuwpoort, Holland in 1541

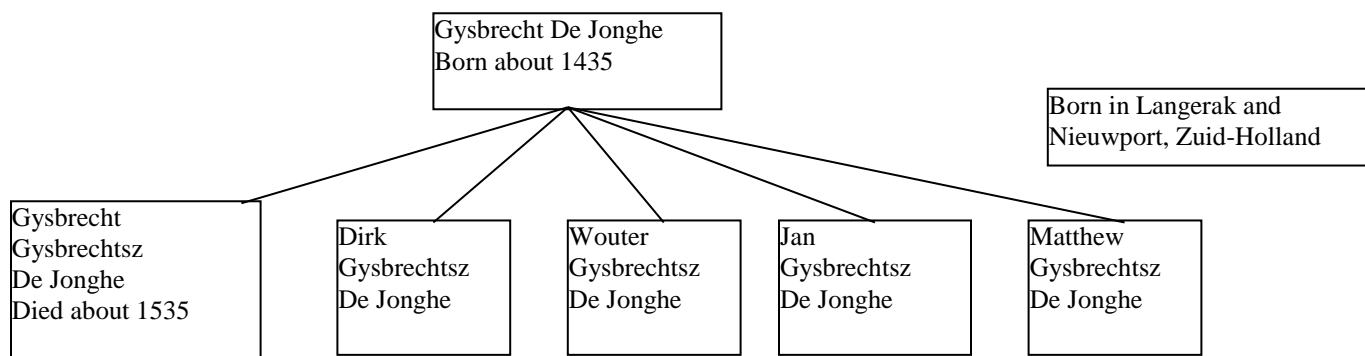

Ancestor Chart: 1500 – 1775



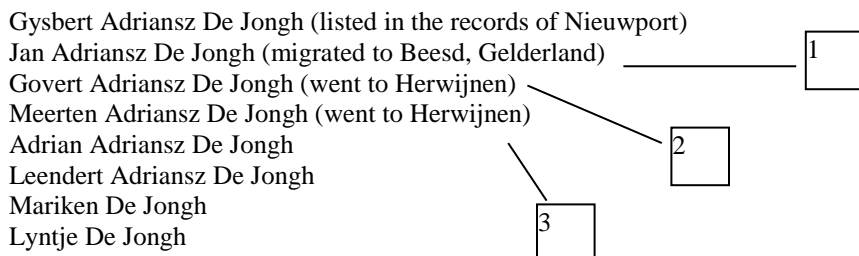
Gysbrecht was a Schout (prosecuting attorney). His wife Margriet lived to be nearly 100 years old. She owned the Villa “Margriet’s Lofstad” in Nieuwport. Her maiden name is not known.

Gysbrecht and Margriet had 10 sons and 2 daughters. They included:

- Mariken Gysbrechtsz De Jonghe (daughter)

All these had sons Gysbert who were mentioned in the records of Nieuwport from 1500 – 1550. De Jonghe’s of this stock scattered to all parts of Holland. The late Supreme Court Judge, Frederick De Young of Chicago appears to descend from Matthew.

Adrian Gysbrechtsz De Jonghe, born in Langerak or Nieuwport, Zuid-Holland in 1520, was at different times a magistrate, burgemeester, or schout from the time he was 25 years old until past 1584. He appears to have been the most outstanding man of that city, holding office continually for over 40 years. His wife’s name is unknown and she appears to have died quite young. His children, according to guardianship records appear to be:



The branch of the Pieter De Jong family which settled in Pella might have sprung from any of three men above; Jan, Meerten, or Govert. Their descendents came back into Zuid-Holland and settled at Leerdam, Kedichem, Arkel, Noordeloos, and Leksmond between 1600 – 1700.

1 — Jan Adriansz De Jonghe – had sons Adrian, Jan, Willem, Thonis, and Hendrik. Records of these men exist in Beesd, Culemborg, Kedichem, and Leksmond. Adrian and Koenraad De Jong, who settled in Pella in 1847, descend from this branch.

2 — Govert Adrianse De Jongh – had a son Adrian, who in turn had sons Arien, Jan, Cornelius, Willem, and Govert. These are found in Herwijnen and descendants settled in the area around Leerdam and Arkel.

3 — Meerten Adrianse De Jongh – born about 1550. Married a woman named Jenneke. Settled in Herwijnen around 1600. Descendants scattered widely in Gelderland and Zuid-Holland. His sons were Adrian, Cornelius, Dirk, Hendrik, and Frans. President Roosevelt descends from this branch through his maternal side. The noted line of De Jong ministers in Holland sprang from Adrian. This line descends as follows:

Cornelius Meertense De Jongh – Born about 1580. Married Heyltje Gerrits

Jan Cornelius De Jongh – Born about 1610. Married someone with the initials NW

Jan Janse De Jongh – Born about 1635. Married Arientje Louwen. They were living in Leerdam in 1664 when they willed some land in Herwijnen to a child.

Jan Janse De Jongh – Born in Leerdam about 1670. Married in Heikop, April 30, 1702 to Flora Willems Van Oirschot. They had the following children: Dirk, Willem, Jan, Cornelis, and Mariken

Dirk De Jong and Geertje Burggraaf were married on Sep 11, 1728. Geertje was the daughter of Floris Burggraaf and Grietje Van Buren. Dirk and Geertje had the following children:

Floris De Jong – christened Dec 26, 1729

Grietje De Jong – christened Feb 25, 1731

Neeltje De Jong – christened Aug 9, 1733

Floris De Jong – christened Dec 11, 1735

Dirk De Jong – christened Jan 26, 1738

Dirk De Jong and Teuntje Van Karssen were the parents of Jan De Jong. Dirk was born in 1738 in Leerdam. Teuntje was the daughter of Cornelis Van Karsten and Lijsbeth Van Casant. Dirk died on January 21, 1813 in Mererkerk. Dirk and Teuntje had the following children:

Geertje De Jong – christened March 27, 1763

Lijsje De Jong – christened August 4, 1765

Dirk De Jong – christened October 25, 1767

Neeltje De Jong – christened October 1, 1769

Jan De Jong – christened August 18, 1771

Cornelis De Jong – christened October, 17, 1773

Gerrit De Jong – christened March, 19, 1775

Geuvert De Jong – christened January 22, 1777

Jan De Jong – married as his first wife Maria Kooij, from whom sprang Pieter De Jong Sr., who came to America in 1866.
