

For The "Very Denver" Tourist

Denver Botanic Gardens

These are gorgeous gardens in which to have a remarkable stroll. The gardens have worked hard on their conservation programs in protecting natural habitats and saving species and as you walk through the area you will be able to see and enjoy the ongoing results. This lovely area with it's tropical biosphere and Japanese garden complete with pool and lily pads plus lots more, makes for a perfect outing. This is the number one Denver attraction and great news! We are having the welcome dinner here and all our guests have access for the day!



Larimer Square

Enjoy a walk in one of Denver's most historic areas, Larimer Square. Its history extends back to the 19th century when Colorado was all about gold and the famous gold strikes that put this beautiful State firmly on the map. The square was once home to a lot of 'firsts'; first bank, first dry goods store, first bookstore, first theater, and also the site of the city's first post office! Some of the old buildings remain but the new ones are just as nice, and home to some great restaurants and shops selling unusual and unique gifts. It's worth taking the family to see the stores' decorations too. Located in the center of Mile High City, there are plenty of fantastic restaurants on this popular square. The surrounding square is steeped in history so you'll enjoy walking around the streets after a great meal. Be sure to visit the Walkway Gallery which showcases local artists' work.



Red Rocks Park & Amphitheater

Located just west of the Mile High City, Red Rocks Park features 738 acres of hiking trails, geological wonders and astounding views. Owned and operated by the City of Denver, the concert venue at Red Rocks Park has been home to some of the most iconic concerts in history, from artists such The Beatles, U2 and Sting. If you Arrive early there is a concert on Saturday August 20th : There is this very popular concert series happening called Reggae on The Rocks. It's back this August for two nights of music at Colorado's iconic Red Rocks Amphitheater.



Little Man

Denver's iconic ice cream spot which is housed inside a larger-than-life milk can. Little Man's popularity means that there is pretty much always a line out front. On a hot day, be prepared to wait for a half hour or more. Totally worth it, though.



For The Foodie

Kachina Cantina

Serving a modern take on Mexican fare inspired by the USA's Four Corners region and Baja Mexico, Kachina offers an energetic, but not too loud, atmosphere and an epic location right in the middle of Dairy Block. There is a large and beautifully decorated dining room, several outdoor tables, and a huge fun bar with seats both indoors and outdoors. Executive chef Cesar Tamariz's spin on Southwestern fare is sure to leave your mouth watering for me. Kachina is a great place to grab dinner after a Rockies game or before a night out in downtown Denver. Be sure to book reservations in advance, as they have been consistently busy every time I've walked past.



Lucile's

This eclectic Cajun/Creole joint, a longtime West Wash Park staple with several Front Range offspring, pays homage to N'awlins home-cooking with dishes like pain perdu, eggs Pontchartrain, and Chef Mickey's red beans with ham. Beignets all day, every day.

Piled high with powdered sugar, this New Orleans staples is a brunch star, especially accompanied by Louisiana-style chicory coffee or a Cajun Mary with all the fixins—both of which you might need while you wait for a table. Everything at this place is amazing. My New Orleans Bubby would love this place. Tastes just like N'Orleans.



LoHi Brunch

Perhaps because of all that early morning exercise, brunch is a popular meal. In the LoHi, or Lower Highlands, area alone, choices include the butchery- and seafood-centric Old Major, the fried-chicken star Low Country Kitchen and the Latin American cantina Señor Bear. An atmospheric choice, Linger occupies the former Olinger mortuary, a vast, warehouse-like space with multiple levels offering good views of downtown. Global brunch dishes include breakfast dosa (\$16) and "hangover ramen" (\$17), accompanied by bottomless mimosas (\$15).



East Side Kosher Deli

From premium house cured deli meats to 45 day dry aged beef, classic dishes to authentic international cuisine. Whether you live down the block, are visiting the Denver area, or having us ship meals to your destination enjoy the greatest selection of freshly prepared meals.



