Special Features:

Pine groves, observation deck for birdwatching over wetlands, section of Grand Trunk rail bed, scenic winter views from high elevation. Vegetation includes a variety of ferns and ground covers along with blackberry, jewel weed, stinging nettles, skunk cabbage and variety of mushrooms. Trees included red maple, American basswood, green ash, and pignut hickory. Birds observed: Indigo Buntings, Red-bellied Woodpeckers, Eastern Kingbirds, Chipping Sparrows, Pine Warblers and Baltimore Orioles.

Trail: Moderately challenging trail from parking area beginning at

the dam winding through a hardwood forest and pine grove

up to the Grand Trunk rail bed.

Rules: Enjoy hiking, nature study, photography, snowshoeing, and

cross-country skiing.
