

ADULT DAY CENTER SERVICES

The Adult Day Center is open Monday through Friday 9:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.

The Madison County Senior Citizens Center provides transportation for clients countywide. Handicapped accessible vans with trained drivers are dispatched to bring the client to the center and return them home at the end of the day.

Adult Day Center provides assistance to families and other caregivers who have the responsibility for an older adult who cannot be left alone during the day, yet does not require 24 hour nursing home care.

The program serves persons 60 and over and enables families respite while their loved one enjoys a day of activities and medical monitoring. The Adult Day Center program offers participants the opportunity to socialize, enjoy peer support, and receive health and social services in a stimulating and supportive environment.

The program is primarily for frail elderly people and those in the early stages of Alzheimer's disease or Dementia.

The Program Manager of the Adult Day Center Program will assess all clients before participating in the program and maintain a waiting list if the number of Adult Care clients exceeds the COAAA staff to client ratio regulation. Clients are approved for services on a first come, first served basis. Daily attendance is limited to 12 people.

Various funding sources are available to help pay for the client's care: Title III, Passport, National Caregiver Program, Alzheimer's Respite Program, and Self Payment. In addition, a sliding scale is used if the client does not qualify for funding based on the individual's income and the COAAA Cost Share Guidelines. Services are not denied regardless of the client's ability to pay.

MCSCC provides a separate area from the public for Adult Day Center Services to assure confidentiality as well as a safe atmosphere while activities are implemented. Since our adult day center program provides services at the enhanced level the client must be independent with self-medication and personal care. Assistance is provided as needed in these areas.

The Caregiver Support Group meets on the first Thursday of each month at 6:00 p.m. at St. John's Lutheran Church, 380 Keny Blvd., London.