Food Tour

Denver's compact downtown area makes it easy to visit several restaurants in a short amount of time on this walking food tour of the Mile High City. Sample sweet and savory dishes at five restaurants while your guide introduces you to Denver's culinary scene and shares an insider's perspective on the bustling LoDo neighborhood. The Bindery

Showcasing globally-inspired fare in LoHi, this hip-yet-elegant space dishes up cuisine that's at once trendy and sophisticated—a combo that will surprise and delight the most discerning of palates. Any place with a dark chocolate waffle accompanied by thick belly bacon is a must-try, in our book.

Decadence aside, menu options are interesting, thoughtful, and bold, from olive-oil fried eggs with house yogurt and lemon salt to toasted quinoa porridge with poached egg, mushrooms, brussels sprouts and cocoa nibs. Happy exploring.



Voodoo Doughnut

the Portland-based company has built a cult-like following for their sweet and sometimes curious creations, offering unique flavors like their Spicy Margarita Cannolo, the Bacon Maple Bar, or the Captain Crunch-topped Oh Captain My Captain.



Snooze: An A.M. Eatery

What started as a Denver institution—we're talking two-hour waits—in Lower Downtown (LoDo), Snooze and its hearty, playful fare have earned such a following that the venue has expanded across the Front Range and to three other states. If you're any kind of sugar-in-the-morning bruncher, you'll want to skip straight to the Sweet Utopia section. Order the pancake flight to sample the pineapple upside down, blueberry danish, and sweet potato cakes all at once.



For The Self Explorer / Casual Stroller

Dairy Block

This city block near Coors Field, previously home to Windsor's Dairy, has recently been transformed into a cosmopolitan micro-district. The cornerstone establishment is the Denver Milk Market, an expansive space home to 16 scrumptious food and drink establishments. In the middle of Dairy Block you'll find one of Denver's most Insta-worthy alley, where wine bars, boutique shops, and art galleries blend together to create an atmosphere with a decidedly European feel.



River North Art District (“RiNo”)

For better or worse, Denver has changed dramatically over the past decade. And nowhere is the city's evolution more on display than the River North Art District, known locally as “RiNo.” Today this former industrial hub's warehouses and factories have been converted to a hip arts district sporting funky breweries, trendy restaurants, pumping bars, boutique shops, and colorful street art adorning nearly available patch of brick or concrete. RiNo makes for a great self-guided walking tour, especially along the stretch of Larimer between 25th and 32nd streets. Be sure not to miss the vibrant alley behind the Denver Central Market.



Tattered Cover Independent Bookstore

An iconic independent Denver bookseller, Tattered Cover was saved from closing during the pandemic when it was purchased by a new investment group. The new owners recently moved the historic LoDo (lower downtown) store into prime real estate in the newly opened McGregor Square, offering the perfect place to pop in for a bit of peace and quiet during a Rockies game. You can also check out Tattered Cover's other locations around town, including a store located in the historic Bonfils-Lowenstein Theater at 2526 E. Colfax and a smaller outpost within Denver's Union Station.



For The Art Lover

The Denver Art Museum

The Denver Art Museum houses 70,000 artworks across 10 permanent collections. As one of the largest art museums between Chicago and the West Coast, you'll find anything from Asian, African, European, and Modern artworks, but the museum is best known for its collections of Native American and Western Art. another reason to visit (one that's immediately clear from the outside) is for the museum's iconic architecture—the collections are housed within a series of design-driven buildings. The triangular steel frame of the Hamilton Building, designed to emulate the Rockies, was created by world-renowned architect Daniel Libeskind. Another building, formerly called the North Building, was designed by famed Italian architect Gio Ponti in 1971 and had just completed a nearly four-year renovation.



Denver Museum of Contemporary Art

Situated just south of Union Station, the Denver Museum of Contemporary Art is an underrated Denver museum offering thought-provoking, sometimes shocking, displays. Don't miss the excellent rooftop cafe and bar, which somehow seems to never be crowded despite the pleasant views of downtown. At this Lower Downtown gem, you'll find five galleries of rotating experimental art and ideas. Part of The Museum of Contemporary Art Denver's wow factor is the building design itself which blurs the boundaries between the interior and exterior for a unique sensory experience.



Kirkland

Featuring more than 30,000 works of art across its three principal exhibits, Kirkland Museum of Fine & Decorative Art gets its name from storied 20th century Colorado painter Vance Kirkland, whose work forms one of the three main exhibits at the museum. The Kirkland is a mesmerizing shrine to the decorative arts of the late 19th and 20th centuries. Peep iconic modernist furnishings (see: Irving Harper's marshmallow sofa and Pierre Paulin's ribbon chair) and exquisite Art Nouveau and Art Deco housewares. Located in the studio of its late namesake, Vance Kirkland, the collection is displayed salon-style—which means that you're surrounded on all sides by irreplaceable objet d'art as you wander through the galleries.



Clyfford Still Museum

Clyfford Still is widely considered one of the most influential artists in American history and, upon his death in 1980, his will stipulated that his body of work be forever housed in only a single location in a city willing to build a dedicated museum. Denver stepped up to the plate in 2004. Today it's one of the most popular museums in Denver, and the only place to find 95% of the work of the trailblazing abstract impressionist. You won't need much more than an hour to take in the tranquil surroundings as well as the large-scale canvases that defined Still's contribution to modern art.



Museo de las Americas

Museo de las Americas is the Rocky Mountain region's biggest exhibitor of Latin American arts, and the institution anchors Denver's buzzing Art District on Santa Fe. The blend of ancient and modern works within the museum creates a sense of relevance that highlights the enduring legacy of Latin American culture in Colorado and beyond. Case in point: "El Finito" is a collaborative exhibition featuring 35 years of Lockheed Martin satellite images, tied to ancient Aztec prophecies and their interpretations of the universe.



For The Art & Beer Enthusiast

RiNo Beer and Graffiti Walking Tour

Take a break from the crowds of downtown and explore one of Denver's fastest-growing neighborhoods on an art and beer tour through the River North Art District (RiNo). See colorful street murals and graffiti hidden among re-purposed warehouses, and stop along the way at hand-picked breweries and cider houses for a taste of Mile-High flavor.

Meow Wolf

Meow Wolf is an arts and entertainment company based in Santa Fe, New Mexico. We create immersive and interactive experiences that transport audiences of all ages into fantastic realms of story and exploration. Denver's Meow Wolf - Convergence Station largest installation to date, it spans 90,000 square feet and resides in a mammoth triangle-shaped building at the confluence of I-25 and Colfax Avenue. The Denver outpost features the work of 100 local artists who incorporate photography, video, architecture, sculpture, painting, music, virtual reality, costuming, and performance into the works. Beyond features entry to the International Church of Cannabis' Guided Meditation, Audio Visual Art Installation, and Musical Laser Light Experience. All Beyond hours are non-consumption, family-friendly times. Enjoy incredible rotating art installations by world famous artists.



Beyond is already named Yelp's No.1 thing to do in Denver, *Beyond* will have you chilling and thinking in the world-renowned art landmark chapel painted by Okuda san Miguel. Immerse yourself in a world of illumination during a 1-hour light show in Denver. Get swept away through a combination of lasers, guided meditation, and accompanying music. Click [Here](#) for more

Denver Performing Arts Complex

Believe it or not, downtown Denver contains one of the largest multi-venue performance centers in the world. Ballets, symphonies, operas and touring Broadway shows are all staged here, but so are locally produced plays and the occasional rock concert.

During the warmer months, all kinds of celebrations take place in the adjoining outdoor space Sculpture Park.



For The Architect Rejoicer

Union Station

What is it? Subsequent to a historic redevelopment, LoDo's turn-of-the-century terminal is once again a destination for architecture buffs, scenesters and foodies, in addition to rail riders. Why go? Absorb the Beaux Arts aura of the majestic, barrel-vaulted Great Hall while sipping local craft beers in the retro-toned Terminal Bar or cocktails on the mezzanine of the glamorous Cooper Lounge. Score a seat at Stoic & Genuine's chef's counter to indulge in sharp twists on seafood classics or treat yourself to a feast at Mercantile Dining & Provision, where farmhouse substance meets cosmopolitan style.



For The History Addict

American Museum of Western Art

For all those interested in the area, a visit to this gallery which focuses on depicting life in the west from the early 1800s through the present day will not disappoint! The museum's mission is to promote the appreciation and understanding through its art exhibits by displaying the history, character and beauty of this amazing location, the American West! The collection of paintings spans nearly two centuries of Western art, from the 19th century to the present day. Over 300 paintings are displayed salon-style (a floor-to-ceiling viewing experience) and the collection ranges from movements like Expeditionary Art and the Hudson River School (artists like Bierstadt and Moran) to paintings from legends like O'Keeffe and Frankenthaler. Self-guided tours are available almost daily, as are docent-guided tours.



History Colorado Center

A hub for all the things you never knew you needed to know about the Centennial State (that's Colorado, for the record), the History Center Colorado debuted in 2012 in the Golden Triangle Creative District. Spanning four floors, more than 15 exhibits are designed to engage multi-generational visitors. Colorado's history is constantly changing, and the museum chronicles life here from the time the Spanish territory had fluctuating borders to the formation of Denver.



Wings Over the Rockies Air & Space Museum

What an interesting museum for all aircraft fans and their families. This fascinating venue, situated in a circa 1930's former Air Force hangar, houses 150,000 sq ft of a truly awesome collection of more than four dozen aircraft and space vehicles, including such rarities as a B-18A Bolo, an RF-84K Thunderflash Parasite, an Alexander Eaglerock built in Colorado and a Star Wars X-Wing fighter! Nicest of all, kids are more than welcome to try out the various apparatus which in the end can turn out to be very educational. The museum guides are extremely knowledgeable, and there is a great gift shop to visit at the end.



Forney Transportation Museum

This museum is a real car lover's dream. The Forney Museum is simply one of a kind, with a collection of more than 600 artifacts that relate to historical transportation. Built 60 years ago with a single 1921 Kissel it expanded rapidly and now includes not only vehicles, but also motorcycles, aircraft, carriages, steam locomotives, rail equipment, public transportation, fire apparatus, bicycles, toys & diecast models, vintage apparel and much more – phew. The collection includes Amelia Earhart's 1923 Kissel 'Gold Bug', Forney Locomotive, Colorado & Southern Caboose, 1923 Hispano-Suiza, 1913-53 Indian Motorcycle Collection, 500 Piece Matchbox Collection, Stutz Fire Engine and lots lots more. There's even an old Model T you can sit in! The volunteer staffers are helpful and informative. Be prepared to spend a good few hours here.



Denver Museum of Nature & Science

This fascinating museum, a super venue for all the family, comes with an even more fascinating story. Beginning its life in 1868, the naturalist and pioneer Edwin Carter, who had devoted his life to his true love – birds and mammals of the Rocky Mountains – had decided to assemble what turned out to be one of the most inclusive collections of Colorado fauna, and started displaying his treasures from his log cabin home, dubbed the Carter Museum. This later expanded into the Denver Museum of Nature and Science. There are lots of interesting exhibits to see, including the striking wildlife exhibit halls and a hands on space exhibit. The museum also has many travelling exhibits, including the Robot Exhibit, where kids actually get to build their own robot using robotic cubes, each of which serving a different function. Adults aren't just babysitters at this kid-friendly museum jam-packed with dinosaur skeletons, mummies and IMAX 3D flicks.




Molly Brown House

The Unsinkable Margaret Tobin Brown survived the *Titanic*, and her gorgeous Capitol Hill mansion survived thanks to a 1970s preservation effort that turned it into a fascinating house museum. Margaret "Molly" Brown was also an activist and philanthropist who navigated tumultuous turn-of-the-century industrialization and social change with uncommon tenacity and passion. You'll soon understand why the Molly Brown House is definitely one of the most unique things to do in Denver!




Denver Mint

The third of four national mints, which offers a surprisingly entralling guided tour. Non-numismatists might be caught off guard by how interesting the artifacts and modern-day mechanics of coin manufacturing really are. It's enough to give you a new appreciation for the humble penny—and if not, the grandeur of the Gothic Renaissance building itself deserves a gander. (And pick up some souvenirs too, obvs).



Denver Public Library

consisting of over 2 million items which include books, movies, DVD's, reference materials and even photographs. It's a real treat for those in the family interested in Western history and genealogy too, as there are so many informative avenues to explore. And let's not forget the little ones; with many children's story time activities and an excellent and well designed kiddies area, everyone will be happy.



For The Kids

Children's Museum of Denver

A Denver institution for families, the Children's Museum of Denver at Marsico Campus underwent a \$16.1 million expansion in 2015 to create a nine-acre campus—all in all, the expansions doubled its exhibition space. Cheesman Park

Parks should be on every list of what to do in Denver, Colorado. Denver has a truly impressive public park system. Located next door to the Denver Botanic Gardens, Cheesman offers expansive views of the Rocky Mountains from the neo-classical pavilion located on its eastern edge. You'll find miles of running trails and loads of space to spread out a picnic blanket and relax with friends.



Washington Park

Another one of Denver's top parks, located in the neighborhood that bears its name, Washington Park is bustling on most days with runners, bicyclists, and picnickers. But the best thing to do here is to get your serve on at Washington Park's volleyball nets. All summer long you'll find organized and impromptu games throughout the park. Plan ahead by reserving a net or bringing your own, or just plan to make some new friends.



City Park

The biggest park in Denver, City Park is home to the Denver Zoo, the Denver Museum of Nature & Science, and several lakes where you can find swan-like paddle boats for rent. In warmer months it also hosts City Park Jazz. Hear local bands and gnash on fare from lines of food trucks.



Confluence & Commons Parks

These parks sit right where Cherry Creek spills into the South Platte River. Here you'll find several bridges over the rushing water, expansive green space, and spectacular views. A personal favorite thing to do in Denver is to take a picnic blanket to the top of the hill and watch sunset over the Rocky Mountains. For additional things to do, check out the Denver Skate Park on the north end, or the giant REI outdoor equipment store on the south end.



For The Animal Lover

Rocky Mountain Arsenal

Watch bison, and other wildlife, roam at the Rocky Mountain Arsenal Wildlife Refuge.

Situated between downtown and DIA, this former chemicals weapons manufacturing center has made a stunning recovery and is now one of the country's largest urban wildlife refuges. The arsenal offers more than 20 miles of trails with some of the best hiking near Denver, plus fishing during the summer. The best thing to do here, however, is to take your car through the excellent 11 mile Wildlife Drive, a route which will give you the opportunity to spot bison, deer, hawks, waterfowl, and all sorts of other wildlife from the comfort of your car.



For The Nature Lover

Mount Evans

Are you and your family in the need of some significant fresh air? You won't get air more significant than the air you'll breathe at the top of Mount Evans. With an elevation of 14,271 ft and Colorado's 12th highest peak, the amazing views and fresh air will certainly knock any remaining cobwebs off you.

The peak dominates the western skyline of the Great Plains along with Pikes Peak, Longs Peak, and nearby Mount Bierstadt. There are a few options available when planning your drive; and though Pikes Peak is a good though rather concentrated drive, the Mt Evans route is easier with less traffic to contend with. The road has some strange bumps in it as you pass through the different climate zones, but is paved all the way up. If you'd rather hike, it takes about 3-4 hours from the lake up to the peak. And if you're visiting during the spring you'll see the amazing array of flowers, with any remaining snow at the top, where the observatory is. You'll probably also see some mountain goats.



Mount Evans Scenic Byway

Up for a mountain day trip from Denver but don't feel like hiking? Just 60 miles from the Mile High City, you can drive the highest paved road in North America to the top of one of Colorado's 54 famous "fourteeners" (Rocky Mountains over 14,000 feet in elevation). The 28-mile-long Mount Evans Scenic Byway winds its way up the 7,000 foot climb to the top of Mount Evans, where you'll be treated to breathtaking views of the Rocky Mountain Front Range.



For The Hiker


Hiking near Denver

The Cruise Room

Get dressed up and grab a drink at Denver's original Prohibition-era speakeasy. Located inside The Oxford historic hotel, the art deco windowless interior of The Cruise Room was inspired by the Queen Mary. Stepping inside will transport you back in time to the 1920s, when this bar illegally served up gimlets and martinis to Denver's elite.



Nocturne Jazz Club

There's a warm, slightly retro vibe to Nocturne jazz club where an intriguing artist-in-residence arrangement books musicians for multi-week runs, encouraging them to explore the music of a jazz legend, concentrate on a genre or produce their own original compositions. Brick walls and high ceilings with exposed ductwork don't interfere with the sound quality coming from the raised stage that is the focal point of the music venue, which also acts as a supper club serving a full menu.



Stranahan's Colorado Whiskey Tour

It's hard to believe that Colorado only opened its first distillery in 2004, but Stranahan's has done its best to make up for the lost time by leading the charge in the state's recent distillation-boom. These days, taking a tour of Stranahan's Denver facility is a must-do activity when visiting Denver.

The only problem with the hour-long informative tour of the distillery is that it ends with a whiskey tasting of samples so generous that is likely to lead you to forget everything you just learned. But, hey, it's all in the name of fun right?



LoDo

The lower downtown area of Denver, lovingly nicknamed LoDo, is the best place to head to for a nice nighttime drink. As the oldest neighborhood in Denver, this spot has been repopulated with delicious restaurants, boutique shops and trendy bars. Again, you're spoilt for choice. Head to Wynkoop Brewing Company to enjoy a drink in the oldest Brewery in the city. Or, if you're looking for optimum beer options then the Falling Rock Tap House with its 75+ taps of craft beer might be your ideal match.



My Brother's Bar

An old-school watering hole. Claimed to be the oldest watering hole in Denver, they also offer some of the best burgers. With plenty of Old West charm, you'll fall in love with this bar. Be sure to try the long-pour Barmen Pilsner which takes about seven minutes to pour the perfect drink. It might seem like a long time, but believe us when we say that it is worth the wait.



Craft Beer Crawl

The home of the sprawling Great American Beer Festival each fall, Denver has long been a champion of the microbrewing revolution. While the Denver Beer Trail has over 100 entries on its map, several are clustered in RiNo making a progressive tour a pedestrian affair. At Our Mutual Friend, a friendly taproom, state flags on the menu indicate Colorado-grown barley and hops, including Colorado Pale Ale and Dad's Brown Ale (pints \$6). Down the street, the industrial Ratio Beerworks, which sometimes serves a refreshing Handwritten wit (\$6), rolls up garage-style doors on its popular patio.

Nearby, the beloved Ft. Collins brewery Odell Brewing Co., opened a cozy two-story taproom in view of a mural depicting hops covering the side of its historic brick building. Roam the linked RiNo, Ballpark and Five Points neighborhoods and you'll run the full gamut of craft tipples, from suds to spirits. Boozin' brilliant. Buzzing little breweries like Mockery and Ratio encircle granddaddy Great Divide—but as you hop from one to the next, sampling chocolate rye scotch ale and passionfruit-guave gose, you'll also (quite possibly literally) stumble on Stem Ciders, Infinite Monkey Theorem Urban Winery and Mile High Spirits.

With over 150 breweries, many located right downtown, Denver is nirvana for craft brew aficionados. The city even plays host to the annual Great American Beer Festival, which is a must if you are visiting Denver when the fall event returns. No matter the time of your visit, you can organize your own beer crawl by stringing together a few local favorites near Coors Field. Starting at Wynkoop Brewery (whose founder John Hickenlooper went on to become Mayor and later Governor), then working your way north to Jagged Mountain and Great Divide, before ending at Our Mutual Friend.

Both locations (in Colfax and LoDo) have an incredible selection of old school games, including skeeball, pinball, and giant Jenga.

Try to Escape the Puzzle Room At Escapology

Escapology is Denver's only escape room that also has a gourmet restaurant, complete with a full bar. Stop in to complete an escape room or two, or book their meeting space for a fully catered event. You'll be hooked once you get started.

For The Music Aficionado

Red Rocks Ampitheater

One of the best concert venues on the planet. Carved into red rock mountains. You will be amazed.



Bluebird Theater

The Bluebird Theatre has been a Colfax mainstay since its opening in 1913, when it initially served as a movie house. In the 1990s it was remodeled into a music venue, and today the Bluebird Theatre is one of the best places in Denver to catch an indie music act. Spending a night enjoy the live music scene there is definitely among the more cool things to do in Denver.



Colfax Avenue (Before or After Bluebird)

Playboy magazine once famously dubbed Colfax the “longest, wickedest street in America.” Or maybe it didn’t. Either way, there’s no denying that the 50-mile long street hold a special kind of charm. In the stretch around Capitol Hill you’ll find dive bars, LGBT bars like X Bar, cheap eats, and historic theatres like The Fillmore, The Ogden, and The Bluebird. Strolling Colfax Avenue is still one of my favorite local activities, though do be aware that after dark parts of it can feel less secure at times. If you’re into live music or nightlife, though, it’s a great place to check out in Denver this weekend.

For The Shopper

Neighborhood Shopping

Denver has some nice neighborhoods for boutique shopping, including Highlands and Berkeley, but the opening of the Source Hotel and Market Hall in RiNo next to the Source food hall has given shoppers a place to do some concentrated browsing of wares from local artisans. The hotel's second story serves as a retail market hall, home to shops and kiosks from Winter Session, a Denver-based leather goods maker; Vinyl Me, Please, a local record dealer; and the sunglasses and ski goggles brand Native Eyewear, based in nearby Longmont. You'll find them alongside carefully curated out-of-towners, including the street-art-focused Station 16 Gallery from Montreal and the design goods shop Poketo from Los Angeles.



SoBo

The Platt Park stretch of South Broadway has long been known as Antique Row for its wealth of dealers in everything from folk art to furniture. You can either shop for vintage wares, weed or both: These days, SoBo is also called the Green Mile, reflecting the influx of marijuana dispensaries. The quirky shopping experience only gets funkier as you head north into the Baker District, where boutiques like Decade, a source for up-and-coming designer labels, skew as hip as the nearby eateries.



For The Sporty One

Coors Field

Baseball fans will certainly enjoy a visit to the 76 acre Coors Field. This family friendly ball park has been a league leader in attendance with those in the know sitting in the first-base and right-field areas because they know they're going to be treated to a spectacular view of the Rocky Mountains, plus there are plenty of tasty amenities to keep the kids happy all day! There are also tours of the grounds available both on and off season, offering a fascinating behind the scenes look at the ballpark. The tours last about an hour and a half, covering a distance of one mile, and are accessible for visitors with disabilities.



Sports Authority Field at Mile High

The Mile High Stadium has always been popular and are well known, being host to the Broncos – and even more so now that they have reached Super Bowl winning status again. In fact, not only did the Broncos win consecutive Super Bowls in 1997 and 1998, but they established all-time pro football records for most wins in two seasons (33), most playoff wins in two seasons (seven), and most wins ever in three seasons (46, from 1996-98), and all of this accomplished while playing at the Mile High Stadium. Attending a Broncos game, enjoying the huge replay screens which certainly take you close to the action, is a great experience for all the family.



B's Ballpark Museum

For all the baseball fans of the family, a visit to this museum will definitely be something to remember. The Ballpark Museum's collection is actually recognized by Smithsonian Books as being one of the top 21 finest private baseball collections in the world. It all started when its owner, Bruce Hellerstein, decided to display his amazing collection of ballpark memorabilia from the basement of his house and the rest, as they say, is history. His meticulously acquired artifacts, bricks, postcards, jerseys, books and pictures just grew and grew, and now welcomes visitors who have come to see his amazing collectables which include anything and everything from the "NY" drainage cover that Mickey Mantle tripped over in the 1951 World Series that permanently injured his leg, to an Old Yankee Stadium turnstile, that has etched on its side "Property of the New York Yankees". The helpful staffers will be happy to give one of their insightful tours.


